## **Allsorts Class**

This class is open to any dog not entered in any other class at this show, except other Allsorts/Any Size or veteran classes. It is intended as a fun class for older dogs, new dogs and 'don't fit anywhere else' dogs, so that all our dogs may enjoy agility shows. Jump will be at 35cms

## **Large Veteran Jumping**

Open to Large dogs 8 years and over who are not entered into any other class in this show except other allsorts/anysize classes. Jump Height Large Dogs 450mm. There will be No Weaves, Tyre and Long Jump in this Class.

## **ABC Agility/Jumping**

Open to all dogs that are NOT Border Collies, WSDs, or their crosses. The judge's decision in this matter is final.

## **WSD/BC Helter Skelter**

Open to Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and their crosses. The judge's decision in this matter is final.

## **Pairs Relay**

Two dogs with separate handlers will compete over the same course of a minimum of sixteen obstacles. When the first dog/handler returns to the start/finish, there will be a baton change between handlers. No part of the second dog/handler must be over the start line; failure to observe this will incur a penalty of twenty faults. The baton must stay behind the start line at all times.

Please remember only one person needs to enter the pairs on their form but all dogs MUST be entered by owners on individual entry forms to be eligible for pairs. Please ensure you have a partner before entering.

## **ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES**

In accordance with KC Rules, large dogs that have not competed before 1<sup>st</sup> January 2006 & ALL Small & Medium dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a KC licensed agility show.

### **STANDARD CLASSES**

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes (A dog is only eligible for one grade) In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

#### **Grade 1 (Elementary)**

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class. The three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

#### **Grade 2 (Starters)**

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class..

#### **Grade 3 (Graduate)**

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

#### **Grade 4 (Novice)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

#### **Grade 5 (Intermediate)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

#### **Grade 6 (Senior)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

#### **Grade 7 (Advanced)**

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

## Rules and Regulations

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry Fees: **£2.60** per dog per class. Pairs **£5.20**. Camping Fees: **£15.00**. Helping Tenterden members **£1.80** per dog per class. Camping available from **1.00pm Friday**, the venue must be vacated **by 8.00pm Sunday**.
3. The Committee of Tenterden DTC reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
4. Puppies less than 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete for Kennel club licensed Agility Shows.
5. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
6. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
7. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
8. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
9. Should a Judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge then the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
10. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
11. Kennel Club standard marking will apply as published in the Kennel Club Year Book in use at the time of the show.
12. The Height limit for dogs.
  - a. Large Dogs – For dogs measuring over 43cm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
  - b. Medium Dogs – For dogs measuring over 35cm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 43cm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
  - c. Small Dogs – For dogs measuring 35cm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
13. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.
14. Withdrawal of dogs from Competition  
A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Show if it is:
  - a. A bitch which is in season.
  - b. Suffering from any infectious disease or contagious disease.
  - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
  - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
15. **In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (7<sup>th</sup> July 2009) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show (18<sup>th</sup> July 2009). The dog will be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog will be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.**
16. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
17. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations in the Competitor's name (or registration/ transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having being made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
18. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
19. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or her/his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
20. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
21. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
22. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
23. Dogs competing in small or medium height categories must be measured for competition. Competitors must ensure that their dog is measured prior to their first competition and that dog's Agility Record Book has been signed and dated by the measuring officials. Large dogs entered for competition must be measured before they compete at their first agility test, if they have not competed prior to 1<sup>st</sup> January 2006.
24. Additional judges will be appointed if necessary.
25. In the event that the Show has to be cancelled, Tenterden DTC reserve the right to defray from entries received such costs as they deem necessary.
26. Competitors must follow the instructions of Stewards with respect to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries.
27. All dogs are entered at their owner's risk, whilst every care will be taken, Tenterden DTC will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or property.
28. All caravans/camping units must carry suitable fire extinguishers and equipment for fire fighting.
29. Please clear up after your dogs. Anyone knowingly not doing so will be asked to leave the showground forfeiting any remaining entries.
30. **No refunds will be given in the event of incorrect monies being submitted. It is the competitor's responsibility to check the paperwork before submission.**

## Qualifier Rules and Regulations



### **CELEBRATION LARGE DOG ADVANCED POWER AND SPEED**

This class is only open for dogs eligible for Grade 7 Advanced competitions.

Handlers may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the final. Once a dog has qualified for the final further heats may be entered for competition.

The first 4 places from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this fact.

The first section of the course will contain all the contact equipment plus the weaving poles, two rising spread jumps at maximum width and height, and the long jump at maximum length.

This first section need not be timed, but this is at the judge's discretion. It is recommended that a generous maximum time be applied.

The second section of the course will consist only of single pole hurdles, and will be against the clock. The object of the class is for the dog to negotiate the first part of the course clear, before proceeding across the start line to commence the second section of the course, which should be set as a fast speed jumping course.

#### **NOTE**

Only dogs that are clear on the first section can attempt the second section. Normal judging rules apply except that on the first section, handlers may line up their dogs before taking any obstacle without penalty. The winner will be decided in the usual way of the fastest time with the least faults.

It is advisable for judges to note that the original intention was for the jumping part of the course to be fast and free flowing to produce an exciting finish.

### **CELEBRATION CONNECTION LARGE DOG STAKES**

This event must be classified as Grades 6 and 7 at least. Grades 3, 4, or 5 may be added at the secretary's discretion according to the anticipated entry.

The first 4 places from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.

In the event that a heat is split the first 2 from each part will qualify regardless of how many parts.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a Heat, but may only qualify one dog for the final. The first dog that a handler qualifies with will run in the final. Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition providing they are eligible.

It is most important that handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the show secretary on the day of the show of this Fact.

No tyre or dog walk will be used in this class.

### **Burgess Supa Dog Agility Stakes.**

Classes 1, 2 and 3. These are qualifying classes for a final to be held at the Peterborough Autumn Show in October. The first 6 Large dogs in class 1 [or first two/three depending on the split of the class] and the first 5 in class 2 [small] & class 3 [medium] will qualify. Once a dog has qualified for the 2009 final they may compete for the placing in the class but the qualifying place for the final will be awarded to the next placed dog.

## Celebration Connection Rules

### **Objective**

To gain as many points as possible (max 32) in the given course time (to be set by the judge), and then stop the timing in the quickest time

### **How**

Complete 3 different jumps successfully, then a bonus obstacle, until all 4 bonuses have been attempted or you run out of time.

### **Rules for obstacle placement**

1. Tyre and Dog walk must not be used
2. Connecting Jumps: min 6, max 9 (excluding judges bonus )
3. Connecting jumps must be place within the 4 bonus obstacles
4. Connecting jumps must not be a spread jump
5. Only one bonus obstacle may be placed on each side of the ring
6. Bonus obstacle (1) weaves
7. Bonus obstacle (2) jump + see saw ( jump must be aligned straight on to see saw )
8. Bonus obstacle (3) the A frame
9. Bonus obstacle (4) is a combination invented by the judge containing 1, 2, or 3 obstacles. The judge may stipulate in which order obstacles are taken. Spreads may be used but only jumped in the correct direction
10. Start and finish obstacles are for timing only and will not count. (They may or may not be the same obstacle, and may be a jump, tunnel or table)
11. The start and finish can be inside the bonus obstacles, timing permitting
12. In the event of the whistle sounding when a dogs in committed to an obstacle or within a bonus section the points will be award upon successful completion
13. Judges will need a scribe and a timer as per the old Gamblers, and 2 whistles

### **Points**

Jumps 1 point

Bonus 5 points each

Course time

Set by judge

### **Rule for competitors**

1. The dog must start the timing.
2. If your dog runs past the start obstacle you must put it directly back over the start obstacle without touching it or re-setting it up (the obstacle may be done in either direction)
3. The start obstacle does not count if it is knocked down
4. Refusals on jumps will not be marked
5. Refusals on bonus obstacles will count as a bonus failure
6. Refusal on weaves pole entry or faults during the weaves count as a bonus failure
7. Missed contact will count as a bonus failure
8. Faults in the judge's bonus will also count as a bonus failure
9. 3 different jumps must be completed correctly before attempting a bonus
10. After attempting a bonus the same jumps may be used again
11. Bonuses may be taken in any order provided they are preceded by 3 correctly completed jumps
12. Jumps may be taken from either side
13. Jump numbers are for identification only
14. Each bonus may only be attempted once (a failed bonus counts as an attempt)
15. The dog must stop the timing after either successfully completing the 4 bonuses or when the time limit is reached, indicated by a whistle blowing (whichever comes first)
16. The dog must also stop the timing when a round in ended due to elimination (indicated by a whistle blowing)
17. The round will end when the timing is stopped
18. Fallen jumps will not be replaced

### **Elimination**

If eliminated, a dog must leave the ring via the finish obstacle as quickly as possible in order to gain a time. Failure to do so will result in no score being recorded. Obstacles taken on the way to the finish will not be faulted or counted.

### **The following will result in elimination:**

1. Touching a bonus obstacle before completing 3 jumps correctly
  2. Jumping 4 jumps in succession
  4. Touching the same bonus twice
  5. Only 2 jumps left standing
  6. Jumping a spread obstacle the wrong way
  7. Touching a bonus obstacle or jump or jumping an obstacle before starting the time
  8. Jumping the same jump twice in a connection of 3 without doing a bonus
- Note: taking the judge's bonus obstacles in the wrong order or direction will not result in elimination, but no bonus points will be awarded (spread jump excepted).

- Clear round rosettes available in all classes.
- Best Club Member rosette in all classes.
- Tuff Stuff leads will be awarded to all four qualifying places in the Celebration Heats
- Rosette for highest placed Australian Shepherd in the ABC classes on both days
