Class 24: 1<sup>st</sup> place £10 voucher                    2<sup>nd</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> place £5 voucher each

In accordance with Kennel Club Rules, Large dogs who have not competed before 1<sup>st</sup> January 2006 and ALL Small and Medium dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a Kennel Club licensed Agility Show.

**Agility Grading Structure with 2007 Entry Positions  
for Existing Agility Handlers & Dogs**

<u>Grade 1(Elementary)</u>	Existing Elementary Dogs
<u>Grade 2(Starter)</u>	Existing Starter Dogs
<u>Grade 3(Graduate)</u>	Existing Novice Dogs that have not gained a top 10 place in Novice or above during 2006
<u>Grade 4(Novice)</u>	Existing Novice Dogs that have been placed 6 <sup>th</sup> to 10 <sup>th</sup> in Novice or above during 2006
<u>Grade 5(Intermediate)</u>	Existing Novice Dogs that have gained a top 5 place in Novice or above during 2006
<u>Grade 6(Senior)</u>	Existing Senior Dogs (Existing wins gained up to 31 <sup>st</sup> December 2006 in Open, Senior or Intermediate classes, can be carried forward for progression to Grade 7)
<u>Grade 7(Advanced)</u>	Existing Advanced Dogs

There is an exception for current Novice dogs. Dogs that achieved a top 10 place prior to 2006 in Novice or above (but not during 2006) will have the option, at the beginning of 2007, of competing in the grade achieved, as above OR dropping down ONE to grade 3 or 4(accordingly)

**DOGS THAT MATCH THE ABOVE CRITERIA FOR ANY GRADE MUST COMPETE  
IN THE RELEVANT GRADE AT THE START OF 2007**

**Standard Classes**

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade).

Grade 1(Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs, which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club, licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2(Starters)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have qualified out of Grade 1 but have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2(Starters) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 3(Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4,5,6 or 7.

Grade 4(Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,5,6 or 7.

Grade 5(Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,4,6 or 7.

Grade 6(Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class ore three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,4,5 or 7.

Grade 7(Advanced)

Open to dogs, which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

## Eligibility and Schedule of Classes

This classification should apply to competitions for Large, Medium and Small dogs.

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined below. The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class.

Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:

**Class Structure.** A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

**Progression.** Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

**Points Progression.** At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

### THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA AGILITY STAKES REGULATIONS 2007

All events must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club regulations H & H(1) in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering any competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these regulations.

All heats must take place at Kennel Club licensed shows and the class name in the schedule should replicate exactly the name of the competition as stated in these regulations.

All Kennel Club supported competitions should be judged using standard marking.

If the entry for the heat exceeds the Kennel Club limit for a judge in a day, then the class will be equally split and another judge appointed for the second part. Qualifiers and reserves from that heat will be taken in equal proportion from each part, giving the total number originally required from that heat. Rosettes and awards remain unchanged if the heat is split.

Dogs entered in any heats must be eligible for the competition entered and judges retain the right to check the height of any dog or ask to see the height stated in the Kennel Club Record Book.

Competitors can qualify for any Olympia final but it must be with different dogs. The first final a handler qualifies a dog for will be the final that particular dog competes in at Olympia.

### THE KENNEL CLUB LARGE DOG AGILITY STAKES Supported by Pedigree



Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the semi-final. Only one dog may qualify for the final (the first dog qualified at the semi-final). Once a dog has qualified for the final/semi-final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi finals.

The first ten dogs from each heat will go forward to the semi-finals at the Royal Show at Stoneleigh and the Town & Country Festival at Stoneleigh. Twenty dogs will compete in each of the semi-finals with the first five from each semi-final going through to the final at Olympia.

The thirty-five dogs who qualify for Olympia will be invited to compete in a further semi final at Olympia. The top ten highest placed dogs in the Olympia semi final will qualify for the final at Olympia.

**Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 430 mm (1 foot 5 inches) at the withers.**

This competition will be classified as combined Grade 6 and 7 and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.



### PEDIGREE AGILITY RULES 2007

All events must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club regulations H & H(1) in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering any competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations.

All heats must take place at Kennel Club licensed shows.

All Pedigree supported competitions should be judged using standard marking.

If the entry for the heat exceeds the Kennel Club limit for a judge in a day, then the class will be equally split and another judge appointed for the second part. Qualifiers and reserves from that heat will be taken in equal proportion from each part, giving the total number originally required from that heat. Rosettes and awards remain unchanged if the heat is split.

Dogs entered in any heats must be eligible for the competition entered and judges retain the right to check the height of any dog or ask to see the height stated in the Kennel Club Record Book.

(These rules would be amended if any changes are made to Kennel Club agility regulations during the course of the competition year).

### PEDIGREE LARGE DOG PAIRS RELAY

Two dogs with separate handlers will compete over the same course of a minimum of sixteen obstacles. When the first dog/handler returns to the start/finish, there will be a baton change between handlers. No part of the second dog/handler must be over the start line; failure to observe this will incur a penalty of twenty faults. The baton must stay behind the start line at all times.

The course must include:

Weaving Poles, Pipe Tunnel and Collapsible Tunnel.

No contact point obstacles to be used. Handlers may enter more than one dog in a heat; the first dog to qualify will compete in the final. Handlers can compete in further heats for competition after they have qualified for the final.

This competition will be classified as a combined class for Grades 1 to 7.

Dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 430 mm (1 foot 5 inches) at the withers.

## Helpers Perks 😊

We really want everyone to enjoy their day at our show. To show our appreciation to the people who volunteer to help we are offering the following perks.

We are planning to have some rings, where there is going to be a change of judge, that run through the normal lunch break. To do this we will need to let the All Day Helpers have a decent break so are looking for 2 types of helpers.

### All Day Helpers will receive:

**Ringside parking**

**Breakfast voucher**

**Lunch voucher**

**Access to ring refreshment box**

**Dog toy**

**Authority to run their dog(s) late/early**

### 2 Hour Helpers will receive:

**Lunch/Meal voucher** (albeit probably late lunch)

**Access to ring refreshment box whilst helping**

**Dog toy**

**Authority to run their dog(s) late/early**

It is likely that the majority of 2 Hour Helpers will be allocated to take over during the lunchtime to relieve the All Day Helpers but until the ring plan is finalised we will not be able to say for sure.

2 Hour Helpers will need to work for at least 2 hours to receive the perks so people needing to go run their dog(s) during the allocated time will need to make up the time after.

It will be up to the ring managers to give out the meal vouchers and toys so please only offer to help if you are genuinely willing and able to, otherwise you are putting them and other helpers in an awkward situation.

## Equipment

Agility equipment supplied by Adams Agility (with wooden poles). Timing equipment supplied by Taryntimers.

## Parking

Please be aware that part of the main parking area (**not All Day Helpers**) is not visible from the rings and has a service road/footpath running adjacent to it which is open to members of the public. Whilst the committee will undertake every care they will not take responsibility for loss or damage to property howsoever caused.

## Exercise Area

Out of courtesy to others a maximum of 2 dogs per person off lead at any time please. It goes without saying to clear up after your dogs and put in the sacks provided.

## Directions to the show

**From the North:** Proceed southwards on the A3 past Guildford and leave at the turn off signposted Milford and Haslemere. Take the first exit at the roundabout and \*turn left at the traffic lights. Go past a small parade of shops and turn left into Chapel Lane. Secrett's can be found on the right hand side.

**From the South:** Turn off the A3 at Milford sign posted Godalming. Take the third exit at the 1<sup>st</sup> roundabout and the second exit at the next roundabout, then follow the directions from \* above.

**From Godalming:** Go into Milford **DO NOT** turn into Secrett's Garden Centre. Follow the road, take the second exit at the mini roundabout and then turn right into Chapel Lane. Secrett's is on the right hand side.

## **SHOW REGULATIONS**

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licensed Agility shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees £4.80 per pair: £2.40 for all other classes. (Includes day membership of Haslemere and District Dog Training Club) Not for competition dogs free. No refunds will be given after entries have closed. No refunds of overpaid fees will be made.
3. No prize money will be given
4. The committee reserve to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age are not eligible to compete at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Tests.
6. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club Registered with their details on the entry form.
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
13. Sponsors: The Kennel Club and Pedigree Master Foods.
14. Kennel Club standard marking regulations will apply.
15. Height of Hurdles:

Large Dogs	-	650mm(2ft 1.6ins)
Medium Dogs	-	450mm(1ft 5.7ins)
Small Dogs	-	350mm(1ft 1.75ins)
16. The height limit for dogs:

Large Dogs	-	For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at withers
Medium Dogs	-	For dogs measuring over 350mm(1ft 1.75ins) and measuring under 430mm(1ft 5ins) at the withers.
Small Dogs	-	For dogs measuring 350mm(1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Test may not enter for competition a dog, which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership, or handle a dog at the Test at which they are judging.
18. Withdrawal of dogs from Test. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the test if it is:
  - a. A bitch which is in season
  - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
  - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
  - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. Entry Eligibility: In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 7 days before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 10<sup>th</sup> March 2007
20. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
21. A handler working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
22. Should circumstances so dictate the Club, in consultation with the Judges(s), may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
23. A dog at the time of entry for the competition must be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations in the competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a Limited Company, the Directors and Secretary of the Limited Company will jointly be considered for the purposes of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entries having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owners property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
24. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees. Internet entries will be accepted via [www.iShowServices.com](http://www.iShowServices.com).
25. No camping units allowed on the showground.
26. Rosettes and trophies will not be forwarded
27. In the event of abandonment of the show through circumstances beyond their control, the organising group may defray such expenses from the entry fees as necessary to cover the cost of the show preparation.
28. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
29. No dogs will be allowed in the rings at any time other than when being judged. No practising will be allowed in the ring.
30. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to the dog in the ring.
31. Animals at Event. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes, or by permission of the Kennel Club. However a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted in to the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
32. Competitors are reminded of the suffering that can be caused when dogs are left in cars on sunny days. Remedial action will be taken in the event of dogs found in distressed condition.
33. All dogs will be entered at the show at their owners risk. Whilst the committee and helpers will undertake every care they will not take responsibility for loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, persons or property.
34. The Competition Manager cannot enter or work a dog at the show.
35. Puppies under 4 calendar months of age are not permitted at the show. This includes the Car Parks and Exercise areas.
36. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
37. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
38. Competition of Dogs suffering from contagious or infectious disease – no dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete Competitors infringing the regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under kennel Club RuleA42.
39. Dogs should be on lead except in the exercise area, or when under test.
