### Eligibility:

In accordance with Kennel Club Rules, large dogs who have not competed before 1<sup>st</sup> January 2006 and ALL Small and Medium dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a Kennel Club licensed agility show.

### Regulation H(1)(A).9 - Standard Classes:

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

- Grade 1 For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility class or three first places in Jumping classes at Kennel club licensed Agility shows. NB Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.
- Grade 2 Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.
- Grade 3 Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and Dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4,5,6 or 7
- Grade 4 Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility class or three first places in Jumping classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,5,6 or 7
- Grade 5 Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility class or three first places in Jumping classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel club licensed Agility shows and are not eligible for Grade 3,4,6,or 7
- Grade 6 Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility class or three first places in Jumping classes at Grade 5 or elected to progress on points from Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows and are not eligible for grades 3,4,5 or 7
- Grade 7 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 6 at Kennel club licensed Agility shows. Two first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) classes.
- ABC Jumping Open to any large dog other than a collie or collie cross
- Collie Jumping Open to any large dog not eligible for ABC
- Any Size Dogs entered in this class may not be entered in any other class at this show.

  31a/61a Large/Medium Combined Any Size Jumping

31b/61b Small Combined Any Size Jumping

Junior Agility/Jumping Eligible for handler under the age of 18 years old on the day of the show. Maximum of two dogs per junior handler.

#### First Contact Grade 1 and 2 Agility Qualifier.

For owners/handlers or large dogs that are eligible for grades 1 and 2 at a licensed agility test. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club rules in force at the time of the competition.

- 1. All competitors entering in the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and specific regulations governing this class.
- 2. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at large grade 1 and 2 level.
- 3. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final.
- 4. Once the dog has qualified for the final it may be entered in further heats for competition as long as it is still eligible for grades 1 and 2 classes.
- Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate show secretary before running the class. If the already qualified dog qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.
- 6. The first five dogs from the heat will be invited to enter into the final.
- 7. In the event of the handler not being able to compete due to injury or illness a substitute handler may run the dog so long as the substitute handler is eligible for grades 1 and 2.

THE FIRST CONTACT GRADE 1 AND 2 AGILITY FINAL WILL BE HELD AT THE DOG VEGAS AGILITY SHOW IN AUGUST 2010.

### <u>"Dog Vegas Qualifier"</u>

The "Dog Vegas Qualifier" is a competition for Large dogs, eligible for Grades 3,4 & 5.

There are ten qualifying heats. The top 5 dogs from each heat (top 3 if the heat is split into 2 parts), will qualify for the "£ Dog Vegas £"

Grand Final comprising of approx 50 at the August Dog Vegas show in 2010.

- 1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition
- 2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part.
- 3. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
- 4. The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large Height Grade 3,4 & 5.
- 5. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
- 6. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may enter further heats, as long as it is still eligible for Grade 3,4 or 5. Handlers who have already qualified their dog for the final must report this fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class. If the already qualified dog then qualifies again, the place will be awarded to the highest placed unqualified dog.
- 7. The first five dogs from the heat will be invited to compete in the final. The next five dogs will be held as reserves. If the class is split the top three dogs from each part will be invited to compete in the final. The next top three in each part will be held as reserves.
- 8. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
- 9. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog, providing the substitute handler is still eligible for Grade 3,4 or 5.



Open to dogs not entered in any other class. This is intended as a non-competitive fun run for dogs and only Dog-Games clear round rosettes will be awarded, no placed rosettes or trophies. There will be no weaves, tyre or contact equipment and jumps will be at 35 cms for Large and Medium dogs and at a lower height for Small dogs. The course will be very simple and flowing and will have a course time of 60 seconds. NB. Please mark on the entry form the size category of your dog in this class.





# EAGLE PACK ANNUAL AGILITY STARTER'S CUP GRADES 1 & 2 COMBINED LARGE DOGS

Approx Ten heats to be held at various Agility shows around the country with the final being held at Severnside Agility Club – 2010 (Date to be confirmed)

### **HEATS**

The first three placed dogs in each heat will be invited to go forward to the Final.

A Heat will be a Combined Grades 1 & 2 Large Dogs Agility. If a heat needs to be split, prizes will be offered in each part, with the first three placed dogs in each part being invited to go forward for the Final.

1<sup>st</sup> Prize – Trophy, Rosette and 15Kg Eagle Pack Original
 2<sup>nd</sup> Prize – Trophy, Rosette and 7.5Kg Eagle Pack Original
 3<sup>rd</sup> Prize – Trophy, Rosette and 3Kg Eagle Pack Original
 4th – 20<sup>th</sup> Rosettes (or 10% of entry whichever is greater)

### Eagle Pack Annual Agility Starters Cup Rules & Regulations

- Eligibility for competition is under the Kennel Club classification and is open to dogs Working Grades One and Two Large Dog Agility.
- The competition must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the event.
- Competitors entering the competition must be deemed to have agreed to abide by those Rules and Regulations
- Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Final.
- Each heat is open to all competitors eligible for Grades 1 & 2 Large Dogs.
- Qualifiers may enter further heats for competition, providing they are still eligible for Grades 1 and 2.
- Handlers who gain a place in a heat with a previously qualified dog should inform the Eagle Pack representative on the day of the show of this fact.
- The competition will consist of approx'10 heats with the first 3 placed dogs from each heat going through to the final. In the event of someone qualifying more than once for the final, the next placed eligible dog will be taken from the appropriate heat.
- Should someone be unable to attend the Final the next placed eligible Dog may be invited at the sponsor's discretion
- · Surrogate Handlers will not be allowed.
- We reserve the right to publish any photos of the events, dogs & handlers in our promotional material without obligation.

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**Competition Rules 2009** 

The 'Team Dash' is a competition for teams of four dogs and handlers, run as a relay over a simple jumping course. It is designed as a sprint event with spectator appeal; accessible to all grades of handlers and all heights of dogs. Teams of four large, four medium or four small dogs run over the same course at their own height, under identical conditions.

There are ten qualifying heats. The top two teams from each heat, regardless of height, qualify for a final comprising of twenty teams at Dashin' Dogs summer show: Any shortfall of teams (heats lost due to show cancellation etc) will be made up with qualifying teams from Dashin' Dogs summer show.

It is a requirement of this competition that the course contains no traps, and is of 'fast and flowing style'. A simple course such as a figure of eight, or a largely circular or helter-skelter style course is most appropriate.

- The competition is classified under Kennel Club Regulations as Combined Grades 1 to 7 and Special, and will be held under KC Rules and Show Regulations H & H1 as in force at the date of the competition. Additional rules apply as described below. Competitors entering this Competition are deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules.
- 2. If the entry for a heat exceeds the KC limit for a judge in a day then the class will be equally and randomly split and another judge appointed for the second part. The winning team from each part will be regarded as the two qualifying teams from that heat.
- All teams must consist of four dogs of the same height classification, handled by four separate handlers. Conditions remain the same for all teams except that the height of equipment will be appropriate to the height of the team of dogs competing.
- 4. Additions or substitutions to teams (handlers or dogs) are permitted, provided that (i) the substitute(s) is/are already entered in the heat (as a team member or reserve) (ii) rule (5) is not breached and (iii) alterations to teams are made before the run.
- 5. Handlers may compete in more than one team in a heat, providing they handle a different dog in each team. In the event of a handler being in both qualifying teams then their highest placed team will be deemed to have qualified. Dogs may only compete in one team in any given heat.
- 6. The course must contain two changeover lines, clearly marked on the ground, each with a minimum gate width of 4m. Dogs 1 & 3 start behind line A and finish behind line B. Dogs 2 & 4 start behind line B and finish behind line A. (Handler 1 may use a recall start). The inward and outward courses can be different, but both dogs from behind the same line must run the same course.
- The course each dog is required to negotiate shall contain no less than 14 and no more than 20 obstacles.
- 8. This is a relay event and two suitable batons must be provided. All baton changes must be completed with the handlers and dogs behind the appropriate changeover line. Failure to comply with this, or an incorrect baton change (i.e. throwing or dropping the baton at changeover) will incur a penalty of 50 points on each occasion. Stewards may be appointed by the judge to adjudicate changeovers if required.
- For each dog an elimination on the course incurs a single penalty of 100 points, however the judge will
  continue to mark any further faults on the remainder of the course and the faults of any remaining
  dogs.
- 10. The team with the fastest time and the least faults, wins. The top two teams from each heat qualify for the final. Once qualified, neither handlers nor dogs may compete in the remaining heats for that season except as Not For Competition. (N.F.C.)
- 11. Only the members of an original qualifying team (as specified on the scribe sheet at the time of the run) or the two original named reserves, will be allowed to compete in the final. Changes are at the organiser's discretion and only under exceptional circumstances.
- 12. In the event of a team being unavailable for the final, a reserve team will be called from the heat in which the qualifying team qualified.

#### Class 45a and 45b PAIRS RELAY

Large dogs will run over large height (650mm) Small and medium dogs will run over small height (350mm)

Two dogs with separate handlers will compete over the same course of a minimum of sixteen obstacles. When the first dog/handler returns to the start/finish, there will be a baton change between handlers. No part of the second dog/handler must be over the start line, failure to observe this will incur a penalty of twenty faults. The baton must stay behind the start line at all times. The course must include: weaving poles, pipe tunnel and collapsible tunnel. No contact point obstacles to be used. Handlers may enter more than one dog in this class.

### GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Dogs entered Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B. The registration number will be required for each entry.
- 2. Entry Fees £2.50 per dog for all individual classes, pairs £5.00/pair, teams £10.00/team.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with
  a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an
  Authority to Compete number will be returned.
- 4. Puppies under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for Kennel Club Licensed Agility tests.
- 5. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
- 6. The mating of bitches in the show precincts is forbidden.
- 7. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
- 8. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
- 9. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar, i.e. not attached by a ring.
- 10. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- 11. A Judge at an Agility Test may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership: or handle a dog at the test at which they are judging.
- 12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges
- 13. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply
- 14. Obstacles shall be in accordance with Annex B to H(1) regulations.
- 15. Jump Heights Small 350mm, Medium 450mm, Large 650mm
- 16. The height limit for dogs
  - a. Large Dogs For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft5ins) at the withers.
  - b. Medium Dogs For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft5ins) or under at the withers
  - c. Small Dogs For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
- 17. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from Test if it
  - (a) A bitch which is in season.
  - (b) Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
  - (c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - (d) Of such temperament, or is so much out of hand as to be
  - a danger to the safety of any other person or animal.
  - (e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues.
- 18. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at the particular show, after the entry for that show as been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show manager at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class/es for the next grade. The dog will be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade.
- 19. It is a competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order.
- 20. Should circumstances dictate, the Committee in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 21. Any alteration to this schedule will be published on the Agility Net and in the Agility Voice and this will be deemed sufficient notice.

- 22. Competitors' briefing will be held prior to the start of each class, they will be allowed to walk the course but without the dog accompanying the handler.
- 23. All dogs entered at the owner's risk, and whilst taking every care, Prestbury Park DATC cannot be held responsible for any damage, loss or injury caused to dogs, persons, or property whilst at the show.
- 24. Competitors are responsible for any loss, damage or injury caused by them, their dogs or property to any other person whilst at the show.
- 25. No practice will be allowed before, during or after the show, and no dog will be allowed in the ring at any other time than when competing.
- 26. Handlers working more than one dog in a class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
- 27. Dogs to be limited to four runs only
- 28. A dog must at the time of entry for the competition, be registered by the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations in the Competitors' name (or registration or transfer applied for). In the case of a partnership the full name of every partner must be given. In the case of dogs recorded as owned by a limited company, the directors and the secretary of the limited company will jointly be considered for the purpose of the Regulations. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a Competition may compete as the new owners' property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the Kennel Club before the Competition, and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form.
- 29. Animals in Event No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- 30. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
- 31. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits
- 32. A practice ring will be available if space allows.
- 33. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
- 34. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
- 35. In all matters concerning the competition, a Judge's decision will be final, in all other matters, the decision of the Show Committee will be final.

The Cost per Camping Unit is £16.00 for the weekend (Friday & Saturday night ONLY).

- Camping admissions are from 3pm on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2009. Units will be refused entry if arriving prior to this time unless previously agreed
- 2 If you arrive after 10pm the Camping stewards will be off duty so gate will be closed and you may not gain entry. You can move on to the main site in the morning.
- 3 The size of the pitch includes one caravan and awning and one vehicle.
- 4 For Health and Safety reasons please park according to instructions given.
- 5 Roadways MUST be kept clear.
- 6 Each camping unit MUST HAVE an appropriate fire extinguisher and bucket of water outside.
- 7 P.A. System: this will not be in use until 9.00am
- 8 Information Point: this will be situated near the Secretary's tent. Prize givings will also take place at this point.
- 9 Generators: these must not be used between 10pm and 7am in consideration of your neighbours.
- 10 Chemical toilets must only be emptied into the Elsan provided. DO NOT empty chemical toilets into the show toilets or wash them out at the fresh water standpipes.
- 11 DO NOT put Nappies and other solid waste into the show toilets please.
- 12 No showers are available.
- Water is available at standpipes around the site.
- 14 Containers for rubbish and poo bags will be provided.

### Directions to Cirencester Park from the M4.

- 1. Exit the M4 motorway at JUNCTION 15 (Swindon East).
- 2. Taking a RIGHT turn at the motorway roundabout, Proceed NORTH up the A419 to Cirencester.
- 3. Exit the dual carriageway at the sign marked 'CIRENCESTER INDUSTRIAL ESTATE'
- 4. Follow signs to the Royal Agricultural College and Stroud (you will go over 4 roundabouts)
- 5. You will now be on the A419 to MINCHINHAMPTON & STROUD
- The entrance to the park is approximately 1 mile from the last roundabout on the RIGHT. You will notice Prestbury Park Agility signs opposite the entrance which is on the right.
- Continue to follow the signs off the main road which takes you along a one-way system through the estate to the show.

### From the M5

- 1. Leave the M5 at Junction 11a to Cirencester on the A417 to the Airballoon roundabout.
- 2. Take the second exit towards Cirencester and continue on the A417 over the next roundabout signed Cirencester and M4
- 3. After approximately 7 miles exit at the junction signed Stow and Circncester and at the roundabout take the 4th exit A429 towards Circncester.
- Go straight over the next roundabout.
- 5. At the next roundabout take the 1st exit following signs for the Royal Agricultural College (RAC) and Stroud on the A419.
- 6. You will go over three more roundabouts.
- 7. After the roundabout by the hospital you will go up a hill still following the A419, take the second exit at the roundabout at the top of the hill on the A419 to Stroud, you will pass the RAC on the left
- 8. After another mile the entrance to the park is on the right hand side with signage on the opposite side of the road
