### COMPETITORS MAY ENTER A MAXIMUM OF (4) CLASSES PER DOG

Combined classes are scheduled for the grades stated with one overall set of results for the whole class.  
Graded classes are scheduled for one or more grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade.

**NB: Classes may be split and additional Judges maybe appointed should entries warrant**

#### PRIZES:

**Trophies:** Up to 20 entries – trophies to 1<sup>st</sup>, up to 50 entries - trophies to 2<sup>nd</sup>, over 50 entries trophies to 3<sup>rd</sup>

**Rosettes:** Placed rosettes to at least 10% of class entries

**Unplaced clear round rosettes in all classes with the exception of classes 11, 12, 19 & 25**

**Tuff Stuff leads will be awarded to all four qualifying places in the Celebration heats: classes 11 & 12**

**Classes 19 & 25 are sponsored by Easter Celebration but are NOT qualifiers:**

**Tuff Stuff leads will be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in classes 19 & 25**

**Best BSD Trophy in class 13 Large ABC Agility for the best Grade 3 BSD

**PAY ON THE DAY class(es) or a Practise ring may be run if time permits.  
Only open to dogs entered in the show.**

**PLEASE NOTE : There is NO Measuring at this show**



## **ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES**

In accordance with KC rules, large dogs that have not competed before 1<sup>st</sup> January 2006 & ALL Small and Medium dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a KC licensed agility show.

## **PROGRESSION**

Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

## **POINTS PROGRESSION**

At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant point's scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

## **HEIGHT CLASSIFICATION OF DOGS**

Small Dogs: for dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers

Medium Dogs: for dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers

Large Dogs: for dogs measuring over 430mm at the withers.

## **STANDARD CLASSES**

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

**Grade 1 (Elementary)** - For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

**Grade 2 (Starters)** – Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are eligible for this class.*

**Grade 3 (Graduate)** - Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

**Grade 4 (Novice)** - Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

**Grade 5 (Intermediate)** - Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

**Grade 6 (Senior)** - Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

**Grade 7 (Advanced)** - Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

## **SPECIAL CLASSES**

**A.B.C Agility Qualifier (SPECIAL CLASS):** Open to all large dogs excluding border collies, working sheepdogs and their crosses. In the event of dispute, the judge's decision will be final - **FULL SET OF RULES ATTACHED**

**ANYSIZE JUMPING (SPECIAL CLASS):** Open to all dogs (irrespective of size) that are not entered in any other class at this show on either day. Jump height will be 350mm. There will be no Long Jump, Weaves or Tyre.

**CELEBRATION LARGE DOG ADVANCED POWER AND SPEED (SPECIAL CLASS):** This class is only open for dogs eligible for Grade 7 Advanced competition.

Handlers may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the final. Once a dog has qualified for the final further heats may be entered for competition.

The first 4 places from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this fact.

The first section of the course will contain all the contact equipment plus the weaving poles, two rising spread jumps at maximum width and height, and the long jump at maximum length.

This first section need not be timed, but this is at the judge's discretion. It is recommended that a generous maximum time be applied.

The second section of the course will consist only of single pole hurdles, and will be against the clock. The object of the class is for the dog to negotiate the first part of the course clear, before proceeding across the start line to commence the second section of the course, which should be set as a fast speed jumping course.

## **NOTE**

Only dogs that are clear on the first section can attempt the second section. Normal judging rules apply except that on the first section, handlers may line up their dogs before taking any obstacle without penalty. The winner will be decided in the usual way of the fastest time with the least faults.

It is advisable for judges to note that the original intention was for the jumping part of the course to be fast and free flowing to produce an exciting finish

## **CELEBRATION CONNECTION LARGE DOG STAKES (SPECIAL CLASS) – FULL SET OF RULE ATTACHED**

**NB:** These rules also apply to the small and medium CELEBRATION CONNECTION classes (19 & 25) which are not qualifiers

The first 4 places from each heat will be invited to compete in the final. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a Heat, but may only qualify one dog for the final. The first dog that a handler qualifies with will run in the final. Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition providing they are eligible.

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this Fact.

**Objective:** Gain as many points as possible (**max 32**) in the given course time (set by judge).  
Then stop the timing in the quickest time

**How:** Complete 3 different jump's successfully then a bonus obstacles. Until all 4 bonus's have been attempted or you run out of time.



## NEWTON HEATH D.T.C

### The Kennel Club Olympia ABC Agility Stakes\*

#### 2009/2010 RULES

\*ABC Agility Rules are copyright of Newton Heath DTC.

- 1 The Kennel Club Olympia ABC Agility Stakes is a special agility competition to be run under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations H for Large dogs.
- 2 The competition is open to all dogs (grades 1 – 7) excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses.
- 3 The first **four** dogs of each heat will be invited to attend the semi-final. The next best placed dogs at a heat will be deemed to be reserves should a qualified dog be unable to attend the semi-final. Reserves from heats will be invited to attend the semi-final up to and including the closing date of the NHDTC Show June Show. After the closing date NO reserves will be called even if other qualifiers have to retire / withdraw.
- 4 Dogs that have already qualified for the semi-final may enter further heats for competition.
- 5 Those dogs eligible to compete in the semi-final shall be the four best-placed dogs in each heat that have not previously qualified.
- 6 A handler may qualify more than one dog for the semi-final but may only compete with one dog at the final.
- 7 The semi-final will be held at the annual Newton Heath DTC agility show held in June. The final to be held at Olympia in December. Any alteration will be publicised.
- 8 Owners, handlers and dogs who enter the heats or attend the semi-final will be deemed to have accepted the Rules and Regulations of the competition and the organising show.
- 9 The organisers, Newton Heath DTC and the Kennel Club, in agreement, reserve the right to alter these Rules and Regulations at their discretion.



#### FULL RULES FOR CELEBRATION CONNECTION LARGE DOG STAKES Qualifier

**NB:** These rules also apply to the small and medium CELEBRATION CONNECTION classes which are not qualifiers (classes 20 & 26)

This event must be classified as Grades 6 and 7 at least. Grades 3, 4, or 5 may be added at the secretary's discretion according to the anticipated entry.

The first 4 places from each heat will be invited to compete in the final. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a Heat, but may only qualify one dog for the final. The first dog that a handler qualifies with will run in the final. Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition providing they are eligible.

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this Fact.

**No Tyre or Dogwalk will be used in this class.** A full set of rules can be found at <http://www.ward-agilitydogs.me.uk/easter/> A copy is also held with the secretary

**Objective:** Gain as many points as possible (**max 32**) in the given course time (set by judge).  
Then stop the timing in the quickest time

**How:** Complete 3 different jump's successfully then a bonus obstacles. Until all 4 bonus's have been attempted or you run out of time.

#### Rules for obstacle placement

1. Tyre and Dogwalk must not be used
2. Connecting Jumps: min 6, max 9 (excluding judges bonus)
3. Connecting jumps must be place within the 4 bonus obstacles
4. Connecting jumps must not be a spread jump
5. Only one bonus obstacle may be placed on each side of the ring
6. Bonus obstacle ( 1 ) weaves
7. Bonus obstacle ( 2 ) jump + see saw ( jump must be aligned straight on to see saw )
8. Bonus obstacle ( 3 ) the A frame
9. Bonus obstacle ( 4 ) is a combination invented by the judge containing 1, 2, or 3 obstacles. The judge may stipulate in which order obstacles are taken. Spreads may be used but only jumped in the correct direction
10. Start and finish obstacles are for timing only and will not count. ( they may or may not be the same obstacle. Jump, tunnel or table)
11. the start and finish can be inside the bonus obstacles, timing permitting
12. In the event of the whistle sounding when a dogs in committed to an obstacle or within a bonus section the points will be award upon successful completion
13. Judges will need a scribe and a timer as per the old Gamblers and 2 whistles

#### Points

Jumps 1 point  
Bonus 5 points each

#### Course time

Set by judge

### Rule for competitors

1. The Dog must start the timing.
2. In the event of the dog running past the start obstacle you must put your dog directly back over the start obstacle without touch or re setting up (this may be done in either direction).
3. The start obstacle does not count if knocked down.
4. Refusals on jumps will not be marked
5. Refusal on bonus obstacles will count as a bonus failure
6. Refusal on Weaves pole entry or faults during the weaves count as a bonus failure
7. Missed contact will counts as a bonus failure
8. Faults in the judge's bonus will also count as a bonus failure.
9. 3 different jumps must be completed correctly before attempting a bonus
10. After attempting a bonus the same jumps may be used again
11. Bonus's may be taken in any order provided they are preceded by 3 correctly completed jumps
12. Jumps may be taken from either side
13. Jump numbers are for identification only
14. Each bonus may only be attempted once (a failed bonus counts as an attempt)
15. The dog must stop the timing after either successfully completing the 4 bonus's or when the time limit is reached, indicated by a whistle blowing (whichever comes first)
16. The dog must also stop the timing when a round in ended due to elimination (indicated by a whistle blowing)
17. The round will end when the timing is stopped
18. Fallen jumps will not be replaced

### Elimination

When eliminated dogs must leave the ring via the finish obstacle as quick as possible to gain a time. Failure to do so will result in no score being recorded.

Obstacles taken on the way to the finish will not be faulted or counted.

### Eliminations will result in the following cases

1. Touching a bonus obstacle before completing 3 jumps correctly
2. Jumping 4 jumps in succession
4. Touching the same bonus twice
5. Only 2 jumps left standing
6. Jumping a spread obstacle the wrong way
7. Touching a bonus obstacle or jump or jumping an obstacle before starting the time
8. Jumping the same jump twice in a connection of 3 without doing a bonus

Note: taking the judges bonus obstacles in the wrong order or direction will not result in elimination, but no bonus points will be awarded. (spread jump excepted ).

## **SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees are as detailed on the Entry Form. No refunds will be given after the closing date under any circumstances.
3. Prizes – no monetary prizes are on offer. Awards for each class are listed in the awards section of the schedule.
4. The Dartford DTC Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows
6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. No bitch in season is allowed to compete. . The mating of bitches within the precinct of the show is forbidden.
8. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
9. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
10. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
11. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges. The judge's decision will be final; no competitor will be allowed to influence that in any way, and the show committee will stand by the judge's decision in all cases.
12. Sponsors for the show are listed on the schedule
13. Kennel Club standard marking Regulations will apply as published in the Kennel Club Yearbook in use at the time of the show, including any amendments introduced by the Kennel Club.
14. The height limits for dogs are:
  - a. Large dogs – for dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers
  - b. Medium dogs – for dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers
  - c. Small dogs – for dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
15. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog that is recorded in their ownership or part ownership, or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.
16. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is:-
  - a. A bitch which is in season.
  - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
  - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
  - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
17. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriated class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees. All wins up to and including Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2009 shall be counted when entering for any class.
18. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
19. Dogs must at the time of entry for competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
20. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the Show Society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
21. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
22. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
23. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
24. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
25. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
26. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees
27. Dogs will not be received for competition after the class has been declared closed.
28. Please clean up after your dog and place in bins provided. Anyone knowingly not doing so may be asked to leave the venue and will forfeit any remaining class entries.
29. In the event of abandonment of the Show through circumstances beyond our control, the organising group may defray such expenses as necessary from the entry fees to cover the cost of the Show preparation.
30. No refunds due to incorrect entries, or requests for special running orders, will be entertained.
31. All competitors who enter any special classes agree to the rules as defined in the schedule by Dartford DTC
32. Classes may be split if entries warrant. In the event of a class being split, it is the competitor's responsibility to work a dog in the correct part. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.
33. Competitors must follow the stewards' instructions with regard to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries.
34. Goods may NOT be sold within the precincts of the show without prior permission of Dartford DTC
35. Rosettes and Trophies can only be collected on the day of the show and will NOT be forwarded.
36. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
37. All dogs are entered at the show at the owner's risk and, whilst every care will be taken, the committee will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury, however caused, to dogs, persons or property at the show.
38. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so

may result in elimination  
39. Entries are limited to four runs per dog. Dogs entered in more than four classes will have classes deducted at Dartford DTC discretion.
