ELIGIBILITY and DEFINITION of CLASSES

This classification should apply to competitions for large, medium and small dogs.

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined below. Only first prizes gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. A dog is only eligible for one grade. The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class.

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Classes. Agility include contact points, jumping there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso, classes are defined as follows:

Grade 1 (Elementary). For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility class or 3 first places in Jumping classes. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of the old Elementary are not eligible for this class.* In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 2 (Starters). Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility class or 3 first places in Jumping classes at Grade 2, or elected to progress on points from grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of the old Starters are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate). Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or Grade 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice). Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility class or 3 first places in Jumping classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate). Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility class or 3 first places in Jumping classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior). Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility class or 3 first places in Jumping classes at grade 5 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced). Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6. Two first places must be gained in Agility (NOT jumping) classes.

Special ABC Jumping

Open to all Large dogs, excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses. (Any Breeds but Collies). In the event of dispute, the Judge's decision will be final.

CRUFTS AGILITY TEAM RELAY COMPETITION - CRUFTS 2010

This is an Agility competition and must include at least two items of contact equipment. **This is a team relay event** and a suitable baton should be used which must remain behind the start line at all times. When the dog/handler returns to the start/finish, there will be a baton change between the handlers. No part of the next dog/handler must be over the start line at the change over; failure to observe this will incur a penalty of twenty faults. These competitions will be scheduled as a combined class for grades 1 to 7 for all height categories. There will be a separate qualifying competition for each height category. There will be up to 8 separate heats for each height category, (small, medium, large) held at Kennel Club licensed shows, throughout the country. The Show Secretary should record the top five placed teams and send the results to the Crufts Office at the Kennel Club within 14 days of the show. These results should include the name of the team, handlers, dogs and reserves. Each team will consist of 4 dogs, with 4 handlers from the same height category. The winners of each heat will be invited to CRUFTS 2010 to compete in the Small, Medium and Large Finals. In the event that the winning team or club in a heat has already qualified for the final then the highest placed unqualified team in that heat will be invited to the final at CRUFTS. Only dogs entered as a reserve at the qualifying event will be permitted to compete in the final should a change of dog be necessary. This event is open to Kennel Club Registered Clubs with an interest in agility, all team members must be members of the club at the time of qualifying for the CRUFTS Teams Final. Clubs may only qualify 1 (one) team in each height category for the final at CRUFTS 2010. Once a handler or dog has run for a Kennel Club Registered Club in a CRUFTS Team Agility event they cannot run for another Kennel Club Registered Club in the CRUFTS Team Agility event at the same height category during the qualifying year.

YKC AGILITY DOG - CRUFTS 2010

The Age groups for the Agility Dog of the Year have been simplified to two age groups. 6 – 12 years and 12 – 18 years.

With 3 sizes of dogs this makes 6 sub classes instead of the 12 in previous years. 1st and 2nd place in each of the 6 subdivisions will qualify provided there are at least 6 dogs entered into the division. If there are less than 6 dogs, only the 1st place will qualify.

6 Qualifying heats to be run between April & November 2009.

6 Classes divided by age and size of dog as listed below:

Under 12 (Handlers 6 years and up to, but not including 12th birthday)
Large Dogs, Medium Dogs and Small Dogs.

12 and over (Handlers 12 years and up to, but not including 18th birthday)
Large Dogs, Medium Dogs and Small Dogs.

All ages are calculated as on the day of this show (30th August 2009).

YKC TEAM AGILITY- CRUFTS 2010

Team composition.

All teams should consist of 5 Dogs handled by 5 separate handlers. (No reserve required due to scoring system that ignores the worst performance from the 5). Teams should represent a KC club or group of clubs, & the name of the team should reflect this. i.e. - The Northants & Wellingborough YKC Team. All 5 handlers may be from different clubs. 5 Dogs /handlers per team.

What are the rules concerning the Handlers/Dogs

Handlers must be YKC members. They may handle any KC registered dog.

The team may consist of 5 dogs from any or all the 3 size classifications.

Handled by 5 members, age 6 years and up to but not including 18th birthday. Only one handler can be aged 18 years and up to, but not including, 25th birthday.

Handlers may compete in more than 1 team, from the same club/s, but must handle a different dog in each team.

Once a handler has qualified, he/she may not compete for a different team, for the same year.

How many qualify?

The team placed first at each heat will qualify.

In the event of only one team entering the heat, that team will run in the heat & providing no more than 2 dogs are eliminated will qualify.

The test

The course will be set by the Judge who will utilise at least 2 pieces of contact equipment. All equipment will be as per H regulations in force at the time and will be appropriate for the size of dog.

Jump Heights will be:- Large Dogs – 650mm (2ft 1.6ins), Medium Dogs – 450mm (1ft 5.7ins), Small Dogs – 350mm (1ft 1.75ins).

How is the event scored?

The 5 dogs will be individually timed, (not relay)

Standard Agility marking will apply, including the counting of any time faults. Elimination will incur 50 faults – scoring will continue.

The combined score/time of the best 4 out of the 5 dogs in the team will decide the results.

The organisers may adjust the running orders to group sizes of dog, to reduce the need to raise and lower the equipment.

Reduced Blame.

By counting only 4 out of 5 scores the "Let the side down" element is reduced, whilst making it competitive within the team to get one of the 4 best scores. In the event of a dog/handler pulling out at the last minute the team can still be competitive.

Substitute Dogs or Handlers

Once a team has qualified the Dogs & handlers should remain as per the entry form,

Special permission to substitute will be required in writing from the YKC, in the event of a dog or handler being unable to compete in the final for reason beyond the team's control- this permission will not be unreasonably refused.

AGE CUT OFF DATE WILL BE: As on the day of this show (30th August 2009).

SCOTTISH DOG OF THE YEAR 2009 FINAL

This invitational Final will be judged by Mrs Margaret Quinn.

Those invited to take part in this prestigious event will be the top dog and handler partnerships who have gained points in Grade 6 & 7 Agility Classes held throughout Scotland in 2008/2009. The handlers of the top 20 large dogs and the top 6 small and medium dogs will be invited to compete in the final. A running total of the points gained by dogs and their handlers can be viewed at <http://www.daatc.org.uk/sdoty.xls>.

Points for all heights will include shows up to the closing date of this show.

The Final will take place during lunch. All rings will close, to enable everyone to watch.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. ENTRY CONDITIONS. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The Registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. FEES. The following entry fees are payable: Members First Class per dog £4.00. Non-Members First Class per dog £5.50; Subsequent entries per dog per class -£3.00; Team Events £12.00. The price of admission for non-competitors will be Adults -£5.00; Children/Senior Citizens -£3.00; A concessionary price of £4.50 for Adults is available if booked with entries; Membership- Single £17, Joint £25 & Junior £7; Eye-Testing: £30.00 per dog; Microchipping: £20.00 per dog (£18.00 per dog for SKC members). Caravans: from Monday, 24th August -£40.00 (without booking £45.00) or from Thursday, 27th -£30.00 (without booking £35.00).
3. PRIZE MONEY. No prize money is available.
4. REFUSAL OF ENTRIES. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. PUPPIES. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the show are not eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
6. NOT FOR COMPETITION. Entries will be accepted for dogs aged six calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form
7. BITCHES IN SEASON. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
8. TREATMENT OF DOGS. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
9. LEADS. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
10. APPOINTMENT OF JUDGES. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
11. JUDGES' DECISION. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
12. SPONSORSHIP. Rosettes provided by YKC will be awarded in Classes 28 & 29.
13. STANDARD MARKING. The Kennel Club Standard Marking Regulations apply according to Kennel Club Regulations H1 (Annex B).
14. THE HEIGHT LIMIT FOR DOGS.
Large Dogs - For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
Medium Dogs - For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
Small Dogs - For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
15. A Judge at an Agility Test cannot enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership, or handle a dog at the test at which they are judging. However, a Judge may enter their own dog NFC at that event, for the purpose of testing the course time.
16. WITHDRAWAL OF DOGS FROM TEST. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is:-
 - a) A bitch which is in season.
 - b) Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
17. ELIGIBILITY. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, **it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show manager at least 14 days before the date of the show**. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
18. CHANGES TO ARRANGEMENTS. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported the Kennel Club.
19. REGISTRATION. A dog must, at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by Kennel Club Rules and Regulations in the Competitor's name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the Directors and the Secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered as the competitor for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to The Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
20. FOOD. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
21. ENTRY FORMS. Separate entry forms must be completed by each competitor and must be signed by the competitor or his/her authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees. **Once entries have been received they are non-refundable.**
22. FREE PASSES. The Committee shall provide all competitors with a free pass enabling them to enter the event at any time of the day their competition is scheduled, but in the case of dog owned in partnership only one such pass will be issued. Additional passes may be booked with entries at the concessionary price of : Adults £4.50 (£5.00 on the day) – Child/Senior Citizen £2.00.
23. COMPETITION OF DOGS SUFFERING FROM CONTAGIOUS OR INFECTIOUS DISEASE. No dogs suffering from contagious or Infectious Disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42. No such dog may be present within the boundaries of the Show.
24. ANIMALS IN EVENT. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational and instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
25. AUTHORITY TO COMPETE. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority To Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an ATC number will be returned to the competitor.
26. DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

27. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
28. OFFICIALS. No official of the Show may wear an official badge when competing.
29. DOGS UNATTENDED. No dogs must be left unattended at any time.
30. LOSS OR DAMAGE. No responsibility will be accepted for loss, damage, or whatsoever to person, dogs or property at this show.
31. ADDITIONAL JUDGE. If numbers warrant, the Committee reserves the right to appoint an additional judge.
32. RUNNING ORDER. Running orders will be noted on the competitors ring number.
33. AVAILABILITY FOR CLASS(ES)/RUNNING ORDER. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
34. HANDLERS. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
35. COMPETITORS' BRIEFING. A briefing for competitors will be held prior to the start of each class.
36. PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILMING. The taking of photographs and films at the show for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Organisers. The Organisers reserve the right at their absolute discretion to confiscate cameras and/or films for infringement of this condition. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs or video film of general views of the Show, provided that these are for private use only. Specific dogs may be photographed or filmed only with the approval of the exhibitor.

Direction to Agility Venue

Access to the showground is only possible from the A8 travelling in the direction of Edinburgh. Turn left onto Hallyards Road, immediately after the yellow B&B sign, and ~½ mile before the main entrance to the showground. The agility venue is next to the caravan site ~100 yards down Hallyards Road on left.
