

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE

From the M25

Take Junction 4 (Signposted Bromley A21 / Orpington A224)
At the first main roundabout take the 3rd exit signposted Bromley A21 / Croydon A232
Follow the A21 over the 2nd and 3rd roundabouts.
The Rose and Crown pub will be on your left.
At the 4th roundabout take the exit signposted Croydon A232 / A21 Bromley.
Just after this exit you will pass a Shell Garage on your left.
Go straight across the 5th roundabout and past the Esso Garage and Little Chef
on your left, Straight across the next set of traffic lights and continue on past the
Farnborough Hospital on your right.
At the next Traffic Lights the Chapter One Restaurant will be on your left
Turn Left onto the A232 towards Croydon and Hayes.
On the A232 go straight across the next set of traffic lights past the Esso Garage
on your left. After a quarter of a mile turn right into Five Elms Road,
which has a sign for a lorry weight restriction.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS (cont)

15. A list of the Sponsors is detailed within schedule.
16. It is the responsibility of the competitor to be available for their class and running order, and will be received until the management close the class.
17. Standing Kennel Club marking will apply.
18. The height of the jump obstacles will be 2' 6".
19. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from test if it is:-
 - a) A bitch which is in season.
 - b) Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
20. All incorrect Entries will be returned.
21. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
22. In the event of abandonment of the Show through circumstances beyond our control the Committee may defray such expenses from entry fees to cover the cost of the Show preparation.
23. No animal other than the one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the show area.
24. Competitors must run within 10 before or after their running orders in Gamblers, unless with the permission of the Judge. This Class will take priority over all other classes.
25. Training will not be permitted in the ring before, during or after the show.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
2. **Entry Fees: £2.20** Non members, £1.00 members per dog per class. Pounds sterling only
3. The Committee reserves the right to refuse entries.
4. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
5. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Details of such dogs so entered must be recorded on the rear of the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
6. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
7. No bitch in season will be allowed to compete.
8. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog.
9. Should a Judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the committee reserve the right to appoint another Judge.
10. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
11. A Judge at a Kennel Club Licensed Agility Test cannot compete or enter a dog in that event.
12. Dogs must not compete whilst wearing any type of collar or lead.
13. All dogs entered are at their own risk, and whilst every care will be taken, the Committee will not accept any responsibility for the loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, people or property whilst at this Show.
14. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 7 days before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

STARTERS	For owners, handlers or dogs which have not won an Agility and /or Jumping class at a licensed Open Agility Test (Elementary excepted)
NOVICE	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Senior or Advanced classes
INTERMEDIATE	Open to all except dogs eligible for Elementary and Starters classes at a licensed Agility Test.
GAMBLERS	Senior (see below). Competitors must run within 10 before or 10 after their running orders, unless with the permission of the Judge. This class will take priority over all other classes
SENIOR	Open to dogs having won at least two first places, one of which must be an Agility class, at a licensed Agility Test. (Elementary and Starters excepted)
ADVANCED	Open to dogs having a minimum of 4 wins at a licensed Agility Test, 2 of which must be gained in Intermediate, Senior or Open Agility (not jumping) Classes (Elementary, Starter and Novice wins excepted).

All events must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club rules H & H(1) in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering any competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by regulations.

All heats must take place at Kennel Club licensed shows

All Kennel Club supported competitions should be judged using standard marking.

If the entry for a heat exceeds the Kennel Club limit for a judge in a day, then the class will be equally split and another judge appointed for the second part. Qualifiers and reserves from that heat will be taken in equal proportion from each part, giving the total number originally required from that heat. Rosettes and awards remain unchanged if the heat is split.

Dogs entered in any heats must be eligible for the competition entered and judges retain the right to check the height of any dog or ask to see the height stated in the Kennel Club record book

Competitors can qualify for Mini, Midi or Standard final but it must be with different dogs. The first final a handler qualifies a dog for will be the final that particular dog competes in at Olympia

[The Kennel Club Olympia Agility Stakes Supported by Pedigree](#)

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the semi-finals. Handlers may only qualify one dog for the final which will be the first dog qualified at the semi-final. Once a dog has qualified for the Final/Semi final further heats may be entered for competition.

The first ten dogs from each heat will go forward to the semi-finals at the Town and Country Festival at Stoneleigh and at the Royal Show, Stoneleigh. The semi-finalists from two of these heats will be put together to make a twenty competitor semi-final each day. The first five from each semi-final will go through to the final at Olympia. This competition will be classified as Senior Agility and judged under Kennel Club regulations for standard classes



[CELEBRATION ADVANCED POWER AND SPEED](#)

This class is only open for dogs eligible for advanced competition.

Handlers may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the final. Once a dog has qualified for the final further heats may be entered for competition.

The first 4 places from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this fact.

The first section of the course will contain all the contact equipment plus the weaving poles, two rising spread jumps at maximum width and height, and the long jump at maximum length.

This first section need not be timed, but this is at the judge's discretion. It is recommended that a generous maximum time be applied. The second section of the course will consist only of single pole hurdles, and will be against the clock. The object of the class is for the dog to negotiate the first part of the course clear, before proceeding across the start line to commence the second section of the course, which should be set as a fast speed jumping course.

[NOTE](#)

Only dogs that are clear on the first section can attempt the second section. Normal judging rules apply except that on the first section, handlers may line up their dogs before taking any obstacle without penalty. The winner will be decided in the usual way of the fastest time with the least faults.

It is advisable for judges to note that the original intention was for the jumping part of the course to be fast and free flowing to produce an exciting finish

[CELEBRATION GAMBLERS STAKES](#)

This event can be classified as Open or Intermediate or **Senior** at the Show secretary's discretion according to the anticipated entry.

The first 3 places from each heat will be invited to compete in the final. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a Heat, but may only qualify one dog for the final. The first dog that a handler qualifies with will run in the final. Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition providing they are eligible.

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this fact
