RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry Fees: All classes £2.50 per dog per class. Camping is £16.00 inclusive.
3. There is no prize money on offer at this show.
4. The Committee of Wigan A & ABTC reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
6. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
7. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
8. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
9. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under Test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
10. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
11. **No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.**
12. Sponsors: Robinsons Country Leisure sponsoring the juniors.& Burns Pet Nutrition Ltd Adams Agility.
13. Standard Kennel Club marking regulations will apply as published in the current Kennel Club yearbook.
14. The Height limit for dogs.
 - a. Large Dogs - For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
 - b. Medium Dogs - For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
 - c. Small Dogs - For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
15. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging
16. Withdrawal of dogs from competition.

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Show if it is:-

 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
17. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class (es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
18. Should circumstances so dictate the Club, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
19. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owner's property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
20. Animals in Event

No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.

However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
21. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
22. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
23. A pay on the day class may be held if time permits.
24. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
25. **Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.**
26. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
27. No dog will be allowed in the ring at any time other than when being judged.
28. No practicing will be allowed in the ring.
29. **Any alteration to the schedule will be notified on our web site www.wiganaabtc.co.uk should time permit. This will be deemed sufficient notice.**
30. Classes may be split at the Show Committee's discretion.
31. **Anyone found deliberately not cleaning up after their dog may be asked to leave the show ground and will forfeit all remaining entries.**
32. All dogs entered at this show are at the owner's risk. Whilst every care will be taken, the Committee of Wigan A & ABTC and any other organisers will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury, however caused, to persons, dogs or property at this Show.
33. In the event of abandonment of the Show through circumstances beyond our control, the Committee of Wigan A & ABTC reserve the right to defray such expenses from the entry fees received to cover the cost of show preparation and any non retrievable expenses before issuing refunds.
34. Campers must pitch within their allocated space and must not obstruct the roadways.
35. Goods may not be sold within the precincts of the show without prior permission of the committee.

36. Any overpayments will be donated to the Club's charity at the discretion of the committee.
37. It is the competitors' responsibility to check the paperwork before submission.
38. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
39. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
40. No dogs are to be taken onto the main caravan park, (unless camping there). Please keep them within the confines of the exercise area and the show.
41. the erecting of trade stands and the selling of goods is only permissible by prior arrangement with Wigan A & ABTC
42. The first 10 dogs should be at the ring for the commencement of each class, if not this could result in the run for that class being forfeited.
43. **Generators**
We are happy for people to use generators, but they must not be running after 8pm and we would request, on behalf of other people camping near you that, as a matter of courtesy, you do not run them throughout the day.
44. **Speed Limit** There is a speed limit of 5mph everywhere on the site.
45. **Training Equipment** Training equipment is NOT ALLOWED at any time around the camping area or the exercise area.
46. **Fire Precautions** All camping units must be equipped with their own fire fighting equipment. It is the competitor's responsibility to provide at the very least a water filled fire bucket, which must be placed outside their tent/awning.
47. **CAMPING PLACES ARE NON TRANSFERABLE & NON REFUNDABLE ONCE A SPOT HAS BEEN ALLOTTED WITHOUT PRIOR PERMISSION OF THE CLUB BEFORE THE SHOW.**
48. **PLEASE** ensure only 2 dogs UNDER CONTROL off lead per handler in designated area (exercise area) Please be considerate of other handlers and their dogs. Please respect this venue and keep it CLEAN.

Welfare of Dogs

A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog is met and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Dogs in Cars on Hot Days

Show Schedule Notice

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade – for example a large umbrella – and always have plenty of water to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- Remember, if you feel hot your dog is likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

WIGAN A & ABTC

ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES.

This classification should apply to competitions for large, medium and small dogs.

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round will count towards grade progression. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined below. The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class.

Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade, A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

ELIGIBILITY AND DEFINITION OF CLASSES – STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). **In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.**

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1.

N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

QUALIFIERS at this show will take part in the Final to be held at Derbyshire Dog Agility Club Show in 2010

2009 Rules of Competition

- 1 This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition.
- 2 All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
- 3 The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Grades 4 & 5 only
- 4 Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
- 5 Once a dog has qualified for the final it may not enter any further heats except as a not for competition entry. Handlers running not for competition with a previously qualified dog must report the fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class.
- 6 The first four dogs from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.
- 7 The next four dogs will be held as reserves.
- 8 In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
- 9 In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog.
- 10 The first section of the competition will contain the following pieces of equipment: A Frame, Dog walk, Seesaw, a rising spread jump set at a maximum of 550mm and a long jump set at a minimum of four foot six inches. The placement of these obstacles is at the judge's discretion.
- 11 The first section is un-timed and dogs must successfully complete this section without faults before proceeding to the second section of the competition. Dogs with faults will not be allowed to proceed to the second section.
- 12 The second section is timed and will contain no more than fourteen but no less than twelve single pole hurdles set at 65 centimetres plus a set of twelve weaves. The placement of these obstacles is at the judge's discretion.
- 13 Handlers are not allowed to touch their dogs between the separate elements of the first section but may touch their dogs between the first and second sections of the competition.
- 14 The object of the competition is to complete the control section of the class successfully before competing, against the clock, on a jumping course. The winner and subsequent places will be decided on the fastest time with the least faults over the second section of the course.

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE

FROM THE NORTH

Leave the M6 .T.lights at J 28 turn right onto B 5256.

Next traffic lights turn right onto **A49** signed Euxton and continue for approx, 3 miles. **Turn right** onto **A581** signed CROSTON / ECCLESTON (Wildfowl Trust/Martin Mere)

Continue approx 3 ½ miles. You will pass the main caravan park entrance, (**DO NOT TURN INTO CARAVAN PARK ENTRANCE**) but continue past, as you pass the **Highfield Pub** on your left, **50YARDS further on PAST PUB Turn right** onto **Quality Hotel(Chorley) Car park**, and **IMMEDIATELY** Take the **left fork** signed Agility. Follow road round observing **5 MPH SPEED LIMIT**.

FROM THE SOUTH

Leave M 6 AT Junction 27, Take the A5209, signed Parbold – Ormskirk

Turn immediate right (before Filling Station) B5250 onto Mossy Lea Road signed Wroughtington – Eccleston

Continue along this road (approx 5 miles) you will come to a hump backed bridge, Immediately over the hump backed bridge take the **Left fork signed Croston / Southport**. Continue down this road until you reach a T. Junction. **Turn LEFT at T. Junction**. Venue is approx ½ mile on the right hand side.

NB. DO NOT TURN INTO THE MAIN CARAVAN PARK ENTRANCE, but continue past the Highfield Pub on your left. Then **50 yards** past pub – **Turn Right** onto the **Quality Hotel (Chorley) Car park**, – **IMMEDIATELY** take the **Left Fork** – signed Agility.
