Dogs entered only in Class 1 and/or Class 19 must also be entered on an individual entry form and marked as 'Pairs or Team only' in order to provide the authority to compete.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry Fees: £2.50 per dog per class (WVDTC members £2.00), £5.00 per pair, £10.00 per team. Camping £10 per unit (Friday/Saturday)
3. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
4. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete for Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
5. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
6. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
7. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
8. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar ie. not attached by a ring.
9. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
10. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
11. WYE VALLEY DTC WOULD LIKE TO THANK ALL CLUBS WHO HAVE PROVIDED HELP AND EQUIPMENT, AND WOULD ALSO LIKE TO THANK **PEDIGREE** , SPONSORS OF CLASSES AT THE SHOW.
12. Marking: The standard marking contained in Annex B to H(1) Regulations shall apply to all classes. Any variation on this standard shall be given in the judges briefing before the class commences.
13. Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for small dogs are those measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers. Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for medium dogs are those measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers. Those dogs eligible to compete in competitions for large dogs are those measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers.
14. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Test at which they are judging.
15. Withdrawal of dogs from Test. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is:
 - (a) A bitch which is in season
 - (b) Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease
 - (c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
 - (d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal
 - (e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing
16. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
17. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
18. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
19. Dogs to be limited to 3 classes per dog plus pairs (Saturday) and team (Sunday).
20. Should circumstances so dictate the Club, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club
21. A dog must at the time of entry for the Competition, be registered as required by the Kennel Club Rules & Regulations in the Competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owners' property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
22. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Wye Valley DTC Committee.
23. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete will be returned to the competitor.
24. No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
25. Pay on the day classes may be held, time and weather permitting.
26. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
27. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
28. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
29. Competitors must wear their ring numbers visibly whilst competing in the ring.
30. The costs from returned and represented cheques will be charged to the signatory of the said cheques. The costs will be deducted from show entry fees and classes entered will be discussed with handler/signatory.
31. **Camping** - All caravans, etc. should carry suitable fire extinguishers and facilities for fire fighting and first aid. A minimum space of 6 metres between facing walls of adjacent caravans must be kept. Motor vehicles should be parked at the side of caravans. The use of fencing around camping units MUST NOT obstruct the access space required for emergency vehicles. Please note there are no showers on site. **PLEASE ARRIVE AFTER 3.00 pm FRIDAY and BEFORE 10.00 pm.**
32. Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove, as soon as possible, any fouling by his or her dog(s) at the event and within the environs of the event.
33. Parents are reminded that they are responsible for the behaviour and good conduct of their children.
34. It is the competitors responsibility to ensure that the correct score is entered on the score sheet.
35. No practice will be permitted on any course prior to and during classes.
36. If it is necessary to abandon the show due to circumstances beyond the control of the committee, expenses may be defrayed from the entry fees to cover the cost of the show preparation.
37. All dogs will be entered at this show at their owners risk. Whilst every car will be undertaken by the committee/helpers they will not take responsibility for loss, damage or injury howsoever caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show.
38. Dogs may only enter the GRADE for which they are eligible and the grade number must be entered on the declaration.

Dogs in Cars on Hot Days – Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events. When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Welfare of Dog

An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries – Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.



**FOR SMALL/MEDIUM DOGS
SATURDAY 30TH MAY 2009
JUDGE: HILARY BOWDEN**

The top 20 dogs from Classes 13, 14, 17 & 18 will be invited to compete in this special event, which will be held over two rounds. The safety of all dogs will be of paramount concern, so the first round course time will be generous to enable handlers to take maximum care. Clear rounds from the first round will go forward to the second round to jump off against the clock over a shortened course. The winner of the Derby will be the dog who completes round two in the fastest time and loses the least points. Dogs should be fit and run at their handlers risk.

Small and Medium will run over the same course, under Kennel Club regulations. There will be a perpetual trophy for the winner, keepsake trophies and rosettes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places and commemorative rosettes for all qualifiers. This event will be run at the end of the day and it is hoped there will be plenty of support for the competitors.

ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade) In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows. *NB owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6 or 7 and have not gained a 1st in an Agility Class or three 1st places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at KC licensed Agility Shows or elected to progress on points from grade 1.
NB owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of grade 2 are not eligible for this class.

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4,5,6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,5,6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,4,6, or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,4,5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) classes.

PROGRESSION

Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

POINTS PROGRESSION

At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog had progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

AWARDS

CLEAR ROUND ROSETTES – for all classes (except pairs and team)

TROPHIES - 1st place in all classes/grades: 2nd place in classes/grades with entries over 20: 3rd place in classes/grades with entries over 40.

ROSETTES - Unless otherwise stated will be to approximately 10% of entry

PEDIGREE VOUCHERS – Can be redeemed at a Pedigree trade stand.

VICKY VETERANS PERPETUAL CUP : Awarded to the highest placed dog over 9 years of age in Class 26, 27 or 28 – Grades 1-7. Only dogs notified as Veteran on the entry form will be eligible. **Dogs must be 9 years and over on 18th April 2009.**

FOREST JET MEMORIAL TROPHY: Awarded to the highest placed Wye Valley Club member from Classes 2 & 6 - Grade 2.

In case of cancellation of the show within 7 days of the show date, notification will be sent to the relevant web sites where possible and notified to the iSS Show Hotline 07532 11 11 57. It will be the competitor's responsibility to check with the Hotline and/or the Web sites, if continuation of the show is in doubt.

PEDIGREE LARGE DOG TEAM RELAY – This is an Agility competition and must include at least two items of contact equipment. All teams must consist of four dogs with separate handlers. Any number of teams from clubs may compete in the heats, but only one team from each club may qualify for the final. This competition will be classified as a combined class for Grades 1-7. This is a team relay event and a suitable baton should be used which must remain behind the start line at all times. When the dog/handler returns to the start/finish, there will be a baton change between the handlers. No part of the next dog/handler must be over the start line, failure to observe this will incur a penalty of twenty faults. The winning time from each heat will qualify for the final. Ten teams will compete in the final. Dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 430mm at the withers. Handlers may compete in more than one team for the same club, however, they must handle a different dog in each team. Once a club has qualified a team for the final, that club can continue to compete for competition in any remaining heats for that year. Once a handler/dog has qualified for the final of this event, he/she may not compete in any more of the heats for competition in the same year. Only handlers and dogs who are members of the original team, or named as reserves on the entry form, will be allowed to compete in the final at the organiser's discretion (exceptional circumstances).



PEDIGREE LARGE DOG PAIRS RELAY – Two dogs with separate handlers will compete over the same course of a minimum of sixteen obstacles. When the first dog/handler returns to the start/finish, there will be a baton change between handlers. No part of the second dog/handler must be over the start line, failure to observe this will incur a penalty of twenty faults. The baton must stay behind the start line at all times. The course must include: weaving poles, pipe tunnel and collapsible tunnel. No contact point obstacles to be used. Handlers may enter more than one dog in a heat, the first dog to qualify will compete in the final. Handlers can compete in further heats for competition after they have qualified for the final. This competition will be classified as a combined class for Grade 1 to 7. Dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measured over 430mm at the withers. The first two unqualified pairs from each heat will go forwards to the final.

A40 to Monmouth. On approaching Monmouth, straight over the Dixon roundabout (**do not** go to the town centre) to traffic lights. Straight over the lights (s/p A40 Newport). Take the next left s/p B4233 Rockfield/B4293 (before tunnels). At T junction turn right – Rockfield. At mini roundabout left B4233 Rockfield. **** over traffic lights, over next roundabout. At next roundabout (Britannia Inn) turn right (Rockfield). Past Fire Station and school on left to mini roundabout. Round r/b into lane which will be clearly marked (3rd exit). **Do not go** into Monmouth Caravan Park, but bear left and follow the track round to the showground. ****

From Bristol/Wales

A40 to Monmouth. Just before Monmouth go through the tunnels, directly after tunnels (approx 200 yds) turn left into slip road (s/p Monmouth Town/Rockfield). Esso Garage on left, over mini roundabout s/p B4233 Rockfield. Then follow directions from **** to ****
