HELPERS

Your help is needed. We are a small team organising this show and we would be very pleased to receive offers of help. If your club or group can completely run a ring on the day, please let us know ASAP (email to Axstane@live.co.uk). Axstane will pay £60 and provide up to ten buffet lunches in our marquee. We will need the name of your group and the names of the individuals, to avoid double counting.

If you are not part of a group, but can still help out as an individual, please also let us know your preferred time (Saturday or Sunday plus am / pm / both and preferred job(s) . If you help for a full day you will be provided with a buffet lunch in our marquee. If you help for half a day you will receive a lunch voucher.

ELIGIBILITY & DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In accordance with KC Rules, large dogs who have not competed before 1st January 2006 & ALL Small & Medium dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a KC licensed Agility show.

SMALL CLASSES: Only open to dogs which measure 35cm or less at the withers.

MEDIUM CLASSES: Only open to dogs which measure over 35cm but 43cm or under at the withers.

LARGE CLASSES: Only open to dogs which measure over 43cm at the withers.

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary) For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starters) Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate) Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice) Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate) Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior) Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced) Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows. 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not jumping) Classes.

MEMORIAL HELPERS CLASS (Special): Open to all that have agreed to help at the show by prearrangement (and have helped), either as ring parties or individually entered on the entry form. Open to all sizes of dog. All entry fees will be donated to Kent Air Ambulance. Also perpetual Trophy for the winner of this class.

TUNNEL & JUMPING CLASSES (Special): Open to all. These classes will only consist of tunnels and jumps.

EUKANUBA MINI AGILITY CHALLENGE

RULES

This is a competition consisting of eight heats of agility. It is open to mini dogs, known as small dogs, who measure 35cm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers and will be a combined class of grades 1 to 7.

Competitors will score 20 points for 1st place down to 1 point for 20th place. Points will be accumulated over all eight heats and the 20 dogs with the most points will qualify for the final.

In the event of a tie, leading to more than 20 dogs being in qualifying positions, the dog/s considered most consistent overall will then qualify.

Competitors may enter as many dogs as they like in the heats but can only qualify a maximum of two dogs for the final.

The final consists of two rounds of agility competitions known as Part 1 and Part 2. The winner of the Challenge will be the dog and handler with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final.

The competition will be held under K.C. rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these.

K.C. standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum height/length stated for small dogs.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats who has not qualified.

AWARDS

Rosettes will be provided to 20th place with trophies and a 3kg bag of Eukanuba Performance to 3rd. Clear round rosettes will also be provided.

EUKANUBA MINI/MIXI PAIRS CHALLENGE

RULES

This is a competition consisting of eight heats of jumping. It is a relay competition with a baton change taking place either in a box or behind a line at the judges discretion. The competition is open to mini dogs, known as small dogs, partnering either a midi dog (medium dog) or a maxi dog (large dog) and will be a combined class of grades 1 to 7.

Points will be awarded to the pair, which consists of the same two handlers and dog combinations. Points are not transferable between different pair combinations.

Pairs will score 15 points for 1st place down to 1 point for 15th place. Points will be accumulated over all eight heats and the 15 pairs with the most points will go through to the final.

Handlers with more than one dog may enter in more than one pair. However, they may only qualify a maximum of two dogs for the final. The pairs with the most points attained first will qualify for the final. No surrogate handlers will be allowed in the final.

The winner of the Mini/Mixi Pairs Challenge will be the pair with the fastest time with the least faults.

The competition is open to two dogs with separate handlers. One dog must be a mini (small) dog, 35cm or under at the withers, the partner can be either a midi (medium) dog, over 35cm but 43cm or under at the withers, or a maxi (large) dog, over 43cm in height.

Should a qualified dog or handler within a pair be unable/unfit to enter the final, reserves will be taken from the pair with the highest points who have not qualified.

The competition will be held under K.C. rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to abide by these rules and regulations.

K.C. standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum height for each category.

The competition will involve a change of height of the obstacles being jumped by the midi/maxi dogs at one stage during the class. The judge will decide which height of jump to start with and will announce the change of height when relevant. It is the competitors responsibility to be available accordingly. The course will be walked by everyone before the beginning of the class.

AWARDS

Rosettes will be provided to 15th place with trophies and a 3kg bag of Eukanuba Performance to 3rd. Clear round rosettes will also be provided.

EUKANUBA MINI CIRCULAR KNOCK-OUT

RULES

There will be eight heats of the Mini Circular Knock-out and the first four places in each will qualify for the final. The competition is open to mini dogs, known as small dogs, measuring 35cm or under at the withers and will be a combined class of grades 1 to 7.

A draw will be made for each heat.

Competitors may enter more than one dog for each heat but may only qualify one dog for the final. Their first dog to qualify will be invited to the final. Once qualified a handler may not enter any further heats.

The competitor to go through to the next round will be the first to finish with the least number of faults.

This is a circular knock-out and in the interest of safety there will be no collapsible tunnel, dog walk or see-saw.

The course will contain weaving poles.

Dogs will start and finish from a line in the middle of the circle. Equipment may be used on this line although in the interest of safety it must be off-set so that the dogs are not running at each other when finishing.

The competition will be held under K.C. rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entered will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations.

K.C. standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum size stated for small dogs.

It is the competitors responsibility to book in at the show if necessary and also to be at the ring when needed.

Should a faster dog catch up with the other dog, the slower dog **MUST** stand clear to allow the faster dog to pass it by.

It is the handlers responsibility to ensure that any dogs that are likely to be aggressive on a circular course where they are competing with another dog and may pass or be passed by another dog should **NOT** be entered. Any dog displaying any kind of aggressive behaviour on the course **WILL BE ELIMINATED IMMEDIATELY.**

False start ruling will be made at the judges discretion.

AWARDS

Rosettes will be provided to 16th place with trophies and a 3kg bag of Eukanuba Performance to the first four places.

OLYMPIA AGILITY STAKES REGULATIONS 2009

All events must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Regulations H & H(1) in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering any competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these regulations.

All heats must take place at Kennel Club licensed shows and the class name in the schedule should replicate exactly the name of the competition as stated in these regulations.

All Kennel Club supported competitions should be judged using standard marking.

If the entry for the heat exceeds the Kennel Club limit for a judge in a day, then the class will be equally split and another judge appointed for the second part. Qualifiers and reserves from that heat will be taken in equal proportion from each part, giving the total number originally required from that heat. Rosettes and awards remain unchanged if the heat is split.

Dogs entered in any heats must be eligible for the competition entered and judges retain the right to check the height of any dog or ask to see the height stated in the Kennel Club Record Book.

Competitors can qualify for **any Olympia final** but it must be with different dogs. The first final a handler qualifies a dog for will be the final that particular dog competes in at Olympia

(These rules would be amended if any changes are made to Kennel Club agility regulations during the course of the competition year).

THE KENNEL CLUB OLYMPIA MEDIUM DOG AGILITY STAKES

Supported by Premier Agility Equipment

This competition will be classified as **combined Grades 1 to 7** and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the semi-finals. Handlers may only qualify one dog for the final which will be the highest placed dog at the semi-final. Once a dog has qualified for the semi-final/final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi finals

The first two placed dogs will be invited from each heat to compete in the semi-finals which will be held at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival. The first ten highest placed dogs at the semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be held at Olympia.

Those dogs eligible to compete in Medium dog competitions are those measuring over 350 mm (1 foot 1¾ inches) and those measuring 430 mm (1 foot 5 inches) or under at the withers and eligible to compete in combined Grades 1 to 7 for Medium dogs.

NATURALLY DOGS ALLSORTS JUMPING

This class is open to any dog not entered in any other class at this show. It is intended as a fun class for older dogs, new dogs and 'don't fit anywhere else' dogs, so that all our dogs may enjoy agility shows. The class should be scheduled as follows:

- a) Jump heights will be 25cms, long jump (if used) will be maximum 2 units.
- b) Jump heights will be 35cms, long jump (if used) will be maximum 3 units.
- c) Jump heights will be 45cms, long jump (if used) will be maximum 4 units.

There will be no tyre or weaves in this class. Everyone will compete for a single set of awards.

The handler may choose which height is best for their dog, regardless of their dog's size, by stating a, b or c on their entry form.

CELEBRATION CONNECTION LARGE DOG STAKES RULES

N.B. These rules also apply to the Small and the Medium Celebration Connection classes WHICH ARE NOT QUALIFIERS

The first 4 places from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat, but may only qualify one dog for the final. The first dog that a handler qualifies with will run in the final. Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition providing they are eligible.

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this fact.

No Tyre or Dogwalk will be used in this class.

Objective

Gain as many points as possible (max 32) in the given course time (set by judge).
Then stop the timing in the quickest time

How

Complete 3 different jumps successfully then a bonus obstacles, until all 4 bonus obstacles have been attempted or you run out of time.

Rules for obstacle placement

1. Tyre and Dogwalk **must not** be used
2. Connecting Jumps: min 6, max 9 (excluding judge's bonus).
3. Connecting jumps must be placed within the 4 bonus obstacles.
4. Connecting jumps must not be a spread jump.
5. Only one bonus obstacle may be placed on each side of the ring.
6. Bonus obstacle (1) weaves.
7. Bonus obstacle (2) jump + see saw (jump must be aligned straight on to see saw).
8. Bonus obstacle (3) the A frame.
9. Bonus obstacle (4) is a combination invented by the judge containing 1, 2, or 3 obstacles.
The judge may stipulate in which order obstacles are taken. Spreads may be used but only jumped in the correct direction.
10. Start and finish obstacles are for timing only and will not count. (They may or may not be the same obstacle; jump, tunnel or table)
11. The start and finish can be inside the bonus obstacles, timing permitting.
12. In the event of the whistle sounding when a dog is committed to an obstacle or within a bonus section the points will be award upon successful completion.

Points

Jumps 1 point
Bonus 5 points each

Course time

Set by judge

Rules for competitors

1. The Dog must start the timing.
2. In the event of the dog running past the start obstacle you must put your dog directly back over the start obstacle without touching or re setting up (this may be done in either direction).
3. The start obstacle does not count if knocked down.
4. Refusals on jumps will not be marked.
5. Refusals on bonus obstacles will count as a bonus failure
6. Refusals on weave pole entry or faults during the weaves count as a bonus failure.
7. Missed contacts will count as a bonus failure.
8. Faults in the judge's bonus will also count as a bonus failure.
9. 3 different jumps must be completed correctly before attempting a bonus.
10. After attempting a bonus the same jumps may be used again.
11. Bonuses may be taken in any order provided they are preceded by 3 correctly completed jumps.
12. Jumps may be taken from either side.
13. Jump numbers are for identification only.
14. Each bonus may only be attempted once (a failed bonus counts as an attempt).
15. The dog must stop the timing after either successfully completing the 4 bonuses or when the time limit is reached, indicated by a whistle blowing (whichever comes first).
16. The dog must also stop the timing when a round is ended due to elimination (indicated by a whistle blowing).
17. The round will end when the timing is stopped.
18. Fallen jumps will not be replaced.

Elimination

When eliminated, dogs must leave the ring via the finish obstacle as quickly as possible to gain a time. Failure to do so will result in no score being recorded. Obstacles taken on the way to the finish will not be faulted or counted.

Eliminations will result in the following cases

1. Touching a bonus obstacle before completing 3 jumps correctly.
2. Jumping 4 jumps in succession.
3. Touching the same bonus twice.
4. Only 2 jumps left standing.
5. Jumping a spread obstacle the wrong way.
6. Touching a bonus obstacle or jump or jumping an obstacle before starting the time.
7. Jumping the same jump twice in a connection of 3 without doing a bonus.

Note: taking the judge's bonus obstacles in the wrong order or direction will not result in elimination, but no bonus points will be awarded (spread jump excepted).

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF AXSTANE AGILITY CLUB.

1. Dogs must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The Registration Number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. The entry fees are shown on the front page of the schedule. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
3. Puppies under 18 months of age on the 20th or 21st June 2009 (respectively) are not eligible for Competition.
4. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
5. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the Show boundaries.
6. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half slip collar or lead when under test. A flat close fitting leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
7. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge(s).

8. Marking will be in accordance with KC Regulations H, annex B.
9. A Judge at the Show can neither compete nor enter for competition a dog in their ownership.
10. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition & removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a) a bitch in season.
 - b) suffering from an infectious or contagious disease.
 - c) interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d) of such a temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal; or
 - e) likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
11. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (26 May) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
12. Precinct of the show extends to all areas of the showground.
13. All dogs must be under control and are the responsibility of the accompanying handler.
14. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance.
15. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove, as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at the event and within the environs of the event.
16. Axstane Agility Club Committee reserves to itself the right to;
 - a) refuse entries.
 - b) appoint another judge should any scheduled judge be unable to fulfil their appointment.
 - c) accept no responsibility for losses, damage, injuries or errors arising from any cause whatsoever or for exhibitors missing their classes.
 - d) alter arrangements as necessary in consultation with the judges should circumstances dictate. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
 - e) Defray from the received entry fees, such expenses as are necessary to cover the cost of Show preparation should it be necessary to abandon the Show due to circumstances beyond their control..
17. Refer to the front cover for details of the Show sponsors.
18. Dogs must at the time of entry for competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
19. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
20. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
21. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
22. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.

24. **NO EXERCISING OF DOGS ALLOWED ON FOOTBALL PLAYING FIELDS. COMPETITORS FAILING TO ADHERE TO THIS RULE WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE SHOW.**
