Despite the massive increase in size, we still try to retain the holiday atmosphere, with the added buzz of competition and that 'feel-good' feeling that our enjoyment is helping many small dog charities. Or perhaps that should read small charities helping dogs! Every year, many thousands are distributed because of YOUR generosity, so enjoy yourself – you deserve it! To get a really warm glow, read the thanks and testimonials on display in the information centre. With your help and support, Dogs in Need has shown these hard-working people that they ARE noticed and appreciated, and hopefully we've helped them to carry on when the going's got tough.

Success can also bring a down-side though. DINAS is now VAT registered, with the wicked taxman taking his share of the profits first. If you are registered for VAT & require a VAT receipt, please include a sae with your entry form – we can't cope with remembering to put it in with your ring cards! If you wish to donate your VAT back to DINAS, we will be more than happy to receive it in the Secretary's office at the Show.

We extend huge thanks to our main sponsors: **Genesis**, **K9 Cages**, and the **YKC**. Thanks also to all the other sponsors who help us to raise funds by sponsoring individual classes - Sainsburys, who look after us so well each year, doggy businesses, local businesses, clubs and individuals, all help to raise funds for those important smaller charities. Fancy a class named after YOUR club next year? Or to record a special occasion? Have a chat with Rosemary and she'll be only too happy to help.

The whole show can only run because of the many helpers who volunteer their services. As ever, last year the response was superb - can we do the same again this year? Will you volunteer? Please complete the Helpers Form if you are willing to help. **YOU DON'T HAVE TO CAMP, OR EVEN RUN A DOG, TO HELP - THE MORE THE MERRIER (AND EASIER!)**. It's a great way to meet new people and make new friends. The more helpers, the less for each one to do and the more we can all have a holiday. And please help the helpers - the boot may be on your foot the next day! Don't worry if you've never helped on a ring before – now's the perfect time to have a go. Start gently with putting up poles, and you'll soon be running pads like a pro.

Every year we have our usual band of 'resident' helpers – the friendly 'cycle psychos' who escort you to your camping spot, the Ring Managers who ensure your runs go as smoothly as possible (sorry – they can't guarantee clear rounds though), and the 'food fanatics' who keep all you helpers well fed and watered during the day. There's also the ones you don't see who work hard at preparing the showground while you're all leisurely packing your holiday gear, or fighting it out at the KC Festival. They're clearing up again afterwards as you all head off back along the A14. A lot of people put in a huge amount of effort, so if you spot anyone dozing quietly in an odd corner at the end of the week then just treat them like a roundabout and step round them – they've probably earned it!

**Unfortunately we must still mention the boring bits,
but if we do it here then we don't need to do it over the PA!**

If you've got DOGS or CHILDREN then this bit's for you – which means it's for everybody.

PLEASE CLEAR UP after your dogs and place in the bins provided. If you knowingly don't, we will tell you to leave - it's as simple as that. So BAG IT & BIN IT!!

Please don't bring training equipment with you because we will not let you use it and you'll have carted all that weight around with you for nothing. Much better to use the space for another couple of bottles.

If you have children with you then they are your responsibility, and are assumed to be under your supervision at all times. Yes – even if they're 6ft tall and tower over you! This means you always know where they are and what they are doing. And if what they are doing is anti-social then we may ask you to leave. We may sympathise, but we don't condone. Parents, please advise your children on safety measures on site, with particular emphasis on road safety and bikes.

Remember the 5mph speed limit doesn't just refer to 4 wheels but 2 wheels as well (and anything else you can find to move about on).

There won't be any measuring at the Show. If your entry needs changing, whether through earlier measuring or winning out, you must inform Agility Aid or iSS (as appropriate) within 7 days of closing date, otherwise your original entry will stand and you must run as NFC and we'll all feel bad. For postal entries, notification may be done by telephone to 0870 766 1958, but must be followed up in writing in order to help a befuddled brain, or by e-mail to: june@agilityaid.fsnet.co.uk. In the case of electronic entry this must be done by e-mail to: admin@ishowservices.com. Any change of handler may be done by informing the pads steward prior to running.

And of course - THE RULES - you do of course read them avidly on every schedule you receive, but could we ask you to read **Rules 37** onwards again, just to make sure. These are particularly pertinent to the Dogs in Need show. All of the pages in this schedule relate to Rules and Regulations and must be adhered to. So this is a rule to read the Rules!

This schedule provides all the information you need to make the most of your week's holiday with your dogs. It also includes all the rules and guidelines covering the week, so to make the most of a good time we suggest you read through it.

The cut-off date for entries will be the 20th June.

HOW DO I ENTER? (cont)

- d). Enter any **Pairs** entries. If the same pair is entering more than one Pairs class, you only need to enter the details once and list all the class numbers this pairing covers. If your dog is only entering a pairs class then you will still need to complete an individual entry form with the Dog's details completed so that we can issue a ring number, but write across the classes section 'PAIRS ONLY'. Check - has your partner entered the same pair? (We like people who pay twice!) Does your partner know they are in a pair?! Have you entered a partner? - sorry but we are unable to find partners for you.
 - e) If you have entered a **Championship** class then you must complete the qualifying wins for your dog on the Pairs and Championship form. You may opt not to have your address recorded in the Catalogue.
- 2 Complete a **Camping Form**, if applicable. Remember to tell us who you want to camp with and remember to tell the rest of your camping group to use the same name. If John Brown says he wants to camp with Joe Bloggs, and Joe Bloggs says he wants to camp with John Brown they will probably both end up very lonely. TICK if you want electric hook-up, a cross looks as though you don't. Remember, it is your responsibility to provide a cable that is long enough to plug into the supply (minimum 25 mtrs). **IT WILL REQUIRE A STANDARD 13AMP - 3 PIN PLUG ON THE END.** Electric hook-up can only be supplied if pre-paid, and is 240v supply only. Electricity supply cannot be guaranteed and we recommend that you bring an alternative source of power with you as back-up. All entries, camping & electric applications must be made on the appropriate official entry forms and paid in full by close of entries (see Rules 49 & 56). Please Note: Camping pitches are approximately 9m x 6m. If your unit plus any ATTACHED awning is over 9m in length remember to specify the length on the Camping Form in the box provided. If you pitch any other unit within your pitch area (eg tent, etc) there must be a minimum 3m gap left between units. These are fire regulations and **MUST BE ADHERED TO**. Any units not complying will be asked to move, so for your own sake please ensure you book enough pitches to accommodate your set-up. We cannot guarantee where any overflow camping will be sited. **Camping numbers are limited to 800** - first come first served, so get shifting! **IF YOU DO NOT WANT YOUR ENTRY PROCESSING IF CAMPING IS FULL THEN YOU MUST TICK THE BOX ON THE CAMPING FORM.** Rules 40, 46 and 50 also particularly apply, so to avoid any confusion here they are again:
 40. For the safety of dogs/people it is the responsibility of those using electric hook-ups and/or generators to provide adequate protection for cables and their own lead. People camping in groups who require electric will be sited nearest to the electric supply points.
 46. No camping units allowed on the Show ground before 9.00am Monday 13th August 2007. Early show helpers will be sent passes and must book in on arrival. **NO PASS – NO EARLY ENTRY.** Camping numbers may be limited at the Committee's discretion. The Show ground will be locked from 24.00hrs - 7.00 hrs each night.
 50. All camping roadways on site must be kept clear at all times. The erection of training equipment is forbidden. There will be a designated area for day parking which must be used. Please adhere to this rule.
 - 3 Please complete the **HELPERS FORM**. Each year we need more than 500 'people days' in help. That's one day for 1 in 3 of you, half a day for 2 out of 3, but just a couple of hours if you would all help. If you can supply a complete ring party (12 -14 people) then please state 'RING PARTY' on the form and list their names so we can camp you all together. We endeavour to provide preferential camping for helpers, so persuade your friends to join you.
 - 4 Complete one **Header Form** to cover all your entries. List your NFC dogs - remember they must be minimum 4 months old and registered with the Kennel Club. Puppies under 4 months are not permitted anywhere on the Show ground. All dogs attending the show must be entered on the relevant form somewhere, otherwise they will have to spend the week outside the perimeter fence watching the rest of us enjoying ourselves. That netting plays hell with their noses. Count your class entries, camping, electrics and enter them in the Fees section, grab the calculator and see how much you need to re-mortgage the house for. Have a stiff drink and remember what fun it is. Please write your return address clearly so that we may get your envelope correct. If you are planning to leave early for a holiday then please enter a 'last post date' for posting your ring cards. If they are not ready to post by that date then we will retain them for you to collect at the show.
 - 5 Gather all your papers together, grit your teeth and write your cheque(s). It would be a huge help to us if you could arrange your forms with the Camping/Helpers form on top, followed by the Header Form, then the Entry Forms, and lastly the Pairs/Championship forms. Fold them in half together (not individually - it takes you longer and us even longer to unfold!) and put the money in the middle. **PLEASE DON'T STAPLE ANYTHING** - we need our fingers for typing in your entries. The bundle you are left with should fit nicely in a C5 envelope (that's the size of half a sheet of paper, the sort of envelope you get your ring cards in) and will therefore be eligible for normal postage costs. If you are using anything bigger then **IT WILL COST MORE**. If you forget that and put a normal stamp on then it won't be delivered to us but will be held to ransom by the Post Office until we go and collect it and cough up lots of extra loot as well. That doesn't make us happy bunnies, so pretty please.

FINAL FINAL CHECK!!!

JUNIORS - are you eligible? Check the junior classifications carefully – Saturday's junior may be Tuesday's adult.
PAIRS - if somebody enters your dog in a pair and there is no individual entry form for that dog, or you have entered him NFC, then he will be deemed NOT TO HAVE ENTERED and we cannot subsequently put him in a pair. Remember, we are unable to accept half pairs.
Finally, please make sure you list all your NFC dogs you're bringing for a holiday - we'd hate to send them away with a stick attached to a tied spotty bag over their shoulder! Your NFC dogs should be listed on the Header Form and the declaration signed for them.

AND IF IT'S STILL WRONG?....

Because of the volume of entries, we may make the following assumptions concerning incorrect entries:
INCORRECT FEES: under payment and we will chase you for the loot! Over payment, and thank you very much for your generous contribution. (well, it is for charity!). Bounced cheque or fees remaining underpaid? We may just return your entry.....
INCORRECT CLASS ENTRIES: for dogs entered in more than the allowed classes, we will remove them from the highest grade non-special agility class, followed by the highest grade non-special jumping class. Championship classes will not be cancelled. **Juniors** entered as an addition to a dog's two entries will be removed from the junior entry. If your entry is sent in early enough when we're still in bouncy mood, we'll ring you first to check, but as closing date approaches – beware!

AND FOR THOSE PEOPLE WHO CAN'T BE BOTHERED TO READ ALL THAT - A FEW POINTS TO LOOK OUT FOR.....

Remember, your dog may only enter 2 individual classes in any one day, *regardless of who is the handler*, with the exception of Helping Hands and YKC, plus Pairs. If you enter Classic classes from different classics (for instance, Combined 1-5 Agility and Junior U12 Jumping) then PLEASE tell us which classic you want to collect points for. If not, then we shall nominate a classic as defined above under Incorrect Class Entries. Changing the handler of the dog will not change these restrictions!

If you are entering a Junior class then we need to know what size your dog is - make sure you use the correct form or your small might be in for a nasty shock when faced with large jump heights. If you are borrowing a dog, then do check that the owner isn't judging that day – you won't be allowed to run their dog. And if your parent is completing the entry form for you then make sure they are aware of how much you're growing up and get your age classification right – some adults don't admit to the passing of time!

If your dog is entered in the **Helping Hands** class, then you MUST tell us who the handler is – and they mustn't run a dog in any other class during the week. This class is for those noble helpers who do the work without running a dog. If it was just for anyone who helps then it would have about 2000 dogs in it! (We hope!).

CLASSES FOR JUNIOR HANDLERS: Tuesday & Wednesday & Saturday - special Junior classes are available on these days. You must be a member of the YKC to enter the YKC class on the Saturday. Dogs may only be entered in one age category in each class, regardless of handler. Please check the different age categories carefully.

Please note: junior classes are included within the two classes limit for the dog.

RULES FOR THE AGILITY CLUB STARTERS CHALLENGE HEATS

- 1 Eligibility for the Agility Competitions will be as per the K C Regulations H for Grade 1 and Grade 2 in force at the time of the event.
- 2 The competition must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Regulations H in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations.
- 3 Competitors may enter more than one dog in a Heat, but may only qualify one dog for the Final. Each Heat is open to all eligible Grade 1 and Grade 2 dogs but only "Agility Club" members at the time of the Heat can qualify for the Final.
- 4 Qualifiers may enter further Heats for competition providing they are eligible. Handlers who gain a place in a Heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this fact.
- 5 The competition for the 2008 Finals will consist of a number of Heats, with the first 2 Agility Club members from each Heat going through to the Final.

The Finals will be held at the Agility Club Show in 2008.

THE GENESIS & K9 CAGES CLASSICS

PLEASE READ THE RULES CAREFULLY!

- 1 The **GENESIS & K9 CAGES Classics** will be in twelve categories. Each Classic will have four qualifying classes, 2 agility and 2 jumping, for which points may be gained to qualify towards the Final.
- 2 **Dogs** may enter a maximum of any **two** Classic classes per day for which they are eligible, but may only qualify for the Final nominated on the entry form. If no Final has been nominated, and it is not clear which Final applies, then the Final may be assumed by us based on the priorities listed on page 5 under Incorrect Class Entries.
- 3 Points will be awarded according to any place achieved in each class of the nominated or assumed Classic, as per the official prize-giving for that class. Points will also be awarded for unplaced clear rounds. 1st place will receive 50 points, 2nd place 49 points, etc. down to the last place awarded. Unplaced clear rounds will receive 10 points. **Points will only be awarded to one Handler**, and only that handler will be allowed to run in the Final.
- 4 The handler gaining points will be the handler as designated on the first scribe sheet to the score tent. If this is not the correct handler to gain points, then the required handler must be notified to Agility Aid in writing prior to Tuesday August 14th 2007, and that amendment will then stand for the duration of the competition. It is the responsibility of the handler to ensure that the scribe sheets record the correct handler prior to running.
- 5 A full listing of dog/handler combinations achieving points will be displayed at the Show after the first 2 heats and again after the 4 heats. Those appearing in the final listing up to and including the designated lowest place will be invited to take part in the Finals on Thursday 16th or Sunday 19th August 2007. In addition, two white dogs will be accepted from the next 5 reserve dogs appearing in the listing, being the first eligible two to book in the morning of the Final. Only handlers who have not qualified as a Finalist for that Classic may run as a White Dog.
- 6 Finalists and interested reserves **MUST** book in the morning of their Classic at Ring 1's score tent by the designated time or they will not be allowed to run. Booking in for **Finalists** is achieved by completing a commentary card (supplied in the score tent) and posting it in the relevant box there. Booking in for the 2 white dogs is achieved by handing the completed commentary card to the table secretary in the score tent. The 2 white dogs for that Final will receive a commemorative rosette. Full details will be supplied at the Show.
- 7 A list of Finalists and eligible White Dogs will be displayed at the Show the evening of the last Classic heats for that Classic.
- 8 There will be a minimum of 10 Finalists for each Classic. The actual number to qualify will be decided on close of entries, and these numbers will be displayed on the Dogs in Need website, and at the Show. If less than 10 Finalists book in then reserve dogs (in order of qualifying) will be allowed to compete to make the 10 Finalists, with the next 2 reserve dogs (if available and within rule 6) to run as White Dogs.

Handlers ages as at 13th August 2007.

First and second place in each section will qualify for the semi-finals at Crufts in the YKC ring. If less than 6 dogs are entered in a section then only the first placed dog will qualify,

Handlers may enter more than one dog, & may enter an already qualified dog - in the event of a second win, will be awarded the red rosette but the next placed dog will qualify.

Dogs may only be entered in one section and with one handler.

If a handler qualifies more than one dog he/she will decide the dog to run in the semi final. The place will be offered to the next placed dog.

Handlers/Dogs placed 1st - 3rd in the class at the semi-final will compete in the Final in the Crufts Main Arena, and the overall winner will be declared as the **YKC Agility Dog of the Year**.

Standard marking will apply, and jump heights will be appropriate for the size of the dog in accordance with H regulations in force at the time of competition.

The course will remain the same for all sections.

K9 Cages Junior Classics

If you're 16 or over then this bit doesn't concern you, you're in with the big boys now, but if you're under 16 then these may be for you. The rules for what a dog may enter have changed to make it easier for everyone, but it may have an effect on you if you run someone else's dog.

Every dog is restricted to two runs per day, plus any eligible pairs class, a helping hands run, and the Saturday YKC classes. That means if the dog's owner wants to run their dog in two classes on the Junior Classic days (Tuesday and Wednesday), then you won't be able to run it. But there's plenty of time to run little errands, put a sweet smile on your face, and generally grovel - they may just relent.

If you're lucky enough to have your own dog, or have managed to win round a kindly owner, then make sure whoever completes the entry form puts you in the right age group. You may have just had your 12th birthday, but in their eyes you're still their little soldier!

Entries will be received according to the priorities and conditions as detailed within this Schedule and within the following guidelines:

DEFINITION OF CLASSES.

Grade 1 For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2 For owners, handlers or dogs which have qualified out of Grade 1 but have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

The following dogs are also eligible for Grade 2 classes:-

Dogs eligible to compete in Novice in the U.S.A, dogs eligible for Irish Kennel Club Preliminary class and dogs eligible to enter Grade 1 classes under F.C.I. rules (or equivalent).

Grade 3 Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

The following dogs are also eligible for Grade 4 classes:-

Dogs competing in Open or Excellent but do not hold a Championship Title in the U.S.A, dogs eligible for Irish Kennel Club Novice Class and dogs eligible to enter Grade 2 classes under F.C.I. rules (or equivalent).

Grade 5 Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

The following dogs are also eligible for Grade 6 Classes:-

Dogs holding a Masters or Championship Title in the U.S.A, dogs eligible for Irish Kennel Club Premier classes and dogs eligible to enter Grade 3 classes under F.C.I. rules (or equivalent).

Grade 7 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

Championship Class Open to dogs having qualified to compete in Grade 7. To consist of 2 qualifying rounds of Standard Kennel Club Classes, 1 Agility Class and 1 Jumping Class and a final round of Agility to be held at the same Show.

SPECIAL CLASSES

JUNIOR UNDER 12 yrs: Open to handlers under 12 years of age as at 13th August 2007.

JUNIOR 12 – 15 yrs: Open to handlers aged 12 or over but under 16 years of age as at 13th August 2007.

YKC JUNIOR 6 - UNDER 12 yrs: Open to handlers 6 and over but under 12 years of age as at 13th August 2007.

YKC JUNIOR 12 – UNDER 18 yrs: Open to handlers aged 12 or over but under 18 years of age as at 13th August 2007.

HELPING HANDS: Open to HANDLERS not entered in any other class on any day at the Show. Maximum two dogs per handler, they can be any size.

BUCKS & BUNNIES PAIRS JUMPING: Open to Small, Medium and Large dogs, 2 same height dogs with 2 handlers

ABC: This class is open to all Large dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses. (Any Breeds but Collies) In the event of a dispute the judge's decision will be final.

Overseas visitors please note, you MUST have your ATC number from the British Kennel Club BEFORE you can enter the show, and this number MUST be entered on your entry form.

HEIGHT LIMITS FOR DOGS

Large Dogs	For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
Medium Dogs	For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and those measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
Small Dogs	For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.

A dog may only compete at the height and grade for which they are eligible

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licensed Agility shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/authority to compete number will be required for each entry.
- 2 Entry fees: £2.40 per dog per class, £10.00 per Championship entry, £4.80 per pair. Camping £62.00, electric hook-up £35.00. Postage 40p (UK), 100p (Overseas). All entries, camping and electric are inclusive of VAT at the standard rate. If you require a VAT receipt please send an SAE marked 'VAT' with your entries.
- 3 No prize money will be paid.
- 4 The Committee reserves itself the right to refuse entries.
- 5 Puppies under 18 months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows.
- 6 Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club Registered with their details on the entry form.
- 7 The mating of bitches within the precinct of the show is forbidden.
- 8 No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
- 9 No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
- 10 Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. Not attached by a ring.
- 11 Should a Judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the committee reserves the right to appoint another Judge.
- 12 No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
- 13 Sponsors are listed on the back page.
- 14 Kennel Club standard marking regulations will apply.
- 15 Height of Hurdles: Large Dogs - 650mm (2ft 1.6ins), Medium Dogs - 450mm (1ft 5.7ins), Small Dogs - 350mm (1ft 1.75ins).
- 16 Height limit for dogs: Large Dogs – For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers, Medium Dogs – For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers. Small Dogs – For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75mm) or under at the withers.
- 17 Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.
- 18 Withdrawal of dogs from Competition. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- 19 In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 7 days before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class (14th June 2007).
- 20 It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
- 21 A handler working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
- 22 Should circumstances so dictate, the Society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 23 A dog, at the time of entry for the Competition, must be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a Limited Company, the Directors and Secretary of the Limited Company will jointly be considered for the purposes of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entries having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
- 24 Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
- 25 Animals at Event. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes, or by permission of the Kennel Club. However a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- 26 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority To Compete number or a Registration number for an Imported Dog before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number/Imported Dog Registration number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor
- 27 Competitors are reminded of the suffering that can be caused when dogs are left in cars on sunny days. Remedial action will be taken in the event of dogs found in a distressed condition.
- 28 In the event of abandonment of the Show through circumstances beyond the control of the Committee, expenses may be defrayed from the entry fees to cover the cost of the preparations for the Show.
- 29 All dogs will be entered at this Show at their owner's risk. Whilst the Committee and helpers will undertake every care, they will not take responsibility for loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, persons or property.
- 30 There will be no practising in the Ring during or after the Show.
- 31 The Competition Manager cannot enter or work a dog at the Show.
- 32 Please clear up after your dogs and place in bins provided. Anyone knowingly not doing so will be asked to leave the venue and forfeit any remaining class entries.
- 33 Puppies under 4 calendar months of age are not permitted at the Show. This includes the Car Parks and Exercise areas.
- 34 A pay on the day class will be held if time permits. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
- 35 Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees. All dogs attending the Show must be entered on the relevant entry form, including dogs Not for Competition. Dogs entered in pairs only must be entered on an Individual Entry Form in order to be given a competing number.

- 36 Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
- 37 Please do not leave your dogs loose when unattended, tethers should be a maximum of 2mtrs in length.
- 38 Speed limit on site is 5mph (KC recommendation) and will be strictly enforced. All drivers of vehicles on site must hold a full driving licence.
- 39 All caravans/camping units to carry suitable fire extinguishers and facilities for fire fighting and first aid. All vehicles/caravans/camping units must display passes at all times. Any found not doing so will be removed from the Show-ground. Fire points will be indicated by a solid red flag. Campers are asked not to fly red flags from their caravans.
- 40 For the safety of dogs/people it is the responsibility of those using electric hook-ups and/or generators to provide adequate protection for cables and their own lead. People camping in groups who require electric will be sited nearest to the electric supply points.
- 41 All people and dogs attending the Show will be bound by Dogs In Need Rules. All Trade Stand vendors must comply with the Rules and Regulations of this Show.
- 42 People or dogs acting in an unreasonable/irresponsible manner will be removed from the Show and forfeit all fees paid. All under 18's must be accompanied by an adult who will be held responsible for their conduct for the duration of the Show.
- 43 Definition of Test Area - all rings.
- 44 Running orders MUST be adhered to (with the exception of bona fide workers or a note from teacher) unless you want to face not running.
- 45 A dog which is known to be unsociable and 'snappy' must be muzzled when in the vicinity of people or other dogs.
- 46 No camping units allowed on the Show ground before 9.00am Monday 13th August 2007. Early show helpers will be sent passes and must book in on arrival. Camping numbers will be limited to 800. The Show ground will be locked from 24.00hrs - 7.00 hrs each night. Camping units will be received Monday 13th – Saturday 19th between the hours of 9.00am to 8.00pm only.
- 47 Rosettes and awards must be collected at the Show. Rosettes & awards will not be issued before the official prize-giving. These usually start after lunch at approx. 2.00pm.
- 48 The owner, competitor, handler or any other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car & caravan parks & approaches. All dogs must be kept on lead other than when in the test area and the designated exercise area where they must still be under control.
- 49 All fees must be paid in pounds sterling and drawn on a UK bank or postal order. No refunds will be given. All entries, camping & electric must be made on the appropriate official entry forms and **paid in full** by close of entries. Camping pitches & electric hook-ups are NOT TRANSFERABLE .
- 50 All camping roadways on site must be kept clear at all times. The erection of training equipment is forbidden.
- 51 Day parkers must park in the day parking area or be removed, and must display their parking sticker at all times. Disabled people with badges will be allowed to park in the disabled parking area.
- 52 All people at this show have a responsibility to take care of the health and safety of themselves and others, and to report any health and safety concerns to the Show Manager.
- 53 It is the responsibility of the handler to ensure that any change of handler is recorded on the scribe sheet prior to competing, otherwise the run will be declared NFC.
- 54 Internet entries will be accepted via www.iShowServices.com
- 55 Remedial action will be taken in the event of dogs left in cars being found in a distressed condition.
- 56 The Committee reserves the right to return any entries, without further notification, if fees remain unpaid, for whatever reason.
- 57 Digital or analogue recording within the precincts of the show for reward or gain will only be allowed by permission of the Show Manager.
- 58 Dogs in Need will not accept any amendments to entries after 7 days after closing date (27th June 2007)
- 59 Under section 2 of the Health Act 2006, smoking will not be permitted within any covered or enclosed public area, including score tents.

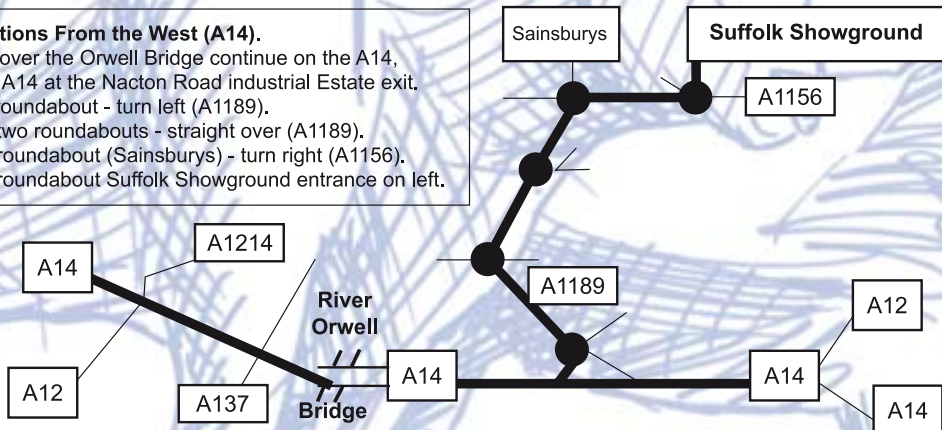
