## ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

In accordance with KC Rules, large dogs that have not competed before 1st January 2006 & ALL Small & Medium dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a KC licensed agility show.

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression. Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. A dog is only eligible for one grade. Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are no contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

## HEIGHT CLASSIFICATION OF DOGS

Small Dogs: for dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers

Medium Dogs: for dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers

Large Dogs: for dogs measuring over 430mm at the withers.

## DEFINITION OF CLASSES

**GRADE 1 (Elementary):** For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

**GRADE 2 (Starters):** For owners, handlers or dogs which have qualified out of Grade 1 but have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

**GRADE 3 (Graduate):** Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grades 4, 5, 6 or 7.

**GRADE 4 (Novice):** Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 5, 6 or 7.

**GRADE 5 (Intermediate):** Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.

**GRADE 6 (Senior):** Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5 or 7.

**GRADE 7 (Advanced):** Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

**OPEN:** Open to all.

**A.B.C (SPECIAL CLASS):** Open to all large dogs excluding border collies, working sheepdogs and their crosses. In the event of dispute, the judge's decision will be final.

**SPEED JUMPING (SPECIAL CLASS):** Open to all. Class to include jumps only.

**ANYSIZE JUMPING (SPECIAL CLASS):** **Open to all dogs (irrespective of size) who are not entered in any other class at this show on either day. Jump height will be 350mm. There will be no Long Jump, Weaves or Tyre.**



## The Kennel Club Olympia ABC Agility Stakes\* - 2007/8 RULES

\*ABC Agility Rules are copyright of Newton Heath DTC.

- 1 The Kennel Club Olympia ABC Agility Stakes is a *special* agility competition to be run under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations H for Large dogs.
- 2 The competition is open to all grades of dogs (1 – 7) excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses. (Any Breeds but Collies). In the event of dispute, the judge's decision will be final.
- 3 The first **four** dogs of each heat will qualify for the semi-final. The next best placed dogs at a heat will be deemed to be reserves should a qualified dog be unable to attend the semi-final. Reserves from heats will be invited to attend the semi-final up to and including the closing date of the NHDTC Show June Show. After the closing date NO reserves will be called even if other qualifiers have to retire / withdraw.
- 4 Dogs that have already qualified for the semi-final may enter further heats for competition.
- 5 Those dogs eligible to compete in the semi-final shall be the **four best-placed dogs in each heat that have not previously qualified.**
- 6 A handler may qualify more than one dog for the semi-final but may only compete with one dog at the final.
- 7 The semi-final will be held at the annual Newton Heath DTC agility show held in June. The final to be held at Olympia in December. Any alteration will be publicised.
- 8 Owners, handlers and dogs who enter the heats or attend the semi-final will be deemed to have accepted the Rules and Regulations of the competition and the organising show.
- 9 The organisers, Newton Heath DTC and the Kennel Club, in agreement, reserve the right to alter these Rules and Regulations at their discretion.

## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered with the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification & Registration B. The registration number / Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees are as detailed on the Entry Form.
3. Prizes – no monetary prizes are on offer. Awards for each class are listed in the awards section of the schedule.
4. The Dartford DTC Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges. The judge's decision will be final; no competitor will be allowed to influence that in any way, and the show committee will stand by the judge's decision in all cases.
13. Sponsorship - Sponsors for the show are listed on the schedule.
14. Kennel Club standard marking Regulations will apply as published in the Kennel Club Yearbook in use at the time of the show, including any amendments introduced by the Kennel Club.
15. Height of jump obstacles will be as follows: Large dogs 65cm, Medium dogs 45cm, Small dogs 35cm.
16. The height limits for dogs are:
  - a. Large dogs –for dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers
  - b. Medium dogs –for dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers
  - c. Small dogs – for dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog that is recorded in their ownership or part ownership, or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.
18. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is:-
  - a. A bitch which is in season.
  - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
  - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
  - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 7 days before 6<sup>th</sup> August 2007 shall be counted when entering for any class.
20. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
21. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
22. Dogs will not be received for competition after the class has been declared closed.
23. Dogs are limited to 4 classes per day.
24. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
25. Dogs must at the time of entry for competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
26. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the Show Society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
27. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
28. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
29. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
30. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
31. All dogs entered at the show must be entered on the relevant entry form, including not for competition dogs.
32. Please clean up after your dog and place in bins provided. Anyone knowingly not doing so may be asked to leave the venue and forfeit any remaining class entries.
33. In the event of abandonment of the Show through circumstances beyond our control, the organising group may defray such expenses from the entry fees to cover the cost of the Show preparation.
32. No refunds due to incorrect entries or requests for special running orders will be entertained.
33. All competitors who enter any special classes agree to the rules as defined in the schedule by Dartford DTC
34. Competitors must follow the stewards' instructions with regard to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries.
35. Goods may NOT be sold within the precincts of the show without prior permission of Dartford DTC
36. Rosettes and Trophies will NOT be forwarded.

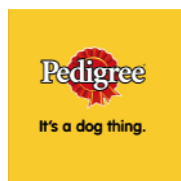

**DIRECTIONS**

#### **Competition Rules:**

You must be a member of the WBSDS to take part in this special section of the show.

The competition is open to all varieties of Belgian Shepherd Dog (Groenendael, Tervueren, Malinois & Laekenois) across both days of the show in KC Standard Classes:

Please indicate on the entry form what standard you will be competing in for each dog.

There will be a trophy for the BEST BSD in each Grade. The winner will be determined by the best combined performances from both the ABC class on the Saturday and the ABC class on the Sunday. To decide the best BSD in Grades 1 to 4 on the Saturday – these will be taken from the results of class 9, to decide the best BSD in Grades 5 to 7 on the Saturday – these will be taken from the results of Class 10. On the Sunday the Best BSD results will come from Class numbers 31 and 32.

The winner will be the handler with the BSD with the best two places, in the event of a “tie break” situation, the handler with the highest agility round will take priority. As an example : Fred Bloggs, gets the best result in ABC jumping (Grade 1) and the 2<sup>nd</sup> best result in ABCagility (Grade 1), whilst John Smith, gets the exact reverse, taking the best result in the ABC Agility and the second best result in the ABC jumping – John Smith will be deemed to have won, as both people have “the same” quality of placings and performances, but he has the better placing in the Agility class.

In case of dispute proof of postage of such applications may be required by The Kennel Club. Dogs under 18 months of age on the first day of the Show cannot be entered for competition. On no account will entries be accepted without fees. If a dog is in the process of Registration or Transfer at the time entry is made, add the letters NAF or TAF as appropriate after it's name. Please put classes in numerical order and USE BLOCK CAPITALS throughout when completing this entry form. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Any bank charges incurred through incorrectly completed or dishonoured cheques will be passed on to the owner concerned. The Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC Number) for dogs resident outside of the UK must be stated or the entry will be returned. PLEASE CHECK ALL DETAILS BEFORE POSTING.
