DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

On M25, leave JUNCTION 7 on to M23 South, marked GATWICK and CRAWLEY. Leave M23 at JUNCTION 10 signposted EAST GRINSTEAD A264. After two miles, at Dukes Head roundabout, take THIRD EXIT marked HAYWARDS HEATH and South of England Showground (B2028) through Crawley Down and Turners Hill. Follow signs to Ardingly and Haywards Heath. The Showground is on your right. Please use the gate opposite the Gardeners' Arms Pub.

The car parking for the Agility Show should be exclusive to the competitors, but you should be aware that it is open to public access.

ELIGIBILITY OF CLASSES

For large, medium and small dogs

STANDARD CLASSES. Only 1st prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes [A dog is only eligible for one grade]. In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

- Grade 1
[Elementary]** For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a 1st place in an Agility Class or three 1st places in Jumping Classes at K.C licensed Agility Shows. [Owners handlers or dogs previously qualified out of grade 1 [Elementary] are not eligible for this class.
- Grade 2
[Starters]** Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a 1st in an Agility Class or three 1st places in Jumping Classes at grade 2 at K.C licensed Agility Shows or elected to progress on points from grade 1. [Owners handlers or dogs previously qualified out of grade 2 [starters] are not eligible for this class.
- Grade 3
[Graduate]** Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at K.C licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4,5,6,or 7.
- Grade 4
[Novice]** Open to dogs which have gained a 1st place in an Agility Class or three 1st places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at K.C licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,5,6,7.
- Grade 5
[Intermediate]** Open to dogs which have gained a 1st place in an Agility class or three 1st places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at K.C licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,4,6,7.
- Grade 6
[Senior]** Open to dogs which have gained a 1st place in an Agility Class or three 1st places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at K.C licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,4,5 or 7
- Grade 7
[Advanced]** Open to all dogs which have gained a minimum of four 1st places at Grade 6 at K.C licensed Agility Shows Two 1st places must be gained in Agility not Jumping classes

Large dogs: Dogs measuring over 43cm
Medium dogs: Dogs measuring over 35cm and 43cm or under at the withers.
Small dogs: Dogs measuring 35cm or under at the withers

**75 points are required if using progression by points, up to Grade 5, using Agility Warrant points scheme
Dogs may only work in the class & grade heights they are eligible for i.e. small, medium, large**

Welfare of dogs

A competitor whose dog attends or is entered at a Kennel Club Licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Dogs in hot cars

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

SHOW REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry Fee £6.50 per dog, both classes for which the dog is eligible must be entered.
3. Competitors are reminded that show committee has the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
4. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months and over. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and they must be Kennel Club registered.
5. A dog docked on or after 6 April 2007 may not be entered for competition at this show.
6. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
7. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
8. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. Only a flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
9. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
10. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
11. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
12. Kennel Club standard marking will apply.
13. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.
14. Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, (Large)
Competition for Large dogs – for dogs measuring over 43cm at the withers
15. Withdrawal of dogs from Show. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Show if it is:
 - (a) A bitch which is in season
 - (b) Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease
 - (c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
 - (d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
 - (e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
16. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any classes.(08/09/09). For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show (19/09/09). The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class/es for the next grade. The dog will be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade.
17. Should circumstances so dictate, the Club, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. All such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
18. All competing dogs must, at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership, the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition, may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and Conditions of the original entry form.
19. Animals in Event.. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Club Committee. However, at the discretion of the Show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
20. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete will be returned to the competitor.
21. In the event of the abandonment of the Show through circumstances beyond our control, the Committee may defray such expenses from the entry fees to cover the cost of the show preparation.
22. All dogs will be entered at this Show at their owner's risk, and whilst every care will be taken, the Committee will not accept responsibility for the loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, people or property whilst at this Show.
23. No dog will be allowed in the ring at any time other than when being judged, no practising will be allowed in the ring. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
24. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
25. Internet entries will be accepted via www.ishowservices.com
26. No prize money will be given.
27. A Pay on the Day Class will be held if time permits.
28. Please clean up after your dog and place mess in the bins provided. Anyone knowingly not doing so may be asked to leave the venue and forfeit any remaining classes.
29. Please remember also, that if the sun is shining, your dog is vulnerable and at risk in a hot car
Please remember to leave ventilation and water available for your dog in your car.

Anyone whose dog is at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

KC Rule F8(A) "Any owner, exhibitor or handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any KC licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event, including the car and caravan parks and the show approaches"
