Eligibility of classes

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, Special classes, Invitation events, excepted.)

STANDARD CLASSES.

Grade 1. Elementary. For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club Agility Shows. N.B. Owner, Handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1.(Elementary) are now eligible for this class.

Grade 2. Starters. Open to dogs which are not eligible for grades 1.3.4.5.6.7. and have not gained a first place in an Agility class or three first places in Jumping classes at grade 2. at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, Handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 3. Graduate. Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4,5,6 or 7.

Grade 4. Novice. Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility class or three first places in Jumping classes at grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 5,6 or 7.

Grade 5. Intermediate. Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility

Class or three first places in Jumping classes at grade 4 or elected to progress on points from grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for grade 3,4,6 or 7

Grade 6 Senior. Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility class or three first places in Jumping classes at grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for grade 3,4,5, or 7

Grade 7. Advanced. Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) classes.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6 two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme. Regulation K3c refers. Except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression however once a dog has progressed it cannot return to a previous grade

Special Classes

Junior Classes 20 21 39 40 Handlers must be under 12 years or 12 ears and over but under 18 years on the first day of the show (AUGUST 18th 2009) Dogs may not be entered in both under 12 and over 12 parts. Trophies in both parts Dogs will run at their appropriate height Small Medium & Large (Combined Grades 1 to 7

Class 58 Handlers must be over 6 years on August 18th 2009 Standard marking apply

Special Combined Grades 1-7 Pairs Small

Class is open to small dogs a pair consist of 2 dogs and 2 handlers. Class may be Jumping/Agility Agility/Agility or Jumping/Jumping as circumstances allow and at the judge's discretion Jumping height max 350mm.

Class is open to medium dogs a pair consist of 2 dogs and 2 handlers. Class may be Jumping/Agility Agility/Agility or Jumping/Jumping as circumstances allow and at the judges discretion Jumping height 350mm.

Special Combined Grades 1-3 Pairs Large

Class open to large grades 1-3 dogs only a pair consist of 2 dogs and 2 handlers Classes may be Jumping/Agility Agility/Agility or Jumping/Jumping as circumstances allow and at judges discretion

Special Combined Grades 4-7 Pairs Large

Class open to large grades 4-7 and x dogs only a pair consist of 2 dogs and 2 handlers class may be Jumping/Agility Agility/Agility or Jumping/Agility as circumstances allow and at judges discretion

Special Any Size Jumping & Steeplechase

These classes are open to dogs of all sizes not entered in any other classes at this show.

Part (A) Small/Medium for dogs measuring 1ft 5ins (430mm) at the withers (Jump height max 350mm no long jump or tyre in either part

Part (B) For dogs measuring over 1ft 5ins (430) at the withers (Jump height max 350mm) no long jump or tyre in either part.

Eligibility of classes Cont.

Special Welsh National Agility Handler 2009 Class 1 (Combined Grades 2) Classes are open to Large Medium and Small dogs owner or joint owners and handlers must reside in Wales Dogs must run in both classes for faults and time for both classes to be added together. Least overall faults and fastest aggregate time wins. (Elimination 100 faults) With special thanks to Western Mail for sponsoring this competition.

Special Open Helter Skelter Large Medium & Small Classes 52.53.54.55. Special jumping classes as defined in the class list. Small and Medium dogs run as separate classes.

Class 58 YKC Agility Dog of the Year Crufts 2010 Qualifying Heat Trophies to 1st in each part This special class will be divided into 2 age groups Ages as at 18th August 2009 Dogs may only be entered in 1 age group part A Handlers 6-11 years B 12—17 years.

Special ABC Jumping Classes 38 and 63 Agility Open to all dogs Large excluding Border Collies Working Sheepdogs and their crosses

Special Jumping Class 41 Open to all Border Collies Working Sheepdogs and their crosses

Special Agility Class 64 Open to all Border Collies Working Sheepdogs and their crosses.

Rules & Regulations

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
 1. Entry fees and other fees are as detailed on the entry form.
2. Prize money: Overall results of aggregate of Special Classes 1 and 2 Special Welsh National Agility Handler 2009
1st Place £50. 2nd Place £25. and Best Junior £25.
3. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
4. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility shows.
5. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
6. No bitch in season is allowed to compete
7. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show
8. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half slip collar or lead when under test. A flat close fitting leather or webbing collar is permitted providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar. i.e. Not attached to ring.
9. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
10. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
11. Sponsorship of classes as follows. Classes 1.2. The Western Mail Classes 58 Young Kennel Club.
12. Kennel Club Standard marking regulations apply
13. Height limit for dogs
 - A. Large Dogs. For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers
 - B. Medium Dogs. For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5in) or under at the withers if applicable.
 - C. Small Dogs. For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers if applicable
15. Judges at a Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership or handle a dog at a Show at which they are judging
16. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Show if it is
 - A A bitch which is in season
 - B Suffering for any infectious diseases or contagious diseases
 - C Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
17. In estimating the number of awards won all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show after the entry for the show has been sent it is the competitors responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entries.
18. Should circumstances so dictate the Society in consultation with the judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club
19. A dog must at the time of entry for the competition be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitors name (or Registration or transfer applied for) In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a competition may compete as the new owners property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the competition and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.

Rules & Regulations Cont.

20. **Animals in Event:** No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However at the discretion of the show society.
- A dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
21. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the Exhibitor/competitor.
22. No Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Diseases. Or having been exposed to such diseases during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
23. Pay on the day classes will be held if time permits.
24. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
25. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
26. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or his/her authorised agent in accordance with the provisions therein. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
27. **ALPHA AGILITY CHALLENGE 2009 QUALIFYING HEAT**
1. 8 Qualifying heats producing 40 finalists who compete at an Alpha Challenge Grand Final To be held on Sunday 30th August 2009 at Stoneleigh Park Country Festival. Stoneleigh Park Warwickshire CV8 2LD
 2. Once a dog has qualified (i.e. 5 finalists per heat) this eliminates the dog from taking a further finalist place and the next highest dog(s) in the Alpha Agility Challenge class will be invited to the final
 3. Handlers may not qualify more than one dog for the Alpha Agility Challenge Final
 4. Any surrogate handlers must be notified in writing within four days of the last heat.
 5. NO amendments after this date and non advice will disqualify the partnership

WELFARE OF DOGS.

An exhibitor (or Competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog are met and should not knowingly put their dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, defaults, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm Please take care of your dogs.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
