Eligibility & Schedule of Classes

Please read carefully before filling in your entry form - refunds will not be given

In accordance with KC rules, all dogs must have been officially measured before competing at this show

Class Structure - A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression - Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression - At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

Special: Any places or wins gained in any special classes do not qualify the owner, handler or dog to any points or grade advancement.

ABC: Open to all dogs except Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses.

NBC: Open to Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses.

Helter Skelter: A flowing, jumping course usually set in increasing or decreasing circles like a helter skelter.

Power & Speed: The Power Section is to be negotiated first and will consist of, contact equipment, weaves, spread jump and long jump. If this is completed within the allotted time and without faults the handler then continues to the Speed Section, which is a short jumping course. The fastest Clear Round in the Speed Section is the winner.

Pairs Large: A pair may consist of two large dogs.

Jumping: Small/Medium: A pair may consist of any combination of Small or Medium dog, (two small, one small + one medium, two medium). Jump heights for both small and medium dogs will be 35cm.

Allsorts Open to dogs not entered in any other class at this show (except other Allsorts/Anysize classes), and have not competed in a standard class at their full height in the four weeks preceding this show. It is particularly suitable for inexperienced dogs or handlers, and those dogs that are unable to compete at their full height.

Agility: Jump height for Large dogs will be 35cm, the long jump (if used) will be maximum 3 slats, Jump height for Small/Medium dogs will be 25cm, the long jump (if used) will be maximum 2 slats.

In all cases the A-frame will be a maximum of 5ft, and weaves will be a maximum of 6. There will be no tyre, see-saw or dog walk. Trophies to 3rd place and Placed Rosettes to 15% of the class will be awarded.

The course will be very simple and flowing and have a course time of 60 seconds.

Any Size Open to dogs not entered in any other class at this show (except other Allsorts/Anysize classes), and have not competed in a standard class at their full height in the four weeks preceding this show. It is particularly suitable for inexperienced dogs or handlers, and those dogs that are unable to compete at their full height.

Jumping: The Class will have no weaves, tyre or contact equipment.

Jump heights for Large dogs will be 35cm.

Jump height for Small/Medium dogs will be 25cm.

Trophies to 3rd place and Placed Rosettes to 15% of the class will be awarded.

The course will be very simple and flowing and have a course time of 60 seconds.

EUKANUBA MINI AGILITY CHALLENGE - RULES

This is a competition consisting of eight heats of agility. It is open to mini dogs, known as small dogs, who measure 35cm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers and will be a combined class of grades 1 to 7.

Competitors will score 20 points for 1st place down to 1 point for 20th place. Points will be accumulated over all eight heats and the 20 dogs with the most points will qualify for the final.

In the event of a tie, leading to more than 20 dogs being in qualifying positions, the dog/s considered most consistent overall will then qualify.

Competitors may enter as many dogs as they like in the heats but can only qualify a maximum of two dogs for the final.

The final consists of two rounds of agility competitions known as Part 1 and Part 2. The winner of the Challenge will be the dog and handler with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final.

The competition will be held under K.C. rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these.

K.C. standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum height/length stated for small dogs.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats who has not qualified.

AWARDS - Rosettes will be provided to 20th place with trophies and a 3kg bag of Eukanuba Performance to 3rd. Clear round rosettes will also be provided.

EUKANUBA MINI CIRCULAR KNOCK-OUT - RULES

There will be eight heats of the Mini Circular Knock-out and the first four places in each will qualify for the final. The competition is open to mini dogs, known as small dogs, measuring 35cm or under at the withers and will be a combined class of grades 1 to 7.

A draw will be made for each heat.

Competitors may enter more than one dog for each heat but may only qualify one dog for the final. Their first dog to qualify will be invited to the final. Once qualified a handler may not enter any further heats.

The competitor to go through to the next round will be the first to finish with the least number of faults.

This is a circular knock-out and in the interest of safety there will be no collapsible tunnel, dogwalk or see-saw.

The course will contain weaving poles.

Dogs will start and finish from a line in the middle of the circle. Equipment may be used on this line although in the interest of safety it must be off-set so that the dogs are not running at each other when finishing.

The competition will be held under K.C. rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entered will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulation.

K.C. standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum size stated for small dogs.

It is the competitors responsibility to book in at the show if necessary and also to be at the ring when needed.

Should a faster dog catch up with the other dog, the slower dog **MUST** stand clear to allow the faster dog to pass it by.

It is the handlers responsibility to ensure that any dogs that are likely to be aggressive on a circular course where they are competing with another dog and may pass or be passed by another dog should **NOT** be entered. Any dog displaying any kind of aggressive behaviour on the course **WILL BE ELIMINATED IMMEDIATELY**.

False start ruling will be made at the judges discretion.

AWARDS - Rosettes will be provided to 16th place with trophies and a 3kg bag of Eukanuba Performance to the first four places.

EUKANUBA MINI/MIXI PAIRS CHALLENGE - RULES

This is a competition consisting of eight heats of jumping. It is a relay competition with a baton change taking place either in a box or behind a line at the judges discretion. The competition is open to mini dogs, known as small dogs, partnering either a midi dog (medium dog) or a maxi dog (large dog) and will be a combined class of grades 1 to 7.

Points will be awarded to the pair, which consists of the same two handlers and dog combinations. Points are not transferable between different pair combinations.

Pairs will score 15 points for 1st place down to 1 point for 15th place. Points will be accumulated over all eight heats and the 15 pairs with the most points will go through to the final.

Handlers with more than one dog may enter in more than one pair. However, they may only qualify a maximum of two dogs for the final. The pairs with the most points attained first will qualify for the final. No surrogate handlers will be allowed in the final.

The winner of the Mini/Mixi Pairs Challenge will be the pair with the fastest time with the least faults.

The competition is open to two dogs with separate handlers. One dog must be a mini (small) dog, 35cm or under at the withers, the partner can be either a midi (medium) dog, over 35cm but 43cm or under at the withers, or a maxi (large) dog, over 43cm in height.

Should a qualified dog or handler within a pair be unable/unfit to enter the final, reserves will be taken from the pair with the highest points who have not qualified.

The competition will be held under K.C. rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to abide by these rules and regulations.

K.C. standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum height for each category.

The competition will involve a change of height of the obstacles being jumped by the midi/maxi dogs at one stage during the class. The judge will decide which height of jump to start with and will announce the change of height when relevant. It is the competitors responsibility to be available accordingly. The course will be walked by everyone before the beginning of the class.

AWARDS - Rosettes will be provided to 15th place with trophies and a 3kg bag of Eukanuba Performance to 3rd. Clear round rosettes will also be provided.

Connection Small and Medium Rules

Objective

To gain as many points as possible (max 32) in the given course time (to be set by the Judge), and then stop the timing in the quickest time.

How

Complete 3 different jumps successfully, and then a bonus obstacle, until all 4 bonuses have been attempted or you run out of time.

Rules for obstacle placement

- 1 Tyre and Dog Walk must not be used.
- 2 Connecting Jumps: min 6, max 9 (excluding judge's bonus).
- 3 Connecting Jumps must be placed within the 4 bonus obstacles.
- 4 Connection Jumps must not be a spread jump.
- 5 Only one bonus obstacle may be placed on each side of the ring.
- 6 Bonus obstacle (1) Weaves.
- 7 Bonus obstacle (2) Jump + See-Saw (Jump must be aligned straight on to See-Saw).
- 8 Bonus obstacle (3) the A Frame.
- 9 Bonus obstacle (4) is a combination invented by the Judge containing 1, 2, or 3 obstacles. The Judge may stipulate in which order the obstacles are taken. Spreads may be used but only jumped in the correct direction.
- 10 Start and finish obstacles are for timing only and will not count. (They may or may not be the same obstacle, and may be a Jump, Tunnel or Table.
- 11 The start and finish can be inside the bonus obstacles, timing permitting.
- 12 In the event of the whistle sounding when a dog is committed to an obstacle or within a bonus section the points will be awarded upon successful completion.
- 13 Judges will need a scribe and a timer as per the old Gamblers, and 2 whistles.

Points

Jumps 1 point
Bonus 5 points each

Course Time

Set by Judge

Rules for competitors

- 1 The dog must start the timing.
- 2 If your dog runs past the start obstacle you must put it directly back over the start obstacle without touching it or re-setting it up (the obstacle may be done in either direction).
- 3 The start obstacle does not count if it is knocked down.
- 4 Refusals on Jumps will not be marked.
- 5 Refusals on bonus obstacles will count as a bonus failure.
- 6 Refusal on Weave Pole entry or faults during weaves count as a bonus failure.
- 7 Missed contact will count as a bonus failure.
- 8 Faults in the Judge's bonus will also count as a bonus failure.
- 9 3 different Jumps must be completed correctly before attempting a bonus.
- 10 After attempting a bonus the same Jumps may be used again.
- 11 Bonuses may be taken in any order provided they are preceded by 3 correctly completed Jumps.
- 12 Jumps may be taken from either side.
- 13 Jump numbers are for identification only.
- 14 Each bonus may only be attempted once (a failed bonus counts as an attempt).
- 15 The dog must stop the timing after either successfully completing the 4 bonuses or when the time limit is reached, indicated by a whistle blowing (whichever comes first).
- 16 The dog must also stop the timing when a round has ended due to elimination (indicated by a whistle blowing).
- 17 The round will end when the timing is stopped.
- 18 Fallen Jumps will not be replaced.

Elimination

If eliminated, a dog must leave the ring via the finish obstacle as quickly as possible in order to gain a time. Failure to do so will result in no score being recorded. Obstacles taken on the way to the finish will not be faulted or counted.

The following will result in elimination

- 1 Touching a bonus obstacle before completing 3 Jumps correctly.
- 2 Jumping 4 Jumps in succession
- 3 Touching the same bonus obstacle twice
- 4 Only 2 Jumps left standing.
- 5 Jumping a Spread obstacle the wrong way.
- 6 Touching a bonus obstacle or Jump or jumping an obstacle before the time.
- 7 Jumping the same Jump twice in a connection of 3 without doing a bonus.

Note: taking the Judge's bonus obstacle in the wrong order or direction will not result in elimination, but no bonus points will be awarded (Spread Jump excepted).

RULES AND REGULATIONS

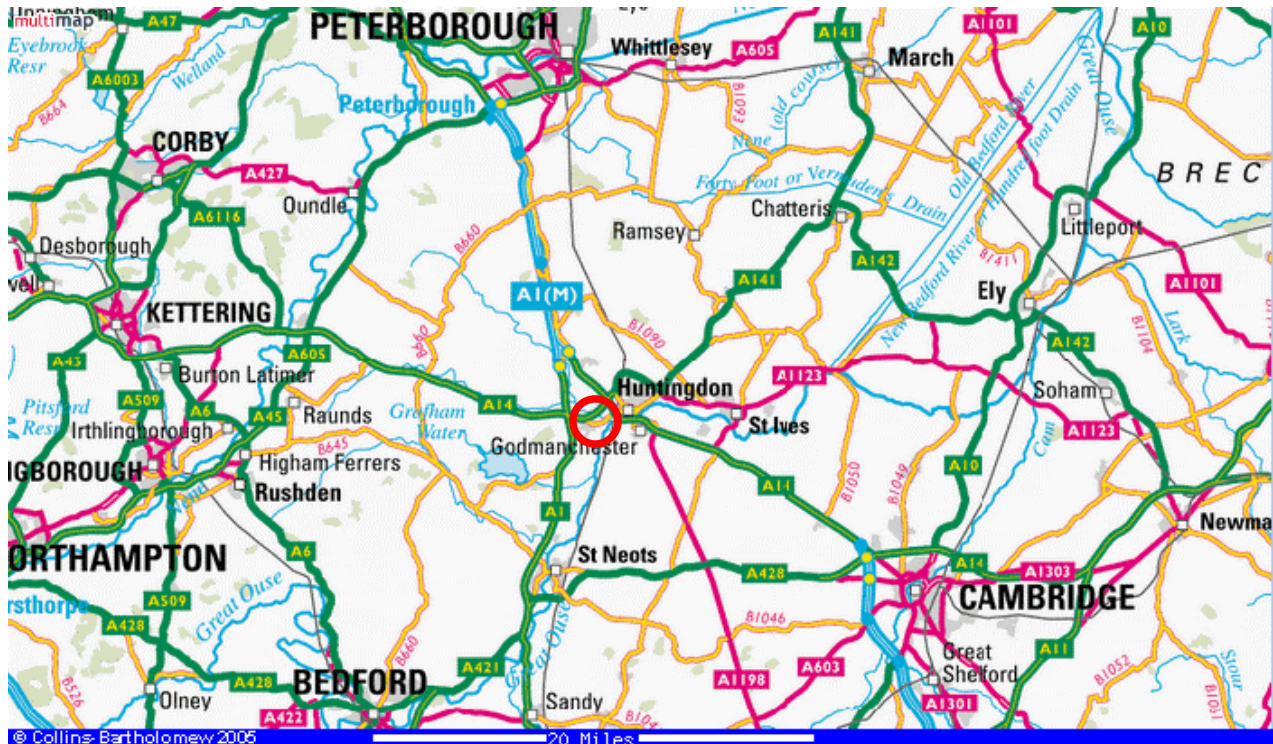
1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees £2.40 per dog per class, £4.80 per pair. Camping fees £22.50 per unit.
3. There will be no prize money in any class.
4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
8. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
9. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
10. Should a Judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another Judge.
11. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
12. There is no Sponsorship at this show.
13. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply.
14. The Height limit for dogs:-
 - a. Large Dogs - For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
 - b. Medium Dogs - For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
 - c. Small Dogs - For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
15. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.
16. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Show if it is:-
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
17. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
18. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
19. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations.
20. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owners' property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
21. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
22. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
23. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
24. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
25. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
26. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
27. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorized agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
28. Entries will be accepted via www.ishowservices.com
29. Overpaid fees will not be refunded.
30. In the event of abandonment of the Show, Letchworth DTC will defray any such expenses from received fees to cover the cost of the Show preparation and any non-retrievable expenses before issuing refunds.
31. Any owner, exhibitor or handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including the car and caravan parks and the show approaches.

Welfare of Dogs

An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Directions to the Show

Huntingdon (Brampton) Racecourse is situated on the A14, half a mile off the A1 and is well signposted from all directions.
