Anniversary show: Wallingford Dog Training Club is celebrating its 30th anniversary in 2007 and we are organising a special free-entry quiz which we hope everyone will enter. Details at the show.

Classes - You can only enter classes which include the one grade for which you qualify.

In accordance with Kennel Club rules, all newly competing dogs must have been officially measured before competing at this show.

Small dogs: those measuring 35cms or under at the withers. Height of jump obstacles will be 35cms.

Medium dogs: those measuring over 35cms and 43cms or under at the withers. Height of jump obstacles will be 45cms.

Large dogs: measure over 43 cms at the withers. Height of jump obstacles will be 65cms.

Trophies & Rosettes

Class 27. Team Dash Relay: Trophies to the top 2 teams, rosettes to 6th place from the sponsor (**Dashin' Dogs**). The top two teams – regardless of height – will qualify for the final. If the class is split, a trophy goes to the winner and rosettes to 3rd place of each part, and the top team from each part will qualify for the final. **The rules have been amended this year - please read them carefully.**

Class 42. Large **First Contact** Grade 1&2 Agility Challenge. Trophies to 3rd place and rosettes to 20th place from the sponsor (**First Contact**); Wallingford will supply rosettes from 21st place to 10% of entry. If the class is split, trophies to 3rd and rosettes to the top 15 places from the sponsor, with Wallingford providing rosettes from 16th place to 10% of entry in each part. The top 5 (3 from each part if class is split) to qualify for the final. **Please read the rules for this competition carefully.**

Class 43. Large **Genesis** Performance Novice Jumping Tournament. Trophy, rosette & car sticker for the winner in each part, special rosettes for places 2 to 15 from the sponsor (**Genesis**); Wallingford to provide rosettes from 16th place to 10% of entry. The first three from each part will be invited to compete in the finals. **Please read the rules for this competition carefully.**

Class 45. Laser Knockout Pairs. Trophies to the winner and runners up, and rosettes for the final 16 pairs. The top 4 pairs from each heat will qualify for the final. **Please read the rules for this competition carefully.**

All other classes:

Entry under 40 – trophy to 1st place; entry between 40 and 79 – trophies to 1st and 2nd places; entry 80 and over – trophies to 3rd place. Placing to 10% and clear round rosettes in all individual classes.

Definition of Classes

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an agility class or 3 first places in jumping classes at Kennel Club licensed agility shows. *NB Owners, handlers or dogs who have previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are NOT eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starter)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have qualified out of Grade 1 but have not gained a first place in an agility class or 3 first places in Jumping classes at grade 2 level at KC licensed agility shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are NOT eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at KC licensed agility shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grades 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an agility class or 3 first places in jumping classes at Grade 3, or elected to progress on points from Grade 3, at KC licensed agility shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an agility class or 3 first places in jumping classes at Grade 4, or elected to progress on points from Grade 4, at KC licensed agility shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an agility class or 3 first places in jumping classes at Grade 5, at KC licensed agility shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at KC licensed agility shows, 2 first places must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes.



Competition Rules 2007

the team dash is an Open Jumping competition for teams of four dogs and handlers, run as a relay over a simple 'fast and flowing' jumping course. It is designed as a fast event with spectator appeal; accessible to all abilities of handlers and all heights of dogs. Teams of four large, four medium or four small dogs run over the same course at their own height, under identical conditions.

There are **ten qualifying heats**. The top two teams from each heat, regardless of height, will qualify for a **Grand Final** comprising twenty teams (80 finalists) at Dashin' Dogs summer show on Thursday 7th August 2007.

1. The competition is classified under Kennel Club Regulations as 'Combined Grades 1 to 7' and 'Special', and will be held under KC Rules and Show Regulations H & H1 as in force at the date of the competition. Additional rules apply as described below. Competitors entering this Competition are deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules.
2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part. The winning team from each part will be regarded as the two qualifying teams from that heat.
3. All teams must consist of four dogs of the same height classification, handled by four separate handlers. Conditions remain the same for all teams except that the height of equipment will be appropriate to the height of the team of dogs competing.
4. **Additions or substitutions to teams (handlers or dogs) are permitted, provided that (i) the substitute(s) is/are already entered in the heat (as a team member or reserve) (ii) rule (5) is not breached and (iii) alterations to teams are made before they run.**
5. Handlers may compete in more than one team in a heat, providing they handle a different dog in each team. In the event of a handler being in both qualifying teams then their highest placed team will be deemed to have qualified. Dogs may only compete in one team in any given heat.
6. The course must contain two changeover lines, clearly marked on the ground, each with a minimum gate width of 4m. Dogs 1 & 3 start behind line A and finish behind line B. Dogs 2 & 4 start behind line B and finish behind line A. (Handler 1 may use a recall start). The inward and outward courses can be different, but both dogs from behind the same line must run the same course.
7. The course each dog is required to negotiate shall contain no fewer than 14 and no more than 20 obstacles.
8. This is a relay event with two batons. All baton changes must be completed with the handlers and dogs behind the appropriate changeover line. Failure to comply with this, or an incorrect baton change (i.e. throwing or dropping the baton at changeover) will incur a penalty of 50 points on each occasion. Stewards may be appointed by the judge to adjudicate changeovers if required.
9. For each dog an elimination on the course incurs a single penalty of 100 points, however the judge will continue to mark any further faults on the remainder of the course and any faults of any remaining dogs.
10. The team with the fastest cumulative time and the fewest faults wins. The top two teams from each heat qualify for the final. Once qualified, neither handlers nor dogs may compete in the remaining heats for that season except as Not For Competition. (N.F.C.)
11. Only the members of an original qualifying team, or the two original named reserves, will be allowed to compete in the final. Changes are at the organiser's discretion and only under exceptional circumstances.
12. In the event of a team being unavailable for the final, a reserve team will be called from the heat in which the qualifying team qualified.

FIRST CONTACT

First Contact Grade 1&2 Agility Tournament Qualifier

Open to dogs qualified to run in Grades 1 or 2.

For owners/handlers or dogs that have not won an agility and/or jumping class at a licensed test (Grade 1 'Elementary', excepted).

1. This class will be judged under Kennel Club rules and show regulations H and H1 as in force on the date of the competition.
2. All competitors entering in the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and specific regulations governing this class.
3. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at large Grades 1 or 2.
4. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final.
5. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may be entered in further heats for competition as long as it is still eligible for Grades 1 or 2 classes.
6. Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the show secretary before running in the class. If a dog that has already qualified qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the next highest placed dog that has not qualified.
7. The first five dogs from each heat will be invited to enter into the final. If the heat at a show is split, the top three from each part will qualify for the final.
8. In the event of the handler not being able to compete in the final due to injury or illness a substitute handler may run the dog so long as the substitute handler is eligible for Grades 1 or 2.

The **First Contact** Grades 1&2 agility final will be held at the **Dog Vegas show** in Lincolnshire on **Sunday 26th August 2007**. All unplaced finalists will receive a special finalist rosette. The top three places will receive a trophy. The overall winner of the final will receive a £100 voucher for **First Contact** agility and flyball equipment.



The GENESIS Performance Novice Jumping Tournament 2007

This class will be classified as Novice and open to dogs in Grades 3,4 or 5. The Class will be run as a Combined Class and judged under normal Kennel Club rules for standard classes.

Handlers may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the final. Dogs should be eligible to enter a grade 3, 4 or 5 class at the time of qualifying for the final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the final. Once a dog has qualified for the final, further heats may be entered for competition, but a dog may only qualify once in any year for the final. The first three places from each heat will be invited to compete in the finals. It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the Show Secretary on the day of the show of this fact.

The final will be held at the **East of England** three-day show in **June 2007**.

The prizes for each heat are as follows:

The winner will receive a special trophy and rosette.

Competitors placed 2nd to 15th will each receive a special rosette. In the event of a class being split, then the first three of each class will qualify and the same prizes will apply.

At the **final**, the winner will receive a special trophy & rosette, as well as a bag of Genesis dog food. Second and third placed dogs will also receive a special trophy, rosette and a bag of Genesis dog food. The next seven placed handlers will each receive commemorative rosettes.

The 'Laser' Knockout Pairs Competition Rules 2007

The 'Laser' knockout pairs is a fun competition, sponsored by Blair and Jenny Willis in memory of Laser (Fels Magic Laser), who really loved competing in the knockout pairs competitions.

1. The class will be open only to large dogs which are eligible to compete at Large Grades 3,4,5,6 and 7.
2. There will be eight qualifying heats. The top four pairs from each heat will qualify for the Final, which will take place at Dashin' Dogs summer show in 2007. Once a pair has qualified for the final, they may not run in further heats for the final which they have qualified for.
3. Handlers may enter more than one pair. Dogs may only compete in one pair in any heat. If a handler has entered more than one pair and is drawn to run against themselves, they may nominate another handler to run one of the dogs, that handler must then continue to run the dog for the rest of the heat and if they qualify for the final, they must run the dog in the final. Alternatively the handler can nominate which pair should continue in the heat.
4. The pairs will compete against each other over two similar courses. There will be a judge for each course. There will be a baton change between the first and second handler which must take place behind a line, failure to do so will incur 100 faults. Time and faults will be added together and the winning pair will be the one with the lowest time. The judges' decision will be final.
5. The course will consist of 10 obstacles, made up of jumps, tunnels and weaves (6 poles) only. Normal marking will apply. If a dog is eliminated, it will incur 100 faults. Should both pairs be eliminated, the pair which was eliminated first will lose.
6. The winning pairs from each round will go through to the next round until there is only one pair remaining.
7. Pairs will be issued with a running order which must be strictly adhered to. Pairs failing to run when due will be knocked out and the other pair will go through to the next round.
8. Only handlers and dogs originally entered may compete at the final (except in the case of rule 3). Any changes are at the organisers' discretion.

The winners and runners up for each heat will receive a trophy and rosettes will be presented to the final 16 pairs.

Additional Information

Directions: From junction 13 on the M4, and the M4 exit from the A34, follow signs for **Chieveley**, then follow signs to **Hermitage** from the roundabout until you pick up the **Newbury Showground** signs. The entrance will be well sign-posted.

Camping: will be available on Friday night (admission from 10am to 10pm) and Saturday night for £12 for the weekend. Shower facilities are available (but they are not brilliant). Sorry – open fires and BBQs are NOT allowed on site.

Please adhere to the following safety rules:

- Keep to within your pitches, and don't obstruct the gangways.
- All units must carry a fire extinguisher and/or have a bucket of water at the front of their units at all times.

Refreshments: Hot and cold refreshments will be available from 5pm on Friday evening and throughout the weekend (until about 7pm on each day). Rules and Regulations

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed agility shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. All fees are listed in the schedule and on the entry form
3. Awards for each class are listed in the schedule.
4. The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed agility shows.
6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, or entries determine that extra judges are required, the committee reserves the right to appoint other judges.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
13. Kennel Club standard marking will apply.
14. Before they compete all dogs must have been measured by 2 measurers appointed by the Kennel Club and classified into either the Small, Medium or Large category.
Large Dogs - For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers. Height of jump obstacles will be 65cms.
Medium Dogs - For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers. Height of jump obstacles will be 45cms.
Small Dogs - For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers. Height of jump obstacles will be 35cms.
15. Judges at an agility show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging.
16. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an agility show if it is:-
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
17. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 7 days before the closing date of entries (Tuesday 27th February 2007) shall be counted when entering any class. IE wins up to Tuesday 20th February.
18. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
19. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
20. Should circumstances so dictate the society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
21. A dog must at the time of entry for the competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a competition may compete as the new owners' property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
22. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes, or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
23. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
24. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club rule A42.
25. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
26. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
27. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
28. Internet entries will be accepted via www.iShowServices.com

Separate entry forms must be completed by each competitor and must be signed by the competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
