## CLASSIFICATION OF CLASSES

**NOTE** All small and medium dogs must have been measured prior to competition.  
Any large dog that has not competed before January 2006 must be measured prior to competition..

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one and not an accumulation of dogs.

**Grade 1** For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

**Grade 2** Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 ( Starters) are not eligible for this class.

**Grade 3** Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6, or 7

**Grade 4** Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

**Grade 5** Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

**Grade 6** Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

**Grade 7** Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
2. Entry fees £2.50 per dog per class. Helping GVDTC members £1.80 per dog per class. Pairs - £5.00 per pair. Class 26 £10.00 per team of five dogs and Class 51 £10.00 per team of four dogs.
3. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
4. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
5. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
6. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
7. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
8. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
9. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
10. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
11. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
12. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply.
13. The heights of the jump obstacles are Large 550 mm. to 650 mm. Medium 350 mm. to 450 mm. Small 250 mm. to 350 mm. *See Rule 38 for ANY SIZE Jumping*
14. The Height limit for dogs.
  - a) Large Dogs – For dogs measuring over 430 mm at the withers.
  - b) Medium Dogs – For dogs measuring over 350 mm and measuring 430 mm or under at the withers.
  - c) Small Dogs - For dogs measuring 350 mm or under at the withers.
15. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership, or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.

16. Withdrawal of dogs from Show  
A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is –
- A bitch which is in season
  - Suffering from any infectious disease or contagious disease.
  - Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
  - Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
17. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitors responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
18. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order. The latest time up to which they will be able to compete will be at the judges discretion.
19. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
20. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
21. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for.) In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owners' property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
22. No animal other than the one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
23. All dogs are entered at their owners' risk, and whilst taking every care the Committee cannot be held responsible for any damage, loss or injury caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the Show.
24. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
25. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
26. Separate entry forms must be completed by each competitor and must be signed by the competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees. Internet entries via [www.ishowservices.com](http://www.ishowservices.com) will be accepted.
27. The Committee reserves to itself the right to defray any costs from the entry fees should the event have to be cancelled or abandoned.
28. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
29. No practice will be allowed before, during or after the Show and no dogs will be allowed in the ring at any time other than when being judged.
30. In all matters concerning the competition the judge's decision will be final, in all other matters the decision of the Show organisers will be final.
31. Any alteration to this schedule will be published in the relevant canine press and this will be deemed sufficient notice.
32. **THE AGILITY CLUB STARTER'S AGILITY CHALLENGE – Qualifying Heat**  
**The Final will be held at the Agility Club Show in July 2010**
- Heats are for LARGE, MEDIUM & SMALL dogs and are open to all eligible Grade 1 & Grade 2 dogs. but only Agility Club Members at the time of competing can qualify for the final.
  - Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat but may only qualify one dog for each height Final.
  - Qualifiers may enter further Heats for competition providing they are eligible. Handlers who gain a place with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show.
  - The first two dogs from each heat will qualify for the final. In the event of someone qualifying more than once for the final, reserves will be taken from the appropriate heats.



**33. YKC TEAM AGILITY – Final to be held at Crufts 2010**

- a) Teams must represent a KC club or group of clubs. All teams should consist of 5 dogs handled by 5 separate members. The five handlers may be from different clubs.
- b) Handlers may compete in more than one team from the same club/s but must handle a different dog in each team. Once a handler has qualified, he/she may not compete for a different team for the same year.
- c) Handlers must be YKC members. They may handle any KC registered dog, providing that another person is not handling the dog at Crufts.
- d) Handlers must be 6 – 17 years on the day of the competition. One team member may be between 18 – 25 years.
- e) A team may consist of mixed height dogs, each dog to compete over standard height equipment for its classification.
- f) The first team from each heat will qualify.
- g) In the event of only one team entering a heat, that team will run in the heat and providing that no more than two dogs are eliminated will qualify
- h) The course, set by the judge, will contain at least two pieces of contact equipment. Each dog will be individual timed (not relay), standard marking will apply and should elimination occur, scoring will continue with 50 faults for each elimination added to the final score. The combined score/time of the best 4 out of 5 dogs in the team will decide the results.
- i) A judge may alter the running order of the dogs within a team depending on the height mix.
- j) Once a team has qualified the dogs and handlers should remain as per entry form. Special permission to substitute will be required in writing from the YKC.

**34. FIRST CONTACT STARTERS AGILITY - Qualifying heat.**

- a) All qualifying heats will be agility classes for large size, Grade 1 & Grade 2 dogs.
- b) The top five places in the class (not split) will qualify for the final.
- c) If the heat is split the top three dogs from each part will qualify for the final
- d) Once a dog has qualified for the final, it will still be allowed to run for competition in further heats if it is still eligible for starters competitions. However if a dog that has already qualified, qualifies again, the qualifying place will go to the next highest placed dog that has not qualified.
- e) Handlers may qualify more than one dog for the final.
- f) **The Final** will be held on Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> August 2009 at the DOG VEGAS SHOW, The Winterton Show Ground, Lincolnshire
- g) All unplaced finalists will receive a special finalist rosette.
- h) The top ten places will receive a placing rosette.
- i) The top three places will receive a trophy.
- j) The overall winner will receive a £100 voucher for Agility and Flyball Equipment.



**35. ALPHA AGILITY CHALLENGE 2009 - Qualifying heat**

- a) 8 qualifying heats producing 40 finalists who compete at an Alpha Agility Challenge Grand Final to be held on Sunday 30 August 2009 at Stoneleigh Park Country Festival, Stoneleigh Park, Warwickshire, CV8 2LD.
- b) Once a dog has qualified (i.e. 5 finalists per heat) this eliminates the dog from taking a further finalist place and the next highest placed dog(s) in the Alpha Agility Challenge class will be invited to the final.
- c) Handlers may not qualify more than one dog for the Alpha Agility Challenge final.
- d) Any surrogate handlers must be notified in writing within 4 days of the last heat.
- e) NO amendments after this date and non-advice will disqualify the partnership.



The food of champions

**36. the team dash – Qualifying heat**

- a) An Open Special competition for teams of four dogs and handlers (four large, four medium or four small dogs) run as a relay over a simple jumping course.
- b) There will be ten qualifying heats. Two top teams from each heat regardless of height will qualify for a final at DASHIN' DOGS SUMMER SHOW in August 2009. Once qualified neither handlers nor dogs may compete in the remaining heats for the season except as NFC

**37. CIRCULAR JUMPING - The course for CIRCULAR JUMPING will be at the Judges discretion.**

**38. ANY SIZE JUMPING - These classes are open to any dog not entered in any other class at this show, except other ANY SIZE classes. They are jumping classes intended as fun classes for older dogs, new dogs and don't fit anywhere else dogs, so that all our dogs may enjoy Agility Shows.**

- a) The jump heights will be: (a) 45cm; Long jump 4 slats if used. (b) 25cm; Long jump 2 slats if used.
- b) There will be no tyre or weaves.
- c) The handler may choose which height is best for their dog regardless of the dogs size by stating "a" or "b" on the entry form.

**39. LARGE AGILITY AND CIRCULAR JUMPING ABC - is for any breed of dog except collie or collie cross.**

The Judges decision on the heredity of the dog is final.

40. **NOT FOR COMPETITION** entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

41. **Remedial action will be taken in the event of dogs left in cars being found in distressed condition.**

**Note:** The competitions will be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Regulations in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering the competitions will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Please leave the venue clean and tidy.

- All industrial units and farm buildings on site are **OUT OF BOUNDS.**
- Dogs must be on a lead at all times everywhere at the venue except when competing or in the exercise area. It is the handlers responsibility to keep their dogs under control.
- Please pick up after your dog and deposit the waste in the bags provided.

**DAY PARKING** - please park as directed. **BARBEQUES** Only gas BBQs are allowed.

**CAMPING** Please ensure that you book the correct size pitch for your unit.

A standard pitch will be 8 x 10m at a cost of £15 for two nights, and will accommodate tents, caravans and motor homes 5.5m and under in length (not including tow bar) plus awning, garden and a vehicle. Larger pitches, 10 x 10m will accommodate all units and are available at a cost of £19.00. All camping spaces must be pre booked.

If competitors require adjoining pitches they will each need to book the same size pitch.

The Management of Top Barn Farm will allow handlers to stay on the site after the event and will themselves collect the fee. Every unit must provide their own FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT
