AWARDS

Rosettes to 10% of entry and Clear Round Rosettes in all classes.

Trophies to 3rd place in all classes

ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes (A dog is only eligible for one grade)

Progression. Progression from each grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from grade 6 will require 4 wins at grade 6, two of which must be Agility classes. Results from combined classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade

Points progression. At the Handlers Discretion a dog may progress up to grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation k3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points.

If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility record book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Grade 1 (ELEMENTARY) For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at kennel club licensed agility shows. N.B. *OWNERS, HANDLERS OR DOGS PREVIOUSLY QUALIFIED OUT OF GRADE 1 (ELEMENTARY) ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR THIS CLASS*

Grade 2 (STARTERS) For owners, handlers or dogs which have qualified out of grade 1 but have not gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at grade 2 or have elected to progress on points from grade 1 at kennel club licensed agility shows .. N.B. *OWNERS ,HANDLERS OR DOGS PREVIOUSLY QUALIFIED OUT OF GRADE 2 (STARTERS) ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR THIS CLASS*

Grade 3 (GRADUATE) Open to dogs which are not eligible for grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from grade 2 at kennel club licensed agility shows and dogs which are not eligible for grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (NOVICE) Open to dogs having which have gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at grade 3 or elected to progress from grade 3 at kennel club licensed agility shows and dogs which are not eligible for grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (INTERMEDIATE) Open to dogs having which have gained a first place in an agility class or three first places in jumping classes at grade 4 or elected to progress from grade 4 at kennel club licensed agility shows and dogs which are not eligible for grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (SENIOR) Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an agility class or three first places at grade 5 at kennel club licensed agility shows and dogs which are not eligible for grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (ADVANCED) Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at grade 6 at kennel club licensed agility shows, 2 first places must be gained in agility(not jumping) classes

Special Any size Jumping Open to all sizes of dogs not entered in any other class in this show except for the Special Pairs class. Large and Medium dogs jump height 350mm Small dogs jump height 250mm or less. There will be no weaves or tyre in this class

Special Veterans Jumping Open to all dogs over the age of 9 years not entered in any other class in this show except for the Special Pairs class. Large dogs jump height 450mm Medium dogs jump height 350mm Small dogs jump height 250mm or less. There will be no tyre in this class.

Dogs entered in Special Veterans Jumping may also enter Special Any Size Jumping.

A Combined class is open to more than one grade and there is only one set of results for the whole class

CAMPING

Camping is available, Friday and Saturday @ £8.50 per night.

Additional nights may be available on request.

All caravan and camping units must have means of extinguishing fire.

THERE WILL BE NO ACCESS TO THE SHOWGROUND BEFORE

12.00 ON FRIDAY 10TH JULY (unless by prior arrangement)

Clean up after your dogs and remember your torch for when it's dark.

(Competitors failing to comply will be asked to leave the Venue – as per Regulation 31).

RULES AND REGULATIONS *(Please note the word dog also means bitch)*

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry. The registration is required on each entry (see rule 4).
2. Dogs entered in incorrect classes will be automatically put in the lowest appropriate class. Dogs may only be entered in three classes (Veterans and Any Size Dogs in two classes). No refunds will be given. Entry fee is £2.50 per dog per class (£1.00 for CAC members). No refunds will be made for incorrect payments.
3. The show management reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
4. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the competition can be made. All overseas entries made without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/Competitor.
5. Puppies under eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the precincts of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a Judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another Judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
13. Kennel Club Standard Marking Regulations will apply.
14. The maximum height of jump obstacles will be as follows: Large dogs 650mm (2ft 1.6ins), Medium dogs 450mm (1ft 5.7ins) and small dogs 350mm (1ft 1.75ins).
15. **Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for Large dogs are those measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.**
16. **Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for Medium dogs are those measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.7ins) and 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.**
17. **Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for Small dogs are those measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.**
18. A Judge at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in his or her ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.
19. Withdrawal of dogs from competition: A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Show if it is:-
 - a) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
 - b) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - c) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues to compete.
20. Handlers working more than one dog in a Class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
21. The Show management will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the Show.
22. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the date of the show i.e. up to and including 16th June 2009 shall be counted when entering for any class. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade.
23. It is the responsibility of the competitors to be available for their class and running order.
24. Should circumstances so dictate, the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them shall be reported to the Kennel Club.
25. No dog suffering from any infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing this Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
26. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show management, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control
27. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the Directors and the Secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered as the competitor for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owners' property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
28. In the event of abandonment of the Show through circumstances beyond their control, the Committee may defray such expenses from the entry fees to cover the cost of the Show preparations.
29. Training will not be permitted before, during or after the Show in the ring.
30. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner and acceptance of the entry declaration must be given in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entries will not be accepted without the correct fees or acceptance of the entry declaration. Entries will only be accepted on Cornwall Agility Club official Entry Forms (or photocopies). Entries submitted on any other Form will be returned.
31. If you fail to clean up after your dogs, you will be asked to leave the venue.
32. There is no prize money.
33. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
34. Dogs will be limited to three classes on the day (plus a pay on the day if time allows) except for Veterans and Any Size Dogs who will be limited to two classes on the day (plus a pay on the day if time allows).
35. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
36. A briefing will be held prior to each class when competitors will be allowed to walk the course without their dogs. No pushchairs or prams will be allowed in the rings.
37. No cycling will be permitted around the area of the rings when competitions are taking place.
38. No smoking will be permitted in or around any of the tented areas on the showground.
39. Pay on the Day classes may be run if time permits. Only dogs competing at the show may enter a Pay on the Day class.
40. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Remedial action will be taken in the event of dogs left in cars being found in a distressed condition.
