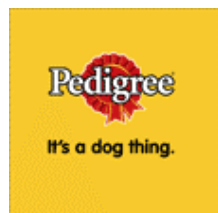

The Kennel Club Olympia ABC Agility Stakes*

2009/10 RULES

1. The Kennel Club Olympia ABC Agility Stakes is a *special* agility competition to be run under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations H for Large dogs.
2. The competition is open to all dogs (grades 1 – 7) excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses.
3. The first **four** dogs of each heat will be invited to attend the semi-final. The next best placed dogs at a heat will be deemed to be reserves should a qualified dog be unable to attend the semi-final. Reserves from heats may be invited to attend the semi-final up to and including the closing date of the NHDTC Show June Show. After the closing date NO reserves will be called even if other qualifiers have to retire / withdraw.
4. Dogs that have already qualified for the 2009 semi-final may enter further heats for competition.
5. Those dogs eligible to compete in the semi-final shall be the **four best-placed dogs in each heat that have not previously qualified**
6. A handler may qualify more than one dog for the semi-final but may only compete with one dog at the final e.g. the highest placed dog at the semi final.
7. The semi-final will be held at the Newton Heath DTC agility show held in June. The final will be at Olympia in December. Any alteration will be publicised.
8. Owners, handlers and dogs who enter the heats or attend the semi-final will be deemed to have accepted the Rules and Regulations of this competition and the organising show.
9. The organisers, Newton Heath DTC and the Kennel Club in agreement, reserve the right to alter these Rules and Regulations at their discretion

Welfare of dogs – An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club Licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club rules and Regulations.

Dogs in hot cars - Your dog is vulnerable and AT risk if left in high temperatures even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damaged caused.

In accordance with Kennel Club Rules, all dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a Kennel Club licensed agility show.

Only first prizes and points (clear rounds) gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

ELIGIBILITY AND DEFINITION OF CLASSES

Grade 1 - For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at a Kennel Club licensed Agility Show. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 - (Starters) Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at a Kennel Club licensed Agility Show or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 – Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows & dogs which are not eligible for Grades 4, 5, 6 or 7

Grade 4 – Open to dogs which have gained a 1st place in an Agility class or 3 first places in jumping classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at a Kennel Club licensed Agility shows and are not eligible for grades 3, 5, 6, or 7

Grade 5 – Open to dogs which have gained a 1st place in an Agility class or 3 first places in jumping classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows and are not eligible for grades 3, 4, 6 or 7

Grade 6 – Open to dogs which have gained a 1st place in an Agility Class or 3 first places in jumping classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for grade 3, 4, 5 or 7

Grade 7 – Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 1st places at grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows, 2 first places must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes.

Any Size – Open to all dogs not entered in any other class at the show.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer, or no classes available for the next grade, the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees. Special and invitation classes and awards gained at "limited Shows" should not be included.

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of Agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

In case of cancellation of the show within 7 days of the show date, notification will be sent to the relevant web sites where possible and notified to the iSS Show Hotline 07532 11 11 57. It will be the competitor's responsibility to check with the Hotline and/or the Web sites, if continuation of the show is in doubt.

SHOW REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/ Authority to compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees: £2.60 per class.
3. No prize money will be given.
4. The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
6. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
8. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
9. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under a test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
10. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another Judge.
11. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
12. Sponsors – Kennel Club, Pedigree, Beagle Eye and David Lake
13. Kennel Club standard marking will apply in all scheduled classes.
14. Height limit for dogs, Large – dogs measuring over 43cm at the withers, Medium – dogs measuring over 35cm and under 43cm at the withers, Small – measuring under 35cm at the withers.
15. Judges at an Agility Test may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the test at which they are judging.
16. Withdrawal of dogs from Test
A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is –
 - a. A bitch which is in season
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of another opponent
 - d. Of such a temperament of is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing
17. All wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class (es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered in the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
18. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
19. Dogs must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the competitors name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a competition may compete as the new owners property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
20. Animals in Event
No animal other than the one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog bought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
21. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
22. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease
No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during a period of 21 days Prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42
23. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
24. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
25. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
26. Separate entry forms must be completed by each competitor and must be signed by the competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
27. Parents will be held responsible for the actions of their children. Please ensure your children do not cause any damage, or interfere with equipment or the property of the Society or others.
28. Internet entries will be accepted via: www.ishowservices.com
29. If circumstances make it necessary that the Competition is cancelled, the club reserves the right to defray expenses incurred by deducting such expenses from the entry fees received.
30. The owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
