ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

In accordance with KC Rules, large dogs that have not competed before 1st January 2006 & ALL Small & Medium dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a KC licensed agility show.

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression. Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. A dog is only eligible for one grade. Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are no contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

GRADE 1 (Elementary): For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

GRADE 2 (Starters): For owners, handlers or dogs which have qualified out of Grade 1 but have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

GRADE 3 (Graduate): Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grades 4, 5, 6 or 7.

GRADE 4 (Novice): Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 5, 6 or 7.

GRADE 5 (Intermediate): Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.

GRADE 6 (Senior): Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5 or 7.

GRADE 7 (Advanced): Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

OPEN: - Open to all.

A.B.C (SPECIAL CLASS): Open to all large dogs excluding border collies, working sheepdogs and their crosses. In the event of dispute, the judge's decision will be final.

TIME, FAULT & OUT (SPECIAL CLASS): There will be a time set for the course, and the winner is the dog that gets furthest round the course without a fault in the set time.

CIRCULAR JUMPING (SPECIAL CLASS): A jumping course set out in a circular fashion.

This Class is intended for **all sizes of dogs that are not entered in any other class at this show**, and is particularly suitable for inexperienced dogs or handlers, and those dogs that are unable to compete at their full height. The Class will have no weaves, tyre or contact equipment and jumps will be at Small height for Large and Medium dogs, and at a lower height for Small dogs. The course will be very simple and flowing and will have a course time of 60 seconds. DOG-GAMES rosettes to 20th place and a Special Rosette for the highest Unplaced Small **OR** Medium dog. **NB.** Please mark on the entry form the size category of your dog in this class.



The Team Dash Competition Rules 2007

The 'Team Dash' is a competition for teams of four dogs and handlers, run as a relay over a simple jumping course. It is designed as a fast event with spectator appeal; accessible to all abilities of handlers and all heights of dogs. Teams of four large, four medium or four small dogs run over the same course at their own height, under identical conditions.

There are **ten qualifying heats**. **The top two teams from each heat, regardless of height, will qualify for a Grand Final comprising of twenty teams (80 finalists) at Dashin' Dogs summer show on Thursday 7th August 2007.**

*Whilst the details of the course are at the discretion of the judge, it is a **requirement** of this competition that the course contains few - if any - traps, and is of 'fast and flowing' style. A 'figure of eight' or even a largely circular or helter-skelter style course is most appropriate.*

1. The competition is classified under Kennel Club Regulations as 'Combined Grades 1 to 7' and 'Special', and will be held under KC Rules and Show Regulations H & H1 as in force at the date of the competition. Additional rules apply as described below. Competitors entering this Competition are deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules.
2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part. The winning team from each part will be regarded as the two qualifying teams from that heat.
3. All teams must consist of four dogs of the same height classification, handled by four separate handlers. Conditions remain the same for all teams except that the height of equipment will be appropriate to the height of the team of dogs competing.
4. Additions or substitutions to teams (handlers or dogs) are permitted, provided that (i) the substitute(s) is/are already entered in the heat (as a team member or reserve) (ii) rule (5) is not breached and (iii) alterations to teams are made before the run.
5. Handlers may compete in more than one team in a heat, providing they handle a different dog in each team. In the event of a handler being in both qualifying teams then their highest placed team will be deemed to have qualified. Dogs may only compete in one team in any given heat.
6. The course must contain two changeover lines, clearly marked on the ground, each with a minimum gate width of 4m. Dogs 1 & 3 start behind line A and finish behind line B. Dogs 2 & 4 start behind line B and finish behind line A. (Handler 1 may use a recall start). The inward and outward courses can be different, but both dogs from behind the same line must run the same course.
7. The course each dog is required to negotiate shall contain no less than 14 and no more than 20 obstacles.
8. This is a relay event and two suitable batons must be provided. All baton changes must be completed with the handlers and dogs behind the appropriate changeover line. Failure to comply with this, or an incorrect baton change (i.e. throwing or dropping the baton at changeover) will incur a penalty of 50 points on each occasion. Stewards may be appointed by the judge to adjudicate changeovers if required.
9. For each dog an elimination on the course incurs a single penalty of 100 points; however the judge will continue to mark any further faults on the remainder of the course and any faults of any remaining dogs.
10. The team with the fastest cumulative time and the least faults wins. The top two teams from each heat qualify for the final. Once qualified, neither handlers nor dogs may compete in the remaining heats for that season except as Not For Competition. (N.F.C.)
11. Only the members of an original qualifying team, or the two original named reserves, will be allowed to compete in the final. Changes are at the organiser's discretion and only under exceptional circumstances.
12. In the event of a team being unavailable for the final, a reserve team will be called from the heat in which the qualifying team qualified.

HELPERS REQUIRED: As the organising body of this show is very small, we will be looking for help in running rings on both days of the show. If you can offer your services for all or part days, then please indicate your preference on the entry form. **We would appreciate it if ALL competitors would donate an hour of your weekend to help on the rings to ensure the smooth running of the show.**

For those that help half/all day, there will be lunch provided, plus a (small!) refund.

HEIGHT CLASSIFICATION OF DOGS

Small Dogs: for dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers

Medium Dogs: for dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers

Large Dogs: for dogs measuring over 430mm at the withers.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered with the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification & Registration B. The registration number / Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees are as detailed on the Entry Form.
3. Prizes – no monetary prizes are on offer. Awards for each class are listed in the awards section of the schedule.
4. The Dartford DTC Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges. The judge's decision will be final; no competitor will be allowed to influence that in any way, and the show committee will stand by the judge's decision in all cases.
13. Sponsorship - Sponsors for the show are listed on the schedule.
14. Kennel Club standard marking Regulations will apply as published in the Kennel Club Yearbook in use at the time of the show, including any amendments introduced by the Kennel Club.
15. Height of jump obstacles will be as follows: Large dogs 65cm, Medium dogs 45cm, Small dogs 35cm.
16. The height limits for dogs are:
 - a. Large dogs –for dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers
 - b. Medium dogs –for dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers
 - c. Small dogs – for dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog that is recorded in their ownership or part ownership, or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.
18. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 12th February 2007 shall be counted when entering for any class.
20. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
21. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
22. Dogs will not be received for competition after the class has been declared closed.
23. Dogs are limited to 4 classes per day.
24. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
25. Dogs must at the time of entry for competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
26. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the Show Society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
27. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
28. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
29. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
30. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
31. All dogs entered at the show must be entered on the relevant entry form, including not for competition dogs.
32. Please clean up after your dog and place in bins provided. Anyone knowingly not doing so may be asked to leave the venue and forfeit any remaining class entries.
33. In the event of abandonment of the Show through circumstances beyond our control, the organising group may defray such expenses from the entry fees to cover the cost of the Show preparation.
32. No refunds due to incorrect entries or requests for special running orders will be entertained.
33. All competitors who enter any special classes agree to the rules as defined in the schedule by Dartford DTC
34. Competitors must follow the stewards' instructions with regard to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries.
35. Goods may NOT be sold within the precincts of the show without prior permission of Dartford DTC
36. Rosettes and Trophies will NOT be forwarded.

CAMPING:

- Available for a fixed fee of £15 for the weekend. Please include your camping fees of £15.00.
- Camping passes will be posted out with your entries
- Only campers who have paid in advance will be allowed in the camping area
- No camping units allowed on the showground before 3.00pm on Friday 30th March 2007.
- Please arrive on the Friday 30th March before 9.00pm to book in
- We regret that camping will not be available for Sunday night and we request that the site is cleared by 8:00 pm
- Please leave a minimum space of 20 feet between units
- Training equipment is not allowed in the camping areas
- The joining of gardens is prohibited
- No dogs to be left loose in gardens, or tethered to vehicles, whilst unattended
- Fire extinguishers will be sited around the venue
- All camping units are required to have a bucket of water at the front of the unit at all times
- There are toilets and showers on site, plus an emptying point for chemical toilets

DIRECTIONS

From junction 13 of the M4 take the A34 towards Oxford, then immediately take the left hand slip road towards Chieveley. At the top, turn right over the bridge and the Showground is then on your right. Go on past the house and enter through the Blue Circle gate.



All members of the WBSDS are invited to take part in a competition at the WBSDS open agility show on the 31st March and 1st April 2007 to find the best Belgian Shepherd Dog owned by WBSDS members

Competition Rules:

- You must be a member of the WBSDS to take part.
- The competition is open to all varieties of Belgian Shepherd Dog (Groenendael, Tervueren, Malinois & Laekenois) across both days of the show in KC Standard Classes:
- Please indicate on the entry form what standard you will be competing in for each dog.
- Places will count as points i.e. 1st place will = 10% of the class, so for example if you win a class that has 260 dogs in it, then 1st place will win you 26 points, 2nd place 25 points and so on. Points will be allocated to places where a rosette is given (this will be to at least 10% of each class)
- The BSD with the highest amount of points in each category over the two days will win at each competition level.
- In the event of a draw then the BSD with the best places will win i.e. a BSD with 2 1st places and a 2nd place will beat a BSD with 1 x 1st place and 2 x 2nd places.

Grade 1 competition: classes that will count towards the competition include 1, 8, 37 & 44

Grade 2 competition: classes that will count towards the competition include 2, 9, 38 & 45

Grade 3 competition: classes that will count towards the competition include 3, 10, 39 & 46

Grade 4 competition: classes that will count towards the competition include 4, 11, 40 & 47

Grade 5 competition: classes that will count towards the competition include 5, 12, 41 & 48

Grade 6 competition: classes that will count towards the competition include 6, 13, 42 & 49

Grade 7 competition: classes that will count towards the competition include 7, 14, 43 & 50

The Best Overall BSD winners of each standard will receive a Trophy
