## Eligibility & Schedule of Classes

**In accordance with Kennel Club Rules, all dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a Kennel Club licensed agility show.**

Only first prizes and points (clear rounds) gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

### **Grade 1 (Elementary)**

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

### **Grade 2 (Starters)**

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

### **Grade 3 (Graduate)**

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

### **Grade 4 (Novice)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

### **Grade 5 (Intermediate)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

### **Grade 6 (Senior)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

### **Grade 7 (Advanced)**

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

**Any Size** - Open to dogs **not** entered in any other class.

## CHAMPIONSHIP CLASS

Open to dogs having qualified to compete at grade 7 to consist of 2 qualifying rounds of Standard Kennel club Classes, 1 Agility Class and 1 Jumping Class and a final round of Agility to be held at the same Show.

Points will be awarded for placings in the Agility round and Jumping round. 1<sup>st</sup> place = 1 point, 2<sup>nd</sup> place = 2 points etc to the final placed dog, eliminated dogs excepted.

The top 50% of the entry up to a maximum of 20 dogs with the lowest accumulated total will be eligible to compete in the final round.

Elimination in either of the qualifying rounds will exclude the dog from competition in the final round.

In the event of a tie for the last place the time/faults will be taken into account for both qualifying rounds to determine the last qualifying place. The calculation to decide the equal place is:-

- (1) The dog with the least course faults in both the Agility and Jumping rounds. In the event that these dogs are still equal,
- (2) The dog with the fastest combined time qualifies.

Running Orders: A draw for the running order of the Agility and Jumping Rounds will be made prior to the show, which must be strictly adhered to. The relevant competitors will be notified before the day of the show.

## CRUFTS Singles Agility Competition

These competitions will be scheduled as a combined class for grades 6 & 7 for all height categories. There will be a separate qualifying competition for each height category.

There will be 10 separate heats for each height category, (small, medium, large) held at Kennel Club licensed shows, throughout the country.

The first 10 placed dogs in each heat will have the following points awarded:

1<sup>st</sup> place = 10 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> place = 9 points etc. down to 10<sup>th</sup> place = 1 point.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the final.

The 16 large dogs with the highest accumulation of points will be invited to compete in the CRUFTS Singles Large Agility Final at CRUFTS 2010.

The 10 medium dogs with the highest accumulation of points will be invited to compete in the CRUFTS Singles Medium Agility Final at CRUFTS 2010.

The 10 small dogs with the highest accumulation of points will be invited to compete in the CRUFTS Singles Small Agility Final at CRUFTS 2010.

## **CRUFTS Team Agility Competition**

**Crufts Teams Event** – only open to KC Registered Clubs.

This is an Agility competition and must include at least two items of contact equipment.

This is team relay event and a suitable baton should be used which must remain behind the start line at all times. When the dog-handler returns to the start/finish, there will be a baton change between the handlers. No part of the next dog/handler must be over the start line at the change over; failure to observe this will incur a penalty of twenty faults.

These competitions will be scheduled as a combined class for grades 1 to 7 for all height categories. There will be a separate qualifying competition for each height category.

The Show Secretary should record the top five placed teams and send the results to the Crufts Office at the Kennel Club within 14 days of the show. These results should include the name of the team, handlers, dogs and reserves.

Each team will consist of 4 dogs, with 4 handlers from the same height category.

The winners of each heat will be invited to CRUFTS 2010 to compete in the Small, Medium and Large Team Finals. In the event that the winning team or club in a heat has already qualified for the final then the highest placed unqualified team will be invited to the final at CRUFTS. Only dogs entered as a reserve at the qualifying event will be permitted to compete in the final should a change of dog be necessary.

This event is open to Kennel Club Registered Clubs with an interest in agility, all team members must be members of the club at the time of qualifying for the CRUFTS Teams Final.

Clubs may only qualify 1 (one) team in each height category for the final at CRUFTS 2010.

Once a handler or dog has run for a Kennel Club Registered Club in a CRUFTS Team Agility event they cannot run for another Kennel Club Registered Club in a CRUFTS Team Agility event at the same height category during the qualifying year.

## **Prizes**

***Championship class: Rosettes to 10% in the Jumping & Agility rounds, – Trophies to 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> place and rosettes to 4<sup>th</sup> place in the Final.***

***Small & Medium Team classes, Trophies to 1st place & rosettes to 3rd.***

***Any Size Jumping: Clear round rosettes only (to be collected on the day of the Show)***

***Clear round rosettes available in all classes (to be collected on the day of the show)***

## CAMPING

1. Camping spaces will not be reserved by the show management and you must park as directed by Stewards and within the marked out boundaries of the pitch.
2. Units must be parked with a minimum of a 20ft gap between the edges of each unit. Campers not complying WILL be asked to MOVE.
3. All caravans and tents must be equipped with a fire extinguisher/bucket of water.
4. Campers are responsible for keeping their area clean & tidy.
5. All rubbish should be put in the skips provided or taken home.
6. Showground MUST be vacated by Sunday PM.
7. Camping MAY BE LIMITED and priority will be given to HELPERS
8. NO BARBECUES OR OPEN AIR COOKING WITHIN THE SHOW GROUND

**Leave the M4 at Junction 13. Take the A34 to Oxford, first exit to Chieveley, turn right over bridge. The venue is approx. ¼ mile on the right.**

**Competitors not clearing up after their dogs will be asked to leave the show**

### **Dogs in hot cars**

Your dog is vulnerable and AT risk if left in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. ***If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.***

### **Welfare of dogs**

An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club Licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

## **SHOW REGULATIONS**

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club regulations for classification and registration B.
2. Entry fees: Non-members £2.80 per dog, Helping members £2.40 per dog, Pairs £5.60 per pair, Teams £11.20 per team, Championship Class £10.00. Camping: £18.00
3. There is no prize money offered at this show.
4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the Competitor.
6. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for entry in Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
7. Not for Competition entries free and will accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
8. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42
9. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
10. No person shall carry out punitive or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show, which includes the car park, camping and exercise area.
11. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half slip collar or lead when under test. A flat close fitting leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar (not attached by a ring)
12. Should a judge be unable to fulfil their appointment the Committee reserves to itself the right to appoint another Judge or Judges.
13. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
14. KC Regulation Standard Marking will apply.
15. Classes for Small dogs – those dogs eligible to compete are those measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers, Medium Dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and 430mm (1'5") or under at the withers, Large dogs – those measuring over 430mm (1'5") at the withers. All dogs must work in the height of class for which they have been measured.
16. Judges at an Agility Test may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership, or handle a dog at the Test at which they are judging.
17. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is:
  - a. A bitch which is in season
  - b. Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease
  - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
  - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
  - e. Like to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing
18. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant fees.
19. Should circumstances so dictate, the Club, in conjunction with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary - such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the Directors and the Secretary of the Limited Company will jointly be considered as the competitor for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to The Kennel Club before Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
20. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except a guide dog for the blind or hearing dog for the deaf, or dogs required for educational purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
21. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees. Internet entries via [www.ishowservices.com](http://www.ishowservices.com) will be accepted.
22. All dogs will be entered at this Show at their owners risk and whilst every care will be taken the Committee will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property while at the Show.
23. If circumstances make it necessary that the Competition is cancelled, the Agility Club reserve the right to defray expenses incurred by deducting such expenses from the entry fees received.
24. The owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
25. Incorrect entries or those using incorrectly downloaded entry forms will be returned.
26. Overseas competitors should ensure that cheques are drawn on a British Bank and are in sterling.
27. Returned/Referred cheques will be surcharged at £10 each to cover bank costs.
