ELIGIBILITY & DEFINITION OF CLASSES

This classification should apply to competitions for large, medium & small dogs. In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open agility shows (i.e. limited agility shows, special classes & invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined below. The eligibility for "special" classes must be defined by the society & included in the schedule. The word "special" must be included in the title of the class. Agility classes to include contact points & jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:

Class Structure: a class may either be held as a **Graded class** or a **Combined class**. A Graded class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive grades with separate results & awards issued for each grade. A Combined class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression: Progression from each grade will require one agility win or three jumping wins at that grade, except the progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from combined classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression: at the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the show secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Only first prizes & points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade).

Grade 1 (Elementary)	For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. <i>N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.</i>
Grade 2 (Starters)	For owners, handlers or dogs which have qualified out of Grade 1 but have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. <i>N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.</i>
Grade 3 (Graduate)	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows & dogs which are not eligible for Grades 4, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 4 (Novice)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 5 (Intermediate)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.
Grade 6 (Senior)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three Jumping Classes at Grade 5 or elected to progress on points from Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.
Grade 7 (Advanced)	Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, two first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

Dogs that match the criteria for any grade must compete in the relevant grade at the start of 2007. There is an exception for current novice dogs. Dogs that achieved a top 10 place prior to 2006 in novice or above (but not during 2006) will have the option at the beginning of the year of competing in the grade achieved, as above, or dropping down one grade to grade 3 or 4 (accordingly).



BURNS ADAMS DERBY RULES



1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club rules in force at the time of the competition.
2. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
3. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at large height grades 4 and 5 only.
4. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
5. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may not enter any further heats except as a not for competition entry. Handlers running not for competition with a previously qualified dog must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class.
6. The first four dogs from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.
7. The next four dogs from each heat will be held as reserves.
8. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
9. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog.
10. The first section of the competition will contain the following pieces of equipment: A Frame, Dogwalk, Seesaw, a rising spread jump and a long jump. The placement of these obstacles is at the Judges discretion.
11. The first section is un-timed and dogs must successfully complete this section without faults before proceeding to the second section of the competition. Dogs with faults will not be allowed to proceed to the second section.
12. The second section is timed and will contain no more than fourteen but no less than twelve single pole hurdles plus a set of twelve weaves. The placement of these obstacles is at the Judges discretion.
13. Handlers are not allowed to touch their dogs between the separate elements of the first section but may touch their dogs between the first and second sections of the competition.
14. The object of the competition is to complete the control section of the class successfully before competing, against the clock, on a jumping course. The winner and subsequent places will be decided on the fastest time with least faults over the second section of the course.
15. Dogs will run under the new heights regulations.

Adams Agility will supply trophies to fourth and rosettes to twentieth regardless of the size of entries in any heat. Burns Pet Nutrition will supply dog food to third. High Peak will provide rosettes from 21st place to make up to 10% of the class

The final will be held at the Derbyshire Dog Agility Show on the last weekend in July (subject to KC approval and licence)



The Team Dash Competition Rules 2007

**GRAND FINAL
DASHIN' DOGS SUMMER SHOW
THURSDAY 7TH AUGUST 2007**

The 'Team Dash' is a competition for teams of four dogs and handlers, run as a relay over a simple jumping course. It is designed as a fast event with spectator appeal; accessible to all abilities of handlers and all heights of dogs. Teams of four large, four medium or four small dogs run over the same course at their own height, under identical conditions.

There are ten qualifying heats. The top two teams from each heat, regardless of height, will qualify for a Grand Final comprising of twenty teams (80 finalists) at Dashin' Dogs summer show on Thursday 7th August 2007.

Whilst the details of the course are at the discretion of the judge, it is a requirement of this competition that the course contains few - if any - traps, and is of 'fast and flowing' style. A 'figure of eight', or even a largely circular or helter-skelter style course is most appropriate.

1. The competition is classified under Kennel Club Regulations as 'Combined Grades 1 to 7' and 'Special', and will be held under KC Rules and Show Regulations H & H1 as in force at the date of the competition. Additional rules apply as described below. Competitors entering this Competition are deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules.
2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part. The winning team from each part will be regarded as the two qualifying teams from that heat.
3. All teams must consist of four dogs of the same height classification, handled by four separate handlers. Conditions remain the same for all teams except that the height of equipment will be appropriate to the height of the team of dogs competing.
4. Additions or substitutions to teams (handlers or dogs) are permitted, provided that (i) the substitute(s) is/are already entered in the heat (as a team member or reserve) (ii) rule (5) is not breached and (iii) alterations to teams are made before the run.
5. Handlers may compete in more than one team in a heat, providing they handle a different dog in each team. In the event of a handler being in both qualifying teams then their highest placed team will be deemed to have qualified. Dogs may only compete in one team in any given heat.
6. The course must contain two changeover lines, clearly marked on the ground, each with a minimum gate width of 4m. Dogs 1 & 3 start behind line A and finish behind line B. Dogs 2 & 4 start behind line B and finish behind line A. (Handler 1 may use a recall start). The inward and outward courses can be different, but both dogs from behind the same line must run the same course.
7. The course each dog is required to negotiate shall contain no less than 14 and no more than 20 obstacles.
8. This is a relay event and two suitable batons must be provided. All baton changes must be completed with the handlers and dogs behind the appropriate changeover line. Failure to comply with this, or an incorrect baton change (i.e. throwing or dropping the baton at changeover) will incur a penalty of 50 points on each occasion. Stewards may be appointed by the judge to adjudicate changeovers if required.
9. For each dog an elimination on the course incurs a single penalty of 100 points, however the judge will continue to mark any further faults on the remainder of the course and any faults of any remaining dogs.
10. The team with the fastest cumulative time and the least faults, wins. The top two teams from each heat qualify for the final. Once qualified, neither handlers nor dogs may compete in the remaining heats for that season except as Not For Competition. (N.F.C.)
11. Only the members of an original qualifying team, or the two original named reserves, will be allowed to compete in the final. Changes are at the organiser's discretion and only under exceptional circumstances.
12. In the event of a team being unavailable for the final, a reserve team will be called from the heat in which the qualifying team qualified.

Special ANY SIZE JUMPING CLASS



ANY SIZE: Open to all dogs not entered in any other classes over the weekend. Jumps will be set at 35cm for Large dogs and 25cm for Small and Medium dogs and will not contain a tyre or weaves. All heights of dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dog's applicable jump height with one set of awards.

KENNEL CLUB RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows must be registered with the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification & Registration B. The registration number / Authority To Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees are as detailed on the Entry Form. Entries charged at £2.20 per class and £8.80 per team
3. Prizes – no monetary prizes are on offer. Awards for each class are listed in the awards section of the schedule.
4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility shows.
6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months or over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show. Including car park, exercise area and camping area.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel, as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge. Should circumstances so dictate the Society in consultation with the judge can alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes should be reported to the KC.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
13. Sponsorship - Sponsors for the show will be listed on the schedule of classes next to each class that they are sponsoring.
14. Kennel Club standard marking Regulations will apply as published in the Kennel Club Yearbook in use at the time of the show, including any amendments introduced by the Kennel Club.
15. Maximum heights of jump obstacles: Large dogs 65cm, Medium dogs 45cm, and Small dogs 35cm.
16. Height limit for dogs:
 - a) Large dogs – for dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
 - b) Medium dogs – for dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
 - c) Small dogs – for dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
17. A judge at an Agility show may not enter for competition a dog that is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging.
18. Withdrawal of dogs from competition – a dog shall be withdrawn from competition & removed from an agility show if it is:
 - a) A bitch which is in season.
 - b) Suffering from any infectious disease or contagious disease.
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chances of winning of an opponent.
 - d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to & including 7 days before the date of closing of entries (9 June 2007) shall be counted when entering any class.
20. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class & running order.
21. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they were drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
22. Dogs may be limited to a specific number of classes. If applicable, this will be stated on the schedule of classes.
23. Should circumstances so dictate the society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes & the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
24. A dog must at the time of entry for the competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a Limited Company, the Directors & the Secretary of the Limited Company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a competition may compete as the new owner's property, provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the competition, & the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations & Conditions of the original Entry Form.
25. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease & that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
26. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
27. No dogs suffering from contagious or infectious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
28. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
29. A practice ring will be available if space allows
30. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to the dog in the ring.
31. Separate entry forms must be completed by each competitor and must be signed by the competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
32. No refunds will be given in the event of incorrect monies being submitted. It is the competitor's responsibility to check the paperwork before submission. All entry forms must contain the signature of the owner and the dog registration number before a dog is eligible to take part in the show.
33. All dogs are entered at their owners risk & whilst every care will be taken, the High Peak Dog Training Society will not take responsibility for the loss, damage or injury to dogs, people or property whilst at this show.
34. Additional judges will be appointed if necessary.
35. All camping units must be equipped with their own fire fighting equipment.
36. In the event that the show has to be cancelled High Peak DTS reserves the right to defray from entries such costs as they deem necessary.
37. Parents are responsible for the behaviour of their children at all times whilst on the show venue.
38. Appropriate remedial action will be taken where animals in vehicles are found to be in distress & the owners cannot be located.
39. All generators are to be switched off at 8.30pm each evening.
40. NO CAMP FIRES & no disposable barbecues are to be placed on the grass. Please be careful when you dispose of your barbecue waste & DO NOT put hot disposable barbecues in the skip.
41. The first 10 dogs should be at the start line for the commencement of each class, if not this could result in the run for that class being forfeited.

The erecting of trade stands and the selling of goods is only permissible by prior arrangement with High Peak DTS committee.
