Definition of Cup Classes

The Kennel Club Starters Cup (Thursday)

1. To be eligible for the Starters Cup Semi-Final all dogs must have completed the jumping and agility classes, a draw will be made for each round. Where possible, dogs should run in the order drawn.
2. Points will be awarded for placings in the Agility round and Jumping round. 1st place - 1 point, 2nd placed - 2 points etc. to the final dog that has not been eliminated.
3. The top 30 Large dogs, top 30 Intermediate, 30 Medium dogs and 30 Small dogs from the cumulative result of both rounds will be invited to compete in the Kennel Club Starters Cup Semi-Final on Friday. No more than 50% of the dogs entered will qualify for the Semi-Final. (In the event of a tie, the dog with the lowest points in the agility round will take the lower place). If a dog is unable to compete in the Semi-Final, reserves will not be called.
4. The Semi-Final will be an agility round.
5. Semi-Finalists **MUST** book in. Details on how to do this will be on your running order through Agility Plaza

Qualification for Discover Dogs Final (held alongside The London International Horse Show)

The top 6 Large dogs, 6 Intermediate dogs, 6 Medium dogs and 6 Small dogs from the Semi-Final round of the Kennel Club Starters Cup will be invited to compete in the Final at **Discover Dogs 2024 (held alongside The London International Horse Show)**. If there are not enough dogs in the Semi-Final the organisers reserve the right to invite dogs from the cumulative class result.

Crufts Novice Cup (Thursday)

1. This is one agility round
2. Dogs should be eligible to enter a Grade 3, 4 or 5 class at the time of qualifying for the semi-final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the Semi-Final or Final.
3. There will be up to 14 separate heats for large, intermediate, medium and small height dogs at Kennel Club licensed shows throughout the country, plus an additional heat on Thursday 8 August at The International Agility Festival.
4. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-Final at the International Agility Festival, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-Final will qualify for the Crufts Grand Final.
5. Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-Final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Semi-Final.

Qualification for Crufts Final

The first 2 previously unqualified dogs from each heat will go forward to the Semi-Final at The Kennel Club International Agility Festival on Friday 9 August. There will also be a Novice Cup heat at the Kennel Club International Agility Festival on Thursday 8 August, where the first 5 previously unqualified placed dogs will also go forward to Friday's Semi-Final. If the heat is split, then 2 dogs will be taken from each part.

If a competitor does not take up the invitation to compete in the semi-final, the invitation will be rolled down to the next applicable dog from the relevant heat. No reserves will be invited after the running orders for the semi-final have been generated.

The top 6 large dogs, 6 intermediate, 6 medium dogs and 6 small dogs from the Semi-Final round of Crufts Novice Cup will be invited to compete in the Final at Crufts 2025.

The Kennel Club British Open (Thursday)

1. This class will be open to all dogs eligible for British or Irish Grades 6 or 7, dogs holding a Masters or Championship Title in the U.S.A and dogs eligible to enter Grade 3 classes under F.C.I. rules (or equivalent).
2. To be eligible for the British Open Final all dogs must have completed the jumping and agility classes, a draw will be made for each round. Where possible, dogs should run in the order drawn.
3. Points will be awarded for placings in the Agility round and Jumping round. 1st place - 1 point, 2nd placed - 2 points etc. to the final dog that has not been eliminated. An elimination in either round will incur 200 faults.
4. A dog eliminated in either round of the British Open will not be eligible for the Final.
5. The top 30 Large dogs, 30 Intermediate dogs, 30 Medium dogs and 30 Small dogs from the cumulative result of both rounds, plus the top 3 dogs in each height category based overseas will be invited to compete in The Kennel Club British Open Final on Friday. (In the event of a tie, the dog with the lowest points in the agility round will take the higher place.) If a dog is unable to compete in the Semi-Final, reserves will not be called.
6. The Final will be an agility round.
7. Finalists **MUST** book in. Details on how to do this will be on your running order through Agility Plaza

YKC Jumping Cup Crufts 2025 (YKCJC)

Special International Class (Sunday)

1. This class will be open to all **international dogs** that are eligible for F.C.I Grade 3 classes (or equivalent), dogs holding a Masters or Championship Title in the U.S.A. **Only dogs that reside outside the UK are eligible for this class.** Home Nations (England, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales, Isle of Man and Channel Islands) are not eligible for this class.
2. All dogs will complete a jumping and an agility course, a draw will be made for each round. Where possible, dogs should run in the order drawn.
3. To be eligible for the Final all dogs must have completed the jumping and agility classes. Points will be awarded to dogs in order of placing for each round.
4. The top 10 Large dogs, 10 Intermediate dogs, 10 Medium dogs and 10 Small dogs from the cumulative result of both rounds will be invited to compete in the final in the main ring. (In the event of a tie, the dog with the highest points in the agility round will take the higher place).
5. The Final will be an agility round.

Qualification for Crufts

The top dog from each height will be invited to compete in the Crufts Singles at Crufts 2025.

Where a class is scheduled in the same ring for different heights, all heights will run over the same course.

As with all shows, we cannot run the International Agility Festival without YOUR help. To show our gratitude, all helpers will receive an event tee shirt and those that help all day will also be given a lunch voucher.

All helpers will be entered into a raffle where two fantastic prizes will be on offer.

First Prize A First Contact standard competition jump, 1 set of numbers and a pair of tickets to Crufts on one day of your choice.

Second Prize Two tickets to The Kennel Club Agility Stakes Final held in London on one day of your choice.

AWARDS

Rosettes will be awarded to 3rd place or 10% of entries (whichever is the greatest) in all classes. Clear round rosettes will be awarded for unplaced clear rounds in all classes and must be collected on the day. Cup Finalists/Semi Finalist rosettes will be available on the day.

Trophies will be awarded for 1st place in all classes, 1st and 2nd places for classes with an entry of 50 to 75 and 1st, 2nd and 3rd places for classes with an entry over 75.

Vouchers of Skinner's dog food will be awarded to the winners of The Kennel Club British Open Final, Crufts Novice Cup Semi-Final, Championship Final, and The Kennel Club Starters Cup Semi Final.

All rosettes and trophies must be claimed before the end of the show on Sunday 11 August 2024. Rosettes and trophies won't be given to individuals after the show ends.

Dogs in Vehicles

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts of travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free-flowing air around the dog.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

Eligibility for Classes

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted).

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

Class Structure

A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression

Progression from each Grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows.

Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at Small, Medium, Intermediate or Large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.

Points Progression

At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

Standard Classes

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1

Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two first places at grade 1 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of grade 1 are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2

Open to dogs which are not eligible for grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from grade 1 and are not eligible for grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at grade 2 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from grade 2 and are not eligible for grades 2, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 4

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three first places at grade 3 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, or have elected to progress on points from grade 3 and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 5

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at grade 4 Kennel Club Licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 4, 6, or 7.

Grade 6

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 4, 5, or 7.

Grade 7

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for grades 2, 3, 4, 5, or 6.

Championship Class

Open to dogs having qualified to compete in grade 7 which have had five wins at Full Height in either grade 6 or grade 7, at least three of which must be gained in agility classes. To consist of 2 qualifying rounds of Standard Kennel Club classes, 1 Agility Class and 1 Jumping Class and a final round of agility to be held at the same show.

Special Any Size Jumping Class

Open to any dog not entered in any other class at the show. It is intended as a fun class for older dogs, new dogs and 'don't fit anywhere else' dogs. There will be no tyre or weaves in this class. Everyone will compete for a single set of awards. The handler may choose which height is best for their dog, regardless of their dog's size. The jump height options are:

- a) Jump heights will be 20cms, long jump (if used) will be maximum 2 units
- b) Jump heights will be 30cms, long jump (if used) will be maximum 3 units
- c) Jump heights will be 40cms, long jump (if used) will be maximum 4 units

Dogs entering from FCI Countries.

Dogs and owners that are eligible to compete in FCI grade 1 should enter their dogs in classes that are open to KC grade 2 dogs.

Dogs eligible to compete in FCI grade 2 classes should be entered in classes open to KC grade 4 dogs.

Dogs eligible to compete in FCI grade 3 classes should be entered in classes open to KC grade 6 dogs.

Dates for qualifying will be up to and including 14 July 2024. Handlers whose dog qualifies into the next grade after the closing date for entries, 5 June 2024 but before the qualifying date 14 July 2024 must notify the show secretary or the show processor, by the 25 July 2024 when they will be moved to the classes for the next grade.

Dogs entering from the USA

Dogs and owners that are eligible to compete in Novice in the USA should enter their dogs in classes that are open to KC grade 2 dogs.

Dogs eligible to compete in Open or Excellent in the USA should be entered in classes open to KC grade 4 dogs.

Dogs holding a Masters or Championship Title in the USA should be entered in classes open to KC grade 6 dogs.

Dates for qualifying will be up to and including 14 July 2024. Handlers whose dog qualifies into the next grade after the closing date for entries, 5 June 2024 but before the qualifying date 14 July 2024 must notify the show secretary or the show processor, by the 25 July 2024, when they will be moved to the classes for the next grade.

SHOW REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licensed Agility shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer must have been applied for. The registration number/authority to compete number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry fees £19.00 per entry for the Championship Class & Special International, £8.50 per pair entry for the YKC Pairs, £8.50 per entry for YKC Agility Dog of the Year, £5.50 per entry for The Kennel Club British Open and Starters Cup, and £5.00 per entry for Crufts Novice Cup all other classes.
4. No prize money will be paid.
5. Internet entries will be accepted via www.agilityplaza.com
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows.
8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
9. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club Registered with their details on the entry form.
10. No bitch in season is allowed to compete at Limited, Open, Premier or Championship Agility shows. However, bitches in season can compete at quarter finals, semi-finals and finals of Kennel Club Prestige Events, except in events held under YKC rules.
11. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
12. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
13. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
14. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
15. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
16. The Show's main sponsor will be Skinner's.
17. Dogs may only be entered in a maximum of four classes per day. If a dog qualifies for a Final/Semi-final it may still compete.

18. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
19. The height limit for dogs.
- a. Large Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers
 - b. Intermediate Dog classes – For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers
 - c. Medium Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers
 - d. Small Dog classes - For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers
20. Judges at an Agility Show may not judge a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
21. Removal of dogs from Competition:
Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:
1. A bitch which is in season (apart from dogs attending the show to compete in quarter finals, semi finals and finals of Kennel Club Prestige Events, other than events held under YKC rules).
 2. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 3. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 4. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 5. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
- The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition/show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
22. Removal of competitors:
No equipment shall be moved without permission of the judge. Any concerns regarding the course shall be discussed with the judge/show management. Any unauthorised movement of equipment may result in removal of the competitor from the show. All such removals should be reported to The Kennel Club in the Incident Book.
23. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner / handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.
24. In estimating the number of awards won all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (Sunday 14 July 2024) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
25. Should circumstances so dictate, the Society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
26. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
27. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
28. No dogs' crates or boxes should be left near or between rings. Societies may, if they wish, designate areas where dogs' crates and boxes may be left in the vicinity of the rings.

29. The handler must set their dog up to start within the ring. Dog and handler must enter the ring together and under no circumstances may a dog be left outside the ring off lead and recalled or sent to the handler in the ring.
30. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
31. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
32. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
33. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. If competing in the Championship Class competitors must run in exact running order specified in the Regulations. Failure to do so may be reported to The Kennel Club.
33. Animals at Event. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes, or by permission of the Board. However a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
34. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
35. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
36. Welfare of Dogs: An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any Agility show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.
37. The Competition Manager cannot enter or work a dog at the Show.
38. Please clear up after your dog, or the Competition Manager will ask you to leave the show ground.
39. It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure that any awards are collected on the day - they will not be sent on.
40. Puppies under 4 calendar months of age are not permitted at the Show. This includes the Car Parks and Exercise areas.
41. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. If competing in the Championship Class competitors must run in exact running order specified in the Regulations. Failure to do so may be reported to The Kennel Club.
42. Dogs must be on lead except in the Exercise Area, or when working.
43. Dogs with cropped ears are not permitted to compete at Kennel Club Licensed events.
44. NOTE: Children under the age of 11 are the responsibility of a Parent or Guardian and must be supervised at all times including when competing.
45. Whistles might be used by judges at the event.
