Maximum of 3 classes per dog for grades 1,2,3 Maximum of 2 classes per dog for grades 4,5,6,7

(More than maximum allowed will be reduced at the secretary's discretion)

A pay on the day class may be run if time permits

Rosettes to at least 10% of entries in all classes

Trophies to 3^{rd} place in all classes with more than 40 entrants, to 2^{nd} place with 21 - 40 entrants, and to 1^{st} place with 20 or fewer entrants. Best Junior (under 15yrs) rosette in classes 1 - 5 inclusive

Clear round rosettes in all classes to be collected on the day only

Veteran: For dogs, 9 years and over (as of closing date), no longer able to compete at 65cms, but quite capable at 45cms.

A dog entered in this class may also enter class 16 but no other class. This class will be judged on an optimum time.

Any Size: This class is intended for all sizes of dog that are not entered in any other class, except for veteran at this show.

There will be no weaves, tyre or contact equipment. This class will be judged on an optimum time.

The height limit for dogs: Large – for dogs measuring over 43 cm at the withers

Medium – for dogs measuring over 35 cm and 43 cm or under at the withers

Small – for dogs measuring 35 cm or under at the withers

Combined classes will have one overall set of results.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade) In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

GRADE 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs, which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, two first places must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes.

In accordance with Kennel Club Rules, large dogs who have not competed before 1st January 2006 and ALL small and medium dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a Kennel Club licensed agility show.

DOG SAFETY IN HOT CARS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

SHOW REGULATIONS

- Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
- 2. Entry fees £2.50 per class (Cippenham DTC Members £1.50 per class)
- 3. Jump Heights Classes 1-14 inclusive 65cms; Classes 15 and 17-21 inclusive 45cms; and classes 16 and 22-26 inclusive 35cms.
- 4. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any classes (05/05/10). For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entries for that show have been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show (16/05/10). The dog will then be moved into the appropriate classes for the next grade. Where possible the dog will be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. (Any Grade changes should be emailed to agilityaid@o2.co.uk)
- 5. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- Puppies under 18 months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
- 7. 'Not for Competition' entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
- 8. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Test is forbidden.
- 9. No bitch in season is allowed to compete
- No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- 11. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A close fitting leather, or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an, integral part of the collar, i.e. not attached by a ring
- Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- 13. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
- 14. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
- 15. Kennel Club standard marking will apply. Any variation in the form of marking must be clearly defined to all competitors prior to competition.
- 16. A judge at an Agility Test may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog, at the Test at which they are judging.
- 17. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is:
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- 18. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
- 19. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
- 20. Should circumstances so dictate, the Club, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary.
- 21. All dogs will be entered at this Show at their owner's risk and whilst every care will be taken, the Committee will not accept responsibility for the loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, people or property whilst at this Show.
- 22. No dog will be allowed in the ring at any time other than when being judged, no practising will be allowed in the ring.
- 23. In the event that the Show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope, submitted within one month of the show date
- 24 Remedial action will be taken in the event of dogs left in cars being found in a distressed condition.
- No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
