ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes 1st prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed championship agility, premier agility, open agility or limited agility shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for agility shows, as agility classes or jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the weaving poles obstacle. Standard agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", dog walk and see-saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

A maximum of four standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure. A class may either be held as a graded class or a combined class. A graded class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consecutive grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A combined class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from combined classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade. To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed agility shows. Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at small, medium, intermediate or large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the show secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed agility shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for grade 1, the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1

Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two first places at grade 1 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of grade 1 are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2

Open to dogs which are not eligible for grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from grade 2 and are not eligible for grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three first places at grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes), or have elected to progress on points from grade 3 and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7

Grade 5

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7

Grade 6

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as "special classes". The eligibility for "special" classes must be defined by the society and included in the schedule. The word "special" must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles, the A-ramp, and the dog walk, and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

Measuring of Dogs - Competitors are reminded that all small, medium and intermediate dogs must have been officially measured before competing at a Kennel Club licensed agility show. Record books or proof of measurement must be available on request..

Special Junior Jumping - U12 open to handlers under 12 years of age on the day of the show. O12 open to handlers aged 12 and up to 18 years of age on the day of the show. There is no limit to the number of dogs a junior can run in these classes, and they do not have to be family dogs.

Special Helter-Skelter – A flowing course with jumps and tunnels only.

Special Veteran Jumping - Dogs must be over 8 years old and not entered in any other class at the show except Anysize. This class will contain jumps and tunnels only i.e. no weaves, tyre or long jump. Jumps will be set at 400mm, 300mm and 200mm with handlers choosing the height their dog jumps on the day.

Special Anysize Jumping – Open to any height of dogs which are over 18 months old and are not entered in any other class at the show, except Veterans (if eligible). The course will consist of jumps and tunnels only i.e. no weaves, tyre or long jump. Jumps will be set at 400mm, 300mm and 200mm with handlers choosing the height their dog jumps on the day.

- i. This schedule information MUST be read in conjunction with the full set of YKC Agility rules available on the Young Kennel Club website
 - a. By entering this class, you confirm that you have read and understood the accompanying full set of YKC rules and that you agree to abide by said rules.
- ii. Members must be a YKC member before entering the competition.
- iii. Dogs entered into this competition must be either;
 - a. Grade 1
 - b. Grade 2
 - c. Grade 3
- iv. YKC Graduate Classes have 1 age category for you to enter.
 - a. 06-24 Years
- v. Each of the above age categories will have a subcategory featuring all 4 different height classifications.
 - a. Small
 - b. Medium
 - c. Intermediate
 - d. Large
- vi. Graduate agility classes may be attached to Standard Kennel Club Combined Graded 1-3 Agility Classes.
 - a. Where this occurs, two prize-givings will be awarded, one for the Standard KC Class, and one for the YKC Graduate Class.
 - (1) A YKC member can be in both prize-givings if placed high enough
 - (i) Progression for Kennel Club grades may only be achieved via the Standard Kennel Club class.
 - (ii) If the show has opted for the combined 1-3 agility class route, you must have entered this class as a YKC member during your entry – if you do not let the show know at the entry stage, you will only be eligible for the Standard Class, not the YKC Graduate section.
 - (iii) If you have entered the class as a YKC member, you may not substitute the handler for any reason, and must forfeit the run if the YKC member is not able to run the dog.
- vii. Members should enter the age category they would be on the first day of this show.
- viii. . First place in each subcategory will guarantee qualification to Crufts 2024
 - a. Further qualification methods can be viewed by reading the full rules.
 - b. You may enter this class even if you have previously qualified in this class.

Scottish Agility Dog of the Year 2025

1. The Scottish Agility Dog of the Year Competition is an annual event organised by The Scottish Kennel Club. The final will be held at the SKC August Show each year with the winners in each height category being awarded the title Scottish Agility Dog of the Year (height category).
2. Qualification for the final will be decided by an accumulation of points at heats. To qualify for points the dog must have been clear in the class; that is having incurred no course or time faults. Points are allocated in each height category as follows:
1st 8 points 2nd 4 points 3rd 2 points 4th 1 point
3. To be eligible to compete the handler must reside in Scotland and the dog's owner be resident in Scotland whenever points are gained. If the dog/handler are not eligible for points (i.e. they are not both resident in Scotland) then the points will move down the places and be allocated to the next Handler / Dog team who are eligible for points. It is possible for the handler or dog to no longer to be resident in Scotland at the time of the final, they will however still receive an invitation to compete.
4. After the final heat the 12 dogs with the most points in each height category will be invited to the finals by the Scottish Kennel Club. In the event of a draw then additional dogs may be invited. A handler may compete in the final with more than one dog.
5. The finals in 2025 will comprise of a single round of agility with competitors running in reverse order according to the number of points they accumulated to qualify. The finals for the SADOTY 2025 will be held as part of SKC's August Agility Show. To be awarded the title of Scottish Agility Dog of the Year the dog must be clear within the course time in the finals.
6. Heats will be held throughout Scotland at Open, Premier or Championship Agility Shows held by KC registered or listed clubs. To host a heat the club applying must have its main operating address based in Scotland. For SADOTY 2025, heats must be held between 08/07/2023 and 07/07/2024.
7. Heats will be held as a standard scheduled agility class, open to all dogs eligible to compete in that class. The class will be held as a combined or graded 6/7 class. This cannot be a capped class.
8. Handlers and dogs will qualify as a team. A dog may, therefore, collect points with more than one handler and these will NOT be amalgamated. A dog may only qualify for the final with one handler, and the handler with the highest number of points will be invited.



New for 2024 - Showtime Dual Challenge

This is a points-based competition.

Points will be awarded throughout the year to both competitors and their allocated clubs/training group. The event will be open to dogs of all grades and heights. The results for each class will be awarded points from 10 for first down to 1 for tenth (if there are 10 non eliminations).

At the end of the season awards will be made based on the 4 heights plus an award to the club/training group that has amassed the most points overall.

Please be sure to name your club or training group on your Showtime account when entering the show.

SPEEDLIMIT: 5mph on venue at all times

Competitors caught speeding may be asked to leave the show.

CAMPING

Camping is available Thursday, Friday and Saturday night. This should be booked and paid with entry on Showtime Online. Camping in between Bearded Collie and Granite City Show is available at an extra cost. Those who wish to leave their caravans at the venue during the week may do so at an extra cost. If you wish to camp beside friends/family, please arrive together.

Please email Granite City (GraniteCityAgility@gmail.com) with any queries.

Campers must abide by the following rules:

- No arrivals before 2pm on Thursday 18th July (unless already camped at the venue) without prior arrangement with the show secretary. Those arriving on Friday should check with a Granite City club member regarding where to park.
- If you require special camping please contact the show secretary in advance to arrange this.
- All units must carry a fire extinguisher and have a bucket of water at the front of the unit.
- Training equipment is not allowed in the camping areas.
- Dogs must be kept on lead at all times when in the camping area. Dogs may be off lead in the designated exercise area and when competing.
- No disposable barbeques to be used.
- Generators to be switched off by 10PM.
- The camping area must be vacated at the end of the show on Sunday 21st July.
- Further guidelines may be issued on arrival at the camping area.

PARKING

Day visitors should park in the designated area. Club members will be available to show you where to park, so please be kind to them! If you are a Blue Badge holder, or require priority parking, please contact the show secretary in advance.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

EVENING ENTERTAINMENT

Quiz/dog bingo will be held on Saturday evening, after the Granite City Thistle Cup final, with a prize donated by "Let there Be Gin".

PRACTICE RING

If possible, there will be Pay on the Day practice ring available at the show. This is for use only by dogs that are entered in the agility show (this does not include those entered NFC).

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The Registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the Show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. FEES. Single class entries - £4.75. (£3.25 for working GCDAC members). There is no charge for NFC entries.
4. PRIZE MONEY. There will be no prize money at this show.
5. Internet entries will be accepted via www.showtime-online.co.uk
6. The Committee reserves itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed agility shows.
8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
9. Not for Competition (NFC) entries will be accepted for dogs, aged 4 calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
10. No bitch in season is allowed to compete at Limited, Open, Premier or Championship Agility Shows. However, bitches in season can compete at quarter finals, semi-finals and finals of Kennel Club Prestige Events, except events held under YKC rules.
11. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competitions is forbidden.
12. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
13. Dogs must not wear any type of slip or half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar, i.e. not attached by a ring.
14. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
15. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
16. Sponsors: The Young Kennel Club; The Kennel Club; SADOTY; Millie's Paws; Holler & Hoot; Inverlochry Pet Services; The Pet Stop
17. The rules for the KC qualifiers are listed earlier in the schedule.
18. Kennel Club Standard marking regulations apply.
19. The height of jump obstacles for Large dogs will be 600mm, Intermediate dogs 500mm, Medium dogs 400 mm and Small dogs 300mm in all standard and special classes except Special Veterans and Special Anysize Classes. These classes will be as detailed in "Special Classes" section above.
20. The height limit for dogs:
 - a. Large dog classes – For dogs measuring over 500 mm at the withers.
 - b. Intermediate dog classes – For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers.
 - c. Medium dog classes - For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers
 - d. Small dog classes - For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers
21. Judges at an agility show may not judge a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
22. Removal of dogs from competition:

Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:-

 - a. A bitch, which is in season (apart from dogs attending the show to compete in quarter finals, semi-finals and finals of Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules).
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
23. Removal of competitors:

No equipment shall be moved without permission of the judge. Any concerns regarding the course shall be discussed with the judge/show management. Any unauthorized movement of equipment may result in removal of the competitor from the show. All such removals should be reported to The Kennel Club in the Incident Book.
24. Dog agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in agility classes on the day of the show.
25. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to & including 25 days before the start of the competition i.e. 24th June 2024 shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show (5th July 2024). The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
26. Should circumstances so dictate the society, in consultation with the judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
27. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club/society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
28. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.

29. No dogs' crates or boxes should be left near or between the rings. Societies may, if they wish, designate areas where dogs' crates and boxes may be left in the vicinity of the rings.
30. The handler must set their dog up to start within the ring. Dog and handler must enter the ring together and under no circumstances may a dog be left outside the ring off lead and recalled or sent to the handler in the ring.
31. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
32. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
33. Free Passes - Not Applicable.
34. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
35. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
36. Animals In Event - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
37. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
38. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
39. Welfare of Dogs – An owner (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club rules and regulations. The use of pinch collars, electric shock collars or prong collars, is not permitted at any agility show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.
40. Photography and filming: The taking of photographs and films at the show for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the permission of the organisers. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs or video film of general views of the show provided they are for private use only. Specific dogs may be photographed or filmed only with the approval of the exhibitor.
